# Follow-up Report: Permanent License Plates

In 2011, the Joint Legislative Program Evaluation Oversight Committee directed the Program Evaluation Division to study all passenger and nonpassenger vehicles owned and operated by State government agencies and institutions.

N.C. Gen. Stat. § 20-84(b) authorized the Department of Transportation's Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to issue silver permanent license plates for various non-state entities. PED found that 4,218 of the 120,461 permanent silver license plates as of June 30, 2011 had been issued to privately owned businesses, higher education institutions, and other entities not specified in the statute.

DMV identified several obstacles to ensuring that entities applying for permanent silver license plates qualified under N.C. Gen. Stat. § 20-84(b) or other statutes:

- ensuring that the vehicle is used exclusively for the purpose specified in statute;
- verifying whether non-state entities authorized to have permanent silver license plates still exist; and
- clarifying eligibility of community colleges and ineligibility of telephone membership corporations.

PED's report recommended the General Assembly

- consider limiting eligibility for permanent license plates to governmental entities and reviewing the basis for issuing plates to nongovernmental entities;
- direct DMV to cancel all permanent plates and reissue them to qualifying entities;
- amend state law to require registration of all permanent plates following a standard naming convention; and
- authorize DMV to revoke permanent license plates registered to entities that fail to obtain an annual vehicle inspection.

#### **Legislation Enacted**

Based on PED's report recommendations, Session Law 2012-159 limited eligibility for permanent registration plates to governmental entities—including community colleges—and reformed the process by which eligible entities apply for and are issued permanent plates.

The law required all permanent plates for non-state entities to be cancelled and re-issued under new eligibility rules. As of September 2013, 103,394 orange and black plates had been issued to non-state entities. Examples of vehicles no longer eligible for permanent plates include church buses, mobile X-ray transports, and city trolleys (See Exhibit 1). These entities had to re-register their vehicles at the standard registration cost of \$28-\$33.

S.L. 2014-101 and 2014-108 authorized DMV to issue permanent plates to motor vehicles owned by three additional entities—nonprofit corporations authorized to operate a charter school, federally recognized tribes, and sanitary districts created under Part 2 of Article 2 of Chapter 130A of the General Statutes (See Exhibit 1).

#### **Persistent Issues**

- Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 20-88(I), DMV issues permanent truck and truck-tractor plates to Class A and Class B motor vehicles that include the word "permanent," yet these plates are subject to annual registration fees (See Exhibits 2 and 3).
- There are no DMV processes to ensure that a permanent plate
  - o is placed on the registered vehicle
  - is not used if its safety and emissions inspection lapses by 90 days and is therefore cancelled.
- There are also currently no common name formats for municipalities and counties.



Note: Prior to the passage of S.L. 2012-159, General Statutes did not specify whether community colleges qualified as state or local entities. S.L. 2012-159 clarified that community colleges were eligible to receive permanent license plates as a local entity (orange), unless the vehicle was purchased with state equipment funds, in which case it would qualify to receive a yellow plate.
