2	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A USED OIL RECYCLING PROGRAM.		
3	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
4	Sectio	on 1. Part 2 of Article 9 of Chapter 130A of the General Statutes is	
5	amended by adding a new section to read:		
6	" <u>§ 130A-294.2. Used oil recycling program.</u>		
7	<u>(a)</u> <u>The I</u>	Department shall develop and implement a statewide used oil recycling	
8	program. The	Commission shall adopt and the Department shall enforce rules	
9	concerning the management of used oil. The rules shall provide for a permit system for		
10	used oil recycling facilities.		
11	<u>(b)</u> <u>The I</u>	Department shall conduct a public education and technical assistance	
12	program to infor	m persons of the needs for and benefits of collecting and recycling used	
13	oil and shall:		
14	<u>(1)</u>	Encourage persons who annually sell more than 500 gallons of motor	
15		oil at retail in containers for use off the premises to provide the	
16		purchasers with information on the location of collection facilities and	
17		with information on proper disposal practices;	
18	<u>(2)</u>	Establish, maintain, and publicize a used oil information center which	
19		provides materials and information explaining local, State, and federal	
20		laws and rules, and regulations governing used oil and informs the	
21		public of places and methods for proper disposal of used oil;

1	<u>(3)</u>	Encourage the voluntary establishment of used oil collection and	
2		recycling programs and shall provide technical assistance to persons	
3		who establish these programs; and	
4	<u>(4)</u>	Encourage State agencies that change and collect motor oil to serve as	
5		used oil collection centers for small quantities of used oil from	
6		households.	
7		Department shall develop a grants program for units of local government	
8	to encourage the recycling of used oil and the establishment of collection centers to		
9	accept small quantities of used oil from households. No grant shall exceed twenty-five		
10	thousand dollars (\$25,000). The following activities shall be eligible for grant		
11	assistance:		
12	<u>(1)</u>	Curbside pickup of used oil containers;	
13	<u>(2)</u>	Retrofitting of solid waste equipment to promote used oil recycling;	
14	<u>(3)</u>	Providing containers and other materials and supplies that the public	
15		can utilize in order to manage and dispose of used oil in an	
16		environmentally sound manner;	
17	<u>(4)</u>	Providing incentives for the establishment of used oil collection	
18		centers; and	
19	<u>(5)</u>	Any other activity that will reduce the improper disposal and promote	
20		the recycling of used oil."	
21	Sec. 2	2. G.S. 130A-290 is amended by adding a new subsection (26) to read:	
22	"( <u>26)</u>	'Used oil' means any oil that has been refined from crude oil, used,	
23		and, as a result of such use, is contaminated by physical or chemical	
24		impurities."	
25	Sec. 3	3. The Department of Transportation shall study the feasibility of using	
26	recycled oil products in road construction activities and shall report to the President Pro		
27	Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the		
28	Environmental Review Commission on the results of its study by 1 May 1990.		
29	Sec. 4. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the		
30	Department of Human Resources one hundred fourteen thousand, five hundred twenty		
31	dollars (\$114,520) for fiscal year 1989-90 and three hundred seventy-three thousand,		
32	seven hundred nineteen dollars (\$373,719) for fiscal year 1990-91 to implement this act.		
33	Sec. 5. This act is effective upon ratification. However, no permit shall be		
34		sed oil recycling facility until July 1, 1991.	
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
