Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new 4 5 Article to read: 6 "ARTICLE 25. "RESPIRATORY CARE PRACTICE ACT. 7 8 "§ 90-350. Short title. This Article shall be known as the 'Respiratory Care Practice Act.' 9 10 "§ 90-351. Purpose. The General Assembly finds that the practice of respiratory care in the State of 11 North Carolina affects the public health, safety and welfare. It is the purpose and intent 12 of this Article to protect the public from the unqualified practice of respiratory care and 13 from unprofessional conduct by persons licensed to practice or certified to assist in 14 15 respiratory care. **"§ 90-352. Definitions.** 16 In this Article, unless the context otherwise requires, the following definitions shall 17 18 apply: 19 'Board' means the State Board of Respiratory Care. <u>(1)</u> 'Performance of respiratory care' means respiratory care in accordance 20 (2) with the written or verbal order of a licensed physician and includes 21 22 the diagnostic and therapeutic use of: Administration of medical gases (except for the purpose of 23

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- 1 (6) 'Respiratory care assistant'(RCA) means a person certified under this
 2 Article to assist a respiratory care practitioner.
 - (7) 'Respiratory care' includes 'inhalation therapy' and 'respiratory therapy.'
 - (8) 'Respiratory care program' means an academically based program designed to educate individuals as respiratory care practitioners, or a training program designed to prepare individuals as respiratory care assistants.

"§ 90.353. State Board of Respiratory Care; creation.

- (a) There is created a State Board of Respiratory Care to administer the provisions of this Article. The Board shall consist of seven members who are citizens of the United States and residents of this State, appointed as follows:
 - (1) Two physician members consisting of one member of the North Carolina Thoracic Society and one member of the North Carolina Society of Anesthesiologists;
 - (2) Four respiratory care practitioners who are licensed under this Article and engaged in the practice of respiratory care for a period of not less than five years immediately preceding their appointment to the Board and who are members of the North Carolina Society for Respiratory Care, Inc.; and,
 - (3) One member of the general public.
- (b) The Governor, with the advice of the North Carolina Society for Respiratory Care, Inc., shall appoint the members of the Board for terms of four years. The terms of office of the members first appointed shall begin when they are appointed and shall continue thereafter for the following periods: one physician and two respiratory care practitioners for a period of three years and one physician, one public member, and two respiratory care practitioners, for a period of four years. Upon the expiration of these terms, and all terms thereafter, the Governor shall appoint a successor for the member whose term expires for a term of four years, with no member being appointed for more than three consecutive terms and with the respiratory care practitioner members being licensed under the provisions of this Article. Vacancies in the Board shall be filled by appointment by the Governor in like manner for the balance of an unexpired term and each member shall serve until his successor is appointed and qualified.
- (c) Upon expiration of the term of a physician member, the North Carolina Thoracic Society or the North Carolina Society of Anesthesiologists, as appropriate, may submit to the Governor a list of three persons qualified to serve on the Board to replace their respective member whose term has expired. Upon expiration of the term of any respiratory care practitioner member, the North Carolina Society for Respiratory Care, Inc., may submit to the Governor a list of three persons qualified to serve for each position vacated. Appointments may be made from these lists by the Governor and additional lists may be provided by the respective organizations if requested by the Governor.
- (d) The Governor may remove any member from the Board for neglect of any duty required by law or for incompetency or unethical or dishonorable conduct.

"§ 90-354. State Board of Respiratory Care; operating procedures.

- (a) The Board shall meet at least twice each year and shall elect annually a chairman, and vice-chairman from its members. The Board may convene at the request of the chairman or at any other time to transact its business.
- (b) A majority of the members of the Board, including the chairman or vice-chairman, constitute a quorum at any meeting and a majority of the required quorum is sufficient for the Board to take action by vote.
- (c) The Board may appoint and employ a qualified person who may not be a member of the Board to serve as administrative secretary to the Board, and define the duties of the administrative secretary, in addition to those enumerated in this Article. The administrative secretary shall meet the qualifications for the respiratory care practitioner member.

"§ 90-355. State Board of Respiratory Care; duties and powers.

- (a) In the performance of its duties under this Article, the Board shall:
 - (1) Examine, license, or certify and renew the licenses or certifications of qualified applicants.
 - (2) Approve all respiratory care programs, and utilize respiratory care educator(s) in the review of all respiratory care educational and training programs.
 - (3) Establish fees within the maximum limitations as set forth in this Article.
 - (4) Maintain an up-to-date list of every living person licensed to practice respiratory care or certified as a respiratory care assistant under this Article. The list shall show each individual's last known place of employment, last known place of residence, and the date of and number of his/her license or certificate.
 - (5) Cause the prosecution of all persons violating this Article and incur necessary expenses therefor.
 - (6) Keep a record of all proceedings of the Board which shall be made available to the public for inspection during reasonable business hours.
 - (7) Conduct hearings on charges calling for discipline of a licensee, or the denial, revocation, or suspension of a license.
 - (8) Conduct hearings on charges calling for discipline of a certified assistant, or the denial, revocation, or suspension of a certificate.
 - (9) Maintain an up-to-date list of persons whose licenses or certificates have been suspended, revoked, or denied. This list shall include the name, social security number, type and cause of action, date and penalty incurred, and the length of the penalty imposed.
- (b) In exercising its powers under this Article the Board may:
 - (1) Define the duties of a respiratory care assistant and further define the duties of a respiratory care practitioner.
 - (2) Adopt rules not inconsistent with the law necessary to carry out the provisions of this Article. Rules shall be adopted in accordance with Chapter 150B of the General Statutes.

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- Employ personnel needed to perform the functions of the Board. 1 (3) 2
 - (4) Establish relicensure and recertification requirements and procedures.
 - <u>(5)</u> Secure the services of resource consultants. Resource consultants shall receive travel and other necessary expenses incurred while engaged in consultative service to the Board.
 - (6) Enter into agreements or contracts with outside organizations for the purpose of developing, administering, grading, and reporting the results of licensing and certification examinations. These groups shall be capable of meeting the standards of the National Commission for Health Certifying Agencies, or its equivalent. The licensing and certification examinations shall be validated and recognized as testing respiratory care competencies.

"§ 90-356. Compensation of Board members.

- Members of the Board shall receive per diem and allowances in accordance with G.S. 93B-5.
- Members of the Board shall enjoy the same rights of protection from personal liability as those enjoyed by other employees of the State for actions taken while acting pursuant to any provision of this Article in the course of their duties.

'§ 90-357. Criteria for licensing.

- An applicant for a license to practice respiratory care shall submit to the Board written evidence, verified by oath, that the applicant:
 - Has completed an approved four-year high school course of study or (1) its equivalent determined by the appropriate educational agency; and
 - Has completed an academically based program designed to educate (2) individuals as respiratory care practitioners as approved by the Board. The Board shall establish the standards for respiratory care practitioner programs. Respiratory care practitioner programs shall be approved as set forth in G.S. 90-355(2); and
- The applicant, except where otherwise defined in the Article, shall be required to pass an examination, whereupon the Board shall issue to the applicant a license to practice respiratory care; or
 - The Board may issue a license to practice respiratory care by endorsement to: (c)
 - An applicant who is currently licensed to practice respiratory care (1) under the laws of another state, territory, or country, if the qualifications of the applicant are deemed by the Board to be equivalent to those required in this State; or
 - Applicants holding credentials with active status, conferred by the <u>(2)</u> National Board for Respiratory Care (NBRC), as a Certified Respiratory Therapy Technician (CRTT) and/or as a Registered Respiratory Therapist (RRT), provided that the credential has not been suspended or revoked; and
 - Applicants applying under this section shall be required to verify under (3) oath that their credentials have not been suspended or revoked.

"§ 90-358. Criteria for Certification.

- (a) An applicant for certification as a respiratory care assistant shall submit to the Board written evidence, verified by oath, that the applicant:
 - (1) Has completed an approved four-year high school course of study or its equivalent determined by the appropriate educational agency; and
 - (2) Has completed a training program for the respiratory care assistant as approved by the Board. The Board shall establish the standards for a respiratory care assistant program. Respiratory care assistant training programs shall be approved as set forth in G.S. 90-355(2).
- (b) Except as otherwise provided in this Article, the applicant shall be required to pass an examination, whereupon the Board shall issue to the applicant a respiratory care assistant certificate.

"§ 90-359. Examinations.

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- (a) Examinations for licensure of the respiratory care practitioner and certification of the respiratory care assistant shall be conducted not less than two times a year and at places determined by the Board. Passing scores of examinations given under the provisions of this Article shall be established by the Board.
- (b) An applicant applying for a license to practice or a certificate to assist in respiratory care shall pay an administrative fee of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to the Board. A fee of not more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) shall be required for each examination. If an applicant fails to complete the requirements for licensing or certification within three years from the date of filing, the application is deemed abandoned.

"§ 90-360. Temporary permits.

Upon payment of a fee of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00), the Board may issue a temporary permit to practice respiratory care for a period of six months to an applicant for licensing, pending compliance with the requirements for licensing, providing the applicant shows written evidence, verified by oath, that the applicant is currently practicing, or has complied with G.S. 90-358(a), or has within the last 12 months practiced respiratory care in another state, territory, or country and/or was licensed to practice respiratory care in that state. On expiration of the permit and on payment of a fee of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00), the Board may issue a permit to practice respiratory care for an additional period not to exceed 12 months from the date of issuance of the original permit, pending reevaluation of compliance with this Article. Reapplication following abandonment of an application shall not entitle the applicant to a permit.

"§ 90-361. Grandfather clause.

- (a) The Board shall issue a license to practice respiratory care to an applicant, who, at the time of the effective date of this Article, has passed the entry level (CRTT) or advanced practitioner (RRT) examinations administered by the National Board for Respiratory Care. An applicant applying for licensure under this section must do so within 24 months of the effective date of this Article.
- (b) The Board shall issue a license to practice respiratory care to an applicant, who at the time of the effective date of this Article, and who, through written evidence, verified by oath, demonstrates that he/she is currently performing, within the State of

- North Carolina, the duties of a respiratory care practitioner as defined by this Article, and has two or more years clinical experience in the performance of these duties. An applicant applying for licensure under this provision must do so within 12 months of the effective date of this Article.
 - (c) The Board shall issue a certificate to assist in respiratory care to an applicant, who at the time of the effective date of this Article does not meet the qualifications of G.S. 90-361(a) or (b), but, who, at the effective date of this Article, and through written evidence, verified by oath, demonstrates that he/she is currently performing the duties of a respiratory care assistant within the State of North Carolina. During the 24-month period following the effective date of this Article, the respiratory care assistant may apply for and take the respiratory care practitioner examination. After passing the examination, the assistant shall be granted a respiratory care practitioner license.
 - (d) All respiratory care programs in this State accredited by the Council on Allied Health Education Accreditation (CAHEA) at the effective date of this Article shall be issued a five-year Board approval. The program shall maintain its CAHEA accreditation during the five-year grandfather period in order to maintain Board approval.

"§ 90-362. Professional identification.

- (a) A person holding a license to practice respiratory care in this State may use the title, 'licensed respiratory care practitioner' and the abbreviation, 'RCP'.
 - (b) A licensee shall show his license when requested.
- (c) A person holding a respiratory care assistant certificate in this State may use the title, 'certified respiratory care assistant' and the abbreviation, 'RCA'.
 - (d) A certified assistant shall show his certificate when requested.

"§ 90-363. Renewal of license or certification.

- (a) Except as provided in this section a license or certificate issued under the provisions of this Article shall be renewed annually. The Board shall mail notices at least 30 calendar days prior to expiration for renewal of licenses and certificates to every person to whom a license or certificate was issued or renewed during the preceding renewal period. The licensed or certified individuals shall complete the notice of renewal and return it to the Board with a renewal fee of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) before the date of expiration.
- (b) Upon receipt of the notice of renewal and the fee, the Board shall verify its contents and shall issue the license or certificate, as appropriate, for the current renewal period which shall be valid for the period stated thereon. The Board may establish continuing education requirements for annual renewal of the license or certificate.
- (c) A licensee or certified assistant who allows his license or certificate to expire by failing to renew it, may be reinstated by the Board upon payment of renewal fee and a reinstatement fee of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) provided that a request for reinstatement is made within 60 days of the end of the renewal period.
- (d) A respiratory care practitioner or respiratory care assistant who does not provide respiratory care during the succeeding renewal period is not required to pay the renewal fee as long as he remains inactive in the provision of respiratory care. If he desires to resume respiratory care as a licensed RCP or a certified RCA, he shall notify

the Board of his intent and shall satisfy the current requirements of the Board in addition to remitting the renewal fee for the current renewal period and the reinstatement fee. Requirements of the Board shall include a specific period of time of continuous inactivity after which retesting is required.

(e) The Board may establish fees for replacement and duplicate licenses and certificates.

"§ 90-364. Expenses payable from fees collected by Board.

- (a) All salaries, compensation, and expenses incurred or allowed for the purposes of carrying out this Article shall be paid by the Board exclusively out of the fees received by the Board as authorized by this Article, or funds received from other sources. In no case shall any salary, expense or other obligation of the Board be charged against the treasury of the State of North Carolina.
- (b) All moneys and receipts shall be kept in a special fund by and for the use of the Board for the exclusive purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Article.

"§ 90-365. Disciplinary criteria.

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 The Board may revoke, suspend, or refuse to renew any license, certificate, or permit or place on probation, or otherwise reprimand a licensee, certified assistant, or permit holder or deny a license or certificate to an applicant if it finds that the person:

- (1) <u>Is guilty of fraud or deceit in procuring or attempting to procure a license or certificate, or renewal of a license to practice or certificate to assist in respiratory care;</u>
- (2) <u>Is incompetent to practice respiratory care;</u>
- (3) Has been found to be negligent in the practice of respiratory care;
- (4) <u>Is habitually intemperate in the use of alcoholic beverages;</u>
- (5) <u>Is addicted to, or has improperly obtained, possessed, used, or distributed habit-forming drugs or narcotics;</u>
- (6) Is guilty of dishonest or unethical conduct;
- (7) Has practiced or assisted in respiratory care after his license, certificate, or permit has expired or has been suspended;
- (8) Has practiced or assisted in respiratory care under cover of any permit, certificate, or license illegally or fraudulently obtained or issued;
- (9) Has violated or aided or abetted others in violation of any provision of the Article.

"§ 90-366. Due process procedures.

- (a) Upon filing of a written complaint with the Board, alleging that a person has committed any of the acts described in G.S. 90-365, the administrative secretary, or other authorized employee of the Board shall make an investigation. If the Board finds reasonable grounds for the complaint, a time and place for a hearing shall be set, notice of which shall be served on the licensee, certified assistant, permit holder, or applicant at least 15 calendar days prior to the hearing. The notice shall be by personal service or by certified mail sent to the last known address of the person.
- (b) The Board may petition the Superior Court of the county within which the hearing is being held to issue subpoenas for the attendance of the witnesses and the production of necessary evidence in any hearing before it. Upon request of the

respondent or his counsel, the Board shall petition the court to issue subpoenas in behalf of the respondent. The Superior Court upon petition may issue any subpoenas it deems necessary.

(c) Unless otherwise provided in this Article, hearing procedures shall be promulgated in accordance with, and a person who feels aggrieved by a decision of the Board may take an appeal pursuant to, Chapter 150B of the General Statutes.

"§ 90-367. Persons and practices not affected.

- (a) Except as otherwise provided in this Article, no person shall practice respiratory care or assist in respiratory care or represent himself to be a respiratory care practitioner or respiratory care assistant unless he is licensed or certified under this Article.
 - (b) This Article does not prohibit:
 - (1) The practice or assistance of respiratory care which is an integral part of the program of study by students enrolled in a respiratory care education program approved by the Board. Students enrolled in respiratory care practitioner programs shall be identified as 'student-RCP'and shall only provide respiratory care under supervision. Students enrolled in respiratory care assistant programs shall be identified as 'RCA-trainee' and train under the supervision of a licensed 'RCP' or a licensed physician.
 - (2) Self-care by a patient, or gratuitous care by a friend or family member who does not represent or hold himself out to be a respiratory care practitioner or respiratory care assistant.
 - (3) Respiratory care services rendered in the course of an emergency.
 - (4) Persons in the military services or working in federal facilities when functioning in the course of their assigned duties.
 - (5) The respiratory care practitioner from performing advances in the art and techniques of respiratory care learned through formalized or specialized training.
- (c) Nothing in this Article is intended to limit, preclude, or otherwise interfere with the practices of other persons and health providers licensed by appropriate agencies of this State.
- (d) An individual who has demonstrated his competency in one or more areas covered by the Article may perform only those functions that he is qualified by examination to perform. The standards of the National Commission for Health Certifying Agencies shall be the basis for evaluating those examinations and/or examining organizations.

"§ 90-368. Practice of medicine prohibited.

Nothing in this Article shall be construed to permit the practice of medicine.

"§ 90-369. Penalties for violations.

- (a) It shall be a misdemeanor for any person to:
 - (1) Sell, fraudulently obtain, or furnish any respiratory care diploma, permit, certificate, license, or record, or aid or abet therein;
