- 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 6
  - Section 1. G.S. 62-50(b) reads as rewritten:

The Commission is hereby authorized to enter into agreements with the 7 "(b) United States Department of Transportation and other federal agencies and with other 8 states or public utilities commissions of other states for the regulation of natural gas 9 pipelines located within the State of North Carolina and upon the execution of such 10 cooperative agreements, the Commission is authorized to utilize Commission personnel 11 for inspection, investigation, and regulation of safety standards for interstate and 12 intrastate natural gas pipelines in North Carolina, and to share in the cost of such 13 regulation with other agencies having duties with respect to the regulation of said 14 natural gas pipelines, and to receive funds from the United States Department of 15 Transportation for such regulation. The Commission may use Commission personnel to 16 inspect and investigate all gas incidents, facilities, and records kept pursuant to the 17 provisions of 49 Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 191, 192, and 193, and to cooperate 18 with other state and federal agencies in determining the probable cause or causes of gas 19 incidents. Any information obtained during an investigation of a gas incident shall be 20 reduced to writing and a report containing that information shall be filed with the Chief 21 Clerk of the Commission and the report shall be subject to public inspection but the 22 report shall not be admissible in evidence in any civil or criminal proceeding arising 23 from the incident." 24

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## GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF NORTH CAROLINA

Sec. 2. G.S. 62-50(d) reads as rewritten: 1 Any person who violates any provision of this section, or any regulation of 2 "(d) 3 the Utilities Commission issued thereunder, shall be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for each violation for 4 each day that the violation persists, the maximum civil penalty not to exceed two 5 hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000)-five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for any 6 continuing violation." 7 Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification. 8

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
