34	recommendations to the General Assembly on or before the first day of the 1990		
35	Regular Session of the 1989 General Assembly, by filing the report with the Speaker of

There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General Assembly the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal year to fund 13 14 the Commission created by this act. Sec. 10. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989. 15

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
