4		particular license. If there is a delay in the review process, the Office
5		may demand to know the reasons for the delay, the action required to
6		end the delay, and shall provide this information to the applicant. The
7		Office may assist the applicant in resolving a dispute with an agency
8		during the application process. If a request for a license is refused, the
9		Office may explain the recourse available to the person under the
10		Administrative Procedure Act.
