2 AN ACT TO PERMIT CERTAIN RADIO EMERGENCY ASSOCIATED CITIZENS

3 TEAMS (REACT) VEHICLES TO ACTIVATE YELLOW LIGHTS WHILE

- 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
 - Section 1. G.S. 20-130.2 reads as rewritten:

7 "§ 20-130.2. Use of amber lights on certain vehicles.

8 All wreckers operated on the highways of the State shall be equipped with an ambercolored flashing light which shall be so mounted and located as to be clearly visible in 9 all directions from a distance of 500 feet, which light shall be activated when at the 10 scene of an accident or recovery operation and when towing a vehicle which has a total 11 outside width exceeding 96 inches or which exceeds the width of the towing vehicle. It 12 shall be lawful to equip any other vehicle with a similar warning light including, but not 13 by way of limitation, maintenance or construction vehicles or equipment of the 14 Department of Transportation engaged in performing maintenance or construction work 15 on the roads, maintenance or construction vehicles of any person, firm or corporation, 16 and any other vehicles required to contain a warning light. Radio Emergency Associated 17 Citizens Team (REACT) vehicles may be equipped with amber lights which shall be 18 activated only when the vehicles are parked; provided, however that REACT vehicles 19 operated under contract to a county as an emergency response agency may activate 20 amber lights while the vehicles are being operated over the highways." 21 22 Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
