A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE NORTH CAROLINA FUND FOR CHILDREN AND
3	FAMILIES, PROVIDE FOR ITS GOVERNANCE, AND PERMIT THE
4	ALLOCATION OF CORPORATE AND INDIVIDUAL INCOME TAX
5	REFUNDS TO THE FUND.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. Article 9 of Chapter 143B is amended by adding the following
8	new Part to read:
9	" <u>PART 29.</u>
10	"NORTH CAROLINA COMMISSION ON CHILDREN AND FAMILIES.
11	" <u>§ 143B-426.41. Purpose.</u>
12	It is the intent of this Part to make rehabilitation and treatment services available to
13	victims of child abuse and their families through a multi-disciplinary system that
14	provides incentives to communities to work together in a coordinated, comprehensive
15	program to address the needs of victimized children.
16	"§ 143B-426.42. The North Carolina Fund for Children and Families created.
17	There is established in the Office of the State Treasurer the North Carolina Fund for
18	Children and Families. The fund shall be funded by private contributions from
19	whatever source derived and by grants and appropriations as may be from time to time
20	provided by State and federal governments. All assets of the North Carolina Fund for
21	Children and Families established under Executive Order Number 27 issued September
22	8, 1986, as amended by Executive Order Number 47 dated April 28, 1987, shall become
23	the property of the North Carolina Fund for Children and Families established by this
24	act upon ratification. Disbursements of funds shall be on the authorization of the North

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1		nission for Children and Families or a duly authorized representative		
2	thereof. In order to maintain an effective expenditure and revenue control, such funds			
3	shall be subject in all respects to State law and regulations.			
4	"§ 143B-426.43. Governance of the North Carolina Fund for Children and			
5	Families.			
6	There is established in the Department of Administration, Office of Youth Advocacy			
7	and Involvement, the North Carolina Commission on Children and Families. The North			
8	Carolina Fund for Children and Families Commission created by Executive Order			
9	Number 27 issued September 8, 1986, as amended by Executive Order Number 47			
10	dated April 28, 1987, is hereby transferred to the Department of Administration, Office			
11	of Youth Advocacy. The Commission shall be composed of five members appointed by			
12	the Governor to serve two-year terms plus the following three cabinet officers or their			
13	designees who shall serve as ex officio members: Secretaries of the Department of			
14	Administration, Department of Crime Control and Public Safety, and Department of			
15	Human Resources. The Governor shall also appoint a Chairman of the Commission			
16	who, in the discretion of the Governor, may or may not be a member of the			
17	Commission.			
18	The members of the Commission shall receive per diem and necessary travel and			
19	subsistence expenses in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 138-5.			
20	<u>The duties a</u>	nd responsibilities of the Commission are:		
21	<u>(1)</u>	To receive gifts, bequests, devises, appropriations and grants for		
22		deposit and investment into the North Carolina Fund for Children and		
23		<u>Families.</u>		
24	<u>(2)</u>	To access the critical needs of victimized children and their families.		
25	<u>(3)</u>	To establish criteria for the award of grants which will encourage a		
26		comprehensive family-focused, community-based approach to address		
27		the needs of victimized children and their families and which		
28		demonstrate significant local community support.		
29	<u>(4)</u>	To solicit grant proposals from public and private nonprofit		
30		organizations serving local communities which will service the		
31		identified critical needs of victimized children and families in that		
32		community consistent with established criteria.		
33	<u>(5)</u>	To award grants to public and private nonprofit organizations which in		
34		the discretion of the Commission meet the criteria established by the		
35		Commission.		
36	<u>(6)</u>	To develop appropriate guidelines for monitoring administration of		
37		grant funds and performance of grant objectives to ensure		
38		accountability.		
39	<u>(7)</u>	To evaluate the performance of grant recipients with reference to their		
40		grant proposal.		
41	<u>(8)</u>	To make to the Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker		
42		of the House of Representatives in January of each year a full		
43		accounting of all funds received and expended during the preceding		
44		12-month period, including the amount of each grant awarded; the		

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	name and address of each grant recipient, and the nature of the services		
	to be provided by each recipient, together with an evaluation of the		
	performance of each recipient measured by the award criteria at the		
	conclusion of the grant period.		
<u>(</u>	9) To make recommendations to the Governor, the President of the		
	Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives for statewide		
	replication of effective and efficient programs."		
	Sec. 2. Allocation of Corporate Income Tax Refunds. Division I of Article 4		
-	105 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read as		
follows:

"§ 105-159	.2. Contribution election to the North Carolina Fund for Children and

Any tax	spayer who is entitled to an individual income tax refund of one dollar		
(\$1.00) or 1	nore of taxes withheld or estimated taxes paid may elect to contribute all or		
part of the	refund to the North Carolina Fund for Children and Families Commission, to		
be used to	assist, treat, and rehabilitate victimized children and their families. The		
Secretary of	f Revenue shall provide appropriate language and space on the individual		
income tax	form in which to make this election and shall note the same in the income		
•	nstructions, including an explanation that the refunds so contributed qualify		
	on without limit under G.S. 105-147(16). An election made under this		
	ontribute all or part of a refund to the North Carolina Fund for Children and		
	all become irrevocable upon filing the taxpayer's income tax return for the		
taxable yea	r. For the 1989 taxable year, the Secretary of Revenue shall remit as soon as		

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- 1 practicable, after the close of each quarterly period in 1990, all funds so elected during
- 2 the preceding quarter to the State Treasurer who shall deposit the funds to the account
- 3 of the North Carolina Fund for Children and Families. The Department of Revenue
- 4 <u>may deduct and retain from the refunds contributed under this section an amount equal</u>
 5 to the cost of administering the provisions of this section."
- 6 Sec. 4. Effective Dates. Sections 2 and 3 of this act are effective for taxable
- 7 years beginning on or after January 1, 1989. The remainder of this act is effective upon
- 8 ratification.
