2	AN ACT TO AMEND THE GENERAL RULES OF PLEADINGS TO ALLOW THE
3	CLAIMANT THIRTY DAYS TO RESPOND TO A REQUEST FOR A
4	STATEMENT OF THE MONETARY RELIEF SOUGHT.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. G.S. 1A-1, Rule 8(a) reads as rewritten:
7	"(a) Claims for relief. – A pleading which sets forth a claim for relief, whether an
8	original claim, counterclaim, crossclaim, or third-party claim shall contain
9	(1) A short and plain statement of the claim sufficiently particular to give
10	the court and the parties notice of the transactions, occurrences, or
11	series of transactions or occurrences, intended to be proved showing
12	that the pleader is entitled to relief, and
13	(2) A demand for judgment for the relief to which he deems himself
14	entitled. Relief in the alternative or of several different types may be
15	demanded. In all negligence actions, and in all claims for punitive
16	damages in any civil action, wherein the matter in controversy exceeds
17	the sum or value of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), the pleading shall
18	not state the demand for monetary relief, but shall state that the relief
19	demanded is for damages incurred or to be incurred in excess of ten
20	thousand dollars (\$10,000). However, at any time after service of the
21	claim for relief, any party may request of the claimant a written
22	statement of the monetary relief sought, and the claimant shall, within
23	10-30 days after such service, provide such statement, which shall not
24	be filed with the clerk until the action has been called for trial or entry

- 1 of default entered. Such statement may be amended in the manner and 2 at times as provided by Rule 15."
- 3 Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification and applies to pleadings, 4 motions, or papers filed on or after that date.
