5		Section 1. G.S. 18B-303(a) reads as rewritten:
6	"(a)	Purchases Allowed. – Without a permit, a person may purchase at one time:
7		(1) Not more than 80 liters of malt beverages, other than draft malt
8		beverages in kegs;
9		(2) Any amount of draft malt beverages in kegs;
10		(3) Not more than 20 liters of unfortified wine;
11		(4) Not more than <u>four five</u> liters of either fortified wine or spirituous
12		liquor, or four liters of the two combined."
13		Sec. 2. G.S. 18B-304(b) reads as rewritten:
14	"(b)	Prima Facie Evidence. – Possession of the following amounts of alcoholic
15	-	s, without a permit authorizing that possession, shall be prima facie evidence
16	that the p	ossessor is possessing those alcoholic beverages for sale:
17		(1) More than 80 liters of malt beverages, other than draft malt beverages
18		in kegs;
19		(2) More than <u>four five</u> liters of spirituous liquor; or
20		(3) Any amount of nontaxpaid alcoholic beverages."
21		Sec. 3. G.S. 18B-401(b) reads as rewritten:
22	"(b)	Taxis It shall be unlawful for a person operating a for-hire passenger
23		s defined in G.S. 20-4.01(27)b, to transport fortified wine or spirituous liquor
24	unless the	e vehicle is transporting a paying passenger who owns the alcoholic beverage

being transported. Not more than four five liters of fortified wine or spirituous liquor, or 1 2 combination of the two, may be transported by each passenger. A violation of this 3 subsection shall not be grounds for suspension of the driver's license for illegal 4 transportation of intoxicating liquors under G.S. 20-16(a)(8)." 5

Sec. 4. G.S. 18B-1115(a) reads as rewritten:

6 "(a) Permit Required. - Unless a person holds a permit which otherwise allows 7 him to transport more than 80 liters of malt beverages other than draft malt beverages in kegs, 20 liters of unfortified wine, or four-five liters of fortified wine or spirituous 8 9 liquor, or is a retailer authorized to transport alcoholic beverages under G.S. 18B-405, 10 each person transporting alcoholic beverages in excess of those quantities shall have the permit described in this section." 11
