2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT POSSESSION OF MATERIALS CONTAINING A 3 VISUAL REPRESENTATION OF A MINOR ENGAGING IN SEXUAL 4 ACTIVITY IS A FELONY.

Section 1. Article 26 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 14-190.17A. Third degree sexual exploitation of a minor.

- (a) Offense A person commits the offense of third degree sexual exploitation of a minor if, knowing the character or content of the material, he possesses material that contains a visual representation of a minor engaging in sexual activity.
- (b) <u>Inference In a prosecution under this section, the trier of fact may infer that a participant in sexual activity whom material through its title, text, visual representations or otherwise represents or depicts as a minor is a minor.</u>
- (c) <u>Mistake of Age Mistake of age is not a defense to a prosecution under this</u> section.
- (d) Punishment and Sentencing Violation of this section is a Class J felony." Sec. 2. G.S. 14-190.13 reads as rewritten:

"§ 14-190.13. Definitions for certain offenses concerning minors.

The following definitions apply to G.S. 14-190.14, displaying material harmful to minors; G.S. 14-190.15, disseminating or exhibiting to minors harmful material or performances; G.S. 14-190.16, first degree sexual exploitation of a minor; G.S. 14-190.17A, third degree

2		participating in prostitution of a minor.
3	(1)	Harmful to Minors. That quality of any material or performance that
4		depicts sexually explicit nudity or sexual activity and that, taken as a
5		whole, has the following characteristics:
6		a. The average adult person applying contemporary community
7		standards would find that the material or performance has a
8		predominant tendency to appeal to a prurient interest of minors
9		in sex; and
10		b. The average adult person applying contemporary community
11		standards would find that the depiction of sexually explicit
12		nudity or sexual activity in the material or performance is
13		patently offensive to prevailing standards in the adult
14		community concerning what is suitable for minors; and
15		c. The material or performance lacks serious literary, artistic,
16		political, or scientific value for minors.
17	(2)	Material. Pictures, drawings, video recordings, films or other visual
18		depictions or representations but not material consisting entirely of
19		written words.
20	(3)	Minor. An individual who is less than 18 years old and is not married
21		or judicially emancipated.
22	(4)	Prostitution. Engaging or offering to engage in sexual activity with or
23		for another in exchange for anything of value.
24	(5)	Sexual Activity. Any of the following acts:
25		a. Masturbation, whether done alone or with another human or an
26		animal.
27		b. Vaginal, anal, or oral intercourse, whether done with another
28		human or with an animal.
29		c. Touching, in an act of apparent sexual stimulation or sexual
30		abuse, of the clothed or unclothed genitals, pubic area, or
31		buttocks of another person or the clothed or unclothed breasts
32		of a human female.
33		d. An act or condition that depicts torture, physical restraint by
34		being fettered or bound, or flagellation of or by a person clad in
35		undergarments or in revealing or bizarre costume.
36		e. Excretory functions; provided, however, that this sub-
37		subdivision shall not apply to G.S. 14-190.17A.
38		f. The insertion of any part of a person's body, other than the male
39		sexual organ, or of any object into another person's anus or
40		vagina, except when done as part of a recognized medical
41		procedure.
42	(6)	Sexually Explicit Nudity. The showing of:

a. Uncovered, or less than opaquely covered, human genitals, pubic area, or buttocks, or the nipple or any portion of the areola of the human female breast; or b. Covered human male genitals in a discernibly turgid state." Sec. 3. This act shall become effective October 1, 1989, and shall apply to
