A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES TO 3 DEVELOP A SOCIAL SERVICES PLAN TO ENSURE THE UNIFORM 4 AVAILABILITY OF CORE SOCIAL SERVICES AND PUBLIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS TO THE CITIZENS OF NORTH CAROLINA. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 6 7 Section 1. It is the policy of the State of North Carolina to provide a statewide system of social services and public assistance programs to meet the basic 8 9 needs of citizens who cannot meet those needs themselves. The goals and purposes of 10 that system include: 11 (1) To ensure that children and adults are protected from abuse, neglect, and 12 exploitation; (2) To enable citizens to maintain or achieve maximum self-sufficiency and 13 personal independence through employment, if possible; 14 (3) To strengthen family life in order to nurture our children so that they may 15 become productive, healthy, responsible adults; 16 (4) To assist disabled and dependent adults, while ensuring that they live in 17 the most independent setting feasible with the least possible intrusion from public 18 19 agencies; (5) To ensure that every family and individual has sufficient economic 20 resources to obtain the basic necessities of life. 21 22 It is the policy of this State to operate its social services system through a cooperative partnership between the State and the counties, primarily through programs that are 23

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1 administered by the counties and supervised by the State, and with both State and 2 county financial participation. 3 Sec. 2. In order to ensure that a quality core of social services is available to 4 every citizen of the State who needs them and to ensure that the necessary resources are available to provide those services, it is the policy of the State to define a minimum core 5 6 of social services and to provide from federal funds available for those purposes and 7 from State revenues the expenses of providing those services across the State.

- 8 Sec. 3. The Department of Human Resources, in consultation and cooperation 9 with other appropriate agencies and groups, shall develop a Social Services Plan 10 consistent with the policies stated in Sections 1 and 2 of this act. The Plan shall include at least the following: 11
- 12 (1) A definition of a core of social services that shall be provided in every 13 county;

14 (2) Cost estimates and a plan and timetable for assuring the availability of the 15 core of services in each county;

16 (3) Minimum standards for the provision of core services and public assistance programs, including staffing standards, caseload standards, training 17 18 standards, and facilities standards;

19 (4) State and county responsibilities for the financing of social services not 20 included in Section 2 of this act, public assistance benefits, program administration 21 costs, physical facilities, and staff training; and

22 Strengthened mechanisms for State supervision and enforcement of (5) 23 program standards.

24 Sec. 4. In carrying out its responsibilities under this act, the Department of 25 Human Resources shall consult, on a systematic basis through a process designed by the 26 Department, with local and State governmental agencies and boards and with public and 27 private agencies and organizations.

28 Sec. 5. The Department of Human Resources shall report periodically on the 29 Plan required by Section 3 of this act to the Social Services Study Commission, if that 30 Commission is reauthorized. The Department shall submit the final Plan to the General

31 Assembly by the convening of the 1990 Regular Session of the General Assembly. 32

Sec. 6. This act is effective upon ratification.
