A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO REQUIRE PERSONS WHO ACCEPT USED GOODS ON  
CONSIGNMENT TO KEEP RECORDS OF THE CONSIGNED GOODS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Article 13 of Chapter 66 of the General Statutes is amended by  
adding a new section to read:

**"§ 66-67.2. Persons who sell used goods on consignment must keep certain records.**

(a) A person who is engaged in the business of selling used tangible personal  
property on consignment must keep a record of each piece of property consigned with  
the person for sale. The record must contain all of the following information:

(1) A description of the property, including any model or serial number of  
the property.

(2) The name, residence address, telephone number, and drivers license  
number or other identifying number of the owner of the property.

(3) The date the property was consigned.

(4) A description of the owner of the property, including sex, race, and  
approximate height and weight.

(5) The owner's stated value of the property.

(b) A person who fails to keep the records required by this section is guilty of a  
misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for up to six months, a fine of up to five  
hundred dollars (\$500.00), or both. A law enforcement agency may examine the  
records required to be kept under this section during business hours.

(c) This section does not apply to a motor vehicle."

1                   Sec. 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 1991, and applies to property  
2   consigned on or after that date.
