6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. G.S. 130A-309.14(f) reads as rewritten:
8	"(f) (1) All State agencies, including the Department of
9	Transportation, <u>Transportation</u> and the Department of
10	Administration, and units of local government, government are
11	required to procure compost products when they can be substituted
12	for, and cost no more than, regular soil amendment products,
13	provided the compost products meet all applicable State engineering
14	and environmental quality standards, specifications, and rules. This
15	product preference shall apply to, but not be limited to, the
16	construction of highway construction and maintenance projects, road
17	rights-of-way, highway planting and beautification projects,
18	recultivation and erosion control programs, and other projects.
19	(2) <u>The Department of Transportation shall, consistent with economic</u>
20	feasibility and applicable engineering and environmental quality
21	standards, use scrap tires, demolition debris, and untreated, stabilized,
22	or encapsulated ash from boilers and incinerators in highway
23	construction and maintenance projects."
