Sembly of North Carolina enacts: on 1. G.S. 153A-136(a) reads as rewritten: or may by ordinance regulate the storage, collection, transportation, use, ner disposition of solid wastes. Such an ordinance may: Regulate the activities of persons, firms, and corporations, both public and private. Require each person wishing to commercially collect or dispose of solid wastes to secure a license from the county and prohibit any person from commercially collecting or disposing of solid wastes without a license. A fee may be charged for a license. Grant a franchise to one or more persons for the exclusive right to commercially collect or dispose of solid wastes within all or a defined portion of the county and prohibit any other person from commercially collecting or disposing of solid wastes in that area. The board of commissioners may set the terms of any franchise, except that no franchise may be granted for a period exceeding seven years, nor may any franchise by its terms impair the authority of the board of

commissioners to regulate fees as authorized by this section.

Regulate the fees, if any, that may be charged by licensed or 1 **(4)** 2 franchised persons for collecting or disposing of solid wastes. 3 (5) Require the source separation of materials from solid waste prior to collection of the solid waste for disposal. 4 5 Require participation in a recycling program which has been approved (6) 6 by the board of commissioners. 7 Require private recyclers to report annually to the county on the <u>(7)</u> recyclable materials subject to the recycling goal set forth in G.S. 8 9 130A-309.04 that the recycler is recovering within the county. An 10 ordinance adopted pursuant to this subdivision shall require that such reports be made using a standard reporting format developed by the 11 12 Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources. ordinance adopted pursuant to this subdivision shall be construed to 13 14 require the disclosure of proprietary information. 15 (7)(8) Include any other proper matter." An ordinance may: Require the owners or occupants of houses and other buildings to place 19 **(1)** 20 solid waste in specified places or receptacles for the convenience of 21 city collection and disposal. Impose charges for such collection and disposal. 22 (2) 23 Require the source separation of materials from solid waste prior to (3) 24 collection of the solid waste for disposal. Require participation in a recycling program which has been approved 25 **(4)** by the governing board. 26 27 Require private recyclers to report annually to the city on the (5) recyclable materials subject to the recycling goal set forth in G.S. 28 29 130A-309.04 that the recycler is recovering within the city and, where the city operates a solid waste disposal facility that serves areas outside 30 its territorial jurisdiction, that the recycler is recovering within such 31 32 additional areas.
