February 25, 1991 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO PROVIDE AN AUTOMATIC 45 DAY DRIVERS LICENSE REVOCATION FOR ANY PERSON 18 TO 21 YEARS OF AGE WHO IS 4 CHARGED WITH AN IMPAIRED DRIVING OFFENSE AND HAS ANY ALCOHOL IN HIS BLOOD. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 20-16.5 is amended by adding a new subsection to read: "(a1) Revocations for Persons Between the Ages of 18 and 21 Who Have Any Alcohol in Their Blood. – A persons drivers license shall be revoked for 45 days under this section if: The person has reached his eighteenth birthday but has not reached his (1) twenty-first birthday; A charging officer has reasonable grounds to believe that the person (2) has committed an offense subject to the implied-consent provisions of G.S. 20-16.2; The person is charged with that offense as provided in G.S. 20-16(a); (3) The charging officer and the chemical analyst comply with the (4) procedures of G.S. 20-16.2 and G.S. 20-139.1 in requiring the person's submission to or procuring a chemical analysis; and The person: (5) Willfully refuses to submit to the chemical analysis; or a. Has any alcohol in his blood within a relevant time after 22 b. driving."

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 1991.
