A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO CONSOLIDATE AND SIMPLIFY THE SPECIAL LICENSE PLATE LAWS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 20-80 through G.S. 20-81.2 and G.S. 20-81.4 through G.S. 20-81.11 are repealed.

Sec. 2. Chapter 20 of the General Statutes is amended by adding the following new sections to Part 5 of Article 3 of that Chapter to read:

"§ 20-79.4. Special registration plates.

(a) Types. – Upon application and payment of the required registration fees, a person may obtain from the Division a special registration plate for a motor vehicle registered in that person's name if the person qualifies for the registration plate. The Division shall issue the following types of special registration plates:

(1) Administrative Officer of the Courts. – Issuable to the Director of the Administrative Office of the Courts. The plate shall bear the phrase 'J-20'.

(2) Amateur Radio Operator. – Issuable to an amateur radio operator who holds an unexpired and unrevoked amateur radio license issued by the Federal Communications Commission and who asserts to the Division that a portable transceiver is carried in the vehicle. The plate shall bear the phrase 'Amateur Radio.' The plate shall bear the operator's

- 1 official amateur radio call letters, or call letters with numerical or letter
2 suffixes so that an owner of more than one vehicle may have the call
3 letters on each.
- 4 (3) Civil Air Patrol Member. – Issuable to an active member of the North
5 Carolina Wing of the Civil Air Patrol. The plate shall bear the phrase
6 'Civil Air Patrol'. A plate issued to an officer member shall begin with
7 the number '201' and the number shall reflect the seniority of the
8 member; a plate issued to an enlisted member, a senior member, or a
9 cadet member shall begin with the number '501'.
- 10 (4) Class D Citizen's Radio Station Operator. – Issuable to a Class D
11 citizen's radio station operator licensed by the Federal
12 Communications Commission. The plate shall bear the operator's
13 official Class D citizen's radio station call letters.
- 14 (5) Clerk of Superior Court. – Issuable to a clerk of superior court. The
15 plate shall bear the phrase 'Clerk Superior Court' and the letter 'C'
16 followed by a number that indicates the county the clerk serves.
- 17 (6) Coast Guard Auxiliary Member. – Issuable to an active member of the
18 United States Coast Guard Auxiliary. The plate shall bear the phrase
19 'Coast Guard Auxiliary'.
- 20 (7) Congressional Medal of Honor Recipient. – Issuable to a recipient of
21 the Congressional Medal of Honor.
- 22 (8) Disabled Veteran. – Issuable to a veteran of the armed forces of the
23 United States who suffered a 100% service-connected disability.
- 24 (9) District Attorney. – Issuable to a North Carolina or United States
25 District Attorney. The plate issuable to a North Carolina district
26 attorney shall bear the letters 'DA' followed by a number that
27 represents the prosecutorial district the district attorney serves. The
28 plate for a United States attorney shall bear the phrase 'U.S. Attorney'
29 followed by a number that represents the district the attorney serves,
30 with 1 being the Eastern District, 2 being the Middle District, and 3
31 being the Western District.
- 32 (10) Fire Department or Rescue Squad Member. – Issuable to an active
33 regular member or volunteer member of a fire department, rescue
34 squad, or both a fire department and rescue squad. The plate shall bear
35 the words 'Firefighter', 'Rescue Squad', or 'Firefighter-Rescue Squad'.
- 36 (11) Historic Vehicle Owner. – Issuable for a motor vehicle that is at least
37 35 years old measured from the date of manufacture. The plate for a
38 vehicle that is 35 to 50 years old shall bear the phrase 'Antique'. The
39 plate for a vehicle that is at least 50 years old shall bear the phrase
40 'Horseless Carriage'.
- 41 (11a) Honorary Plate. – Issuable to a member of the Honorary Consulor
42 Corps, who has been certified by the U. S. State Department, the
43 plate shall bear the words 'Honorary Consulor Corps' and a
44 distinguishing number based on the order of issuance.

- 1 (12) Judge or Justice. – Issuable to a sitting or retired judge or justice in
2 accordance with G.S. 20-79.6.
- 3 (13) Legislator. – Issuable to a member of the North Carolina General
4 Assembly. The plate shall bear the words 'Senate' or 'State House'
5 followed by the Senator's or Representative's assigned seat number.
- 6 (14) Marshal. – Issuable to a United States Marshal. The plate shall bear
7 the phrase 'U.S. Marshal' followed by a number that represents the
8 district the Marshal serves, with 1 being the Eastern District, 2 being
9 the Middle District, and 3 being the Western District.
- 10 (15) Military Reservist. – Issuable to a member of a reserve component of
11 the armed forces of the United States. The plate shall bear the name
12 and insignia of the appropriate reserve component. Plates shall be
13 numbered sequentially for members of a component with the numbers
14 1 through 5000 reserved for officers, without regard to rank.
- 15 (15a) Military Retiree. – License plates shall bear the words 'Army
16 Retiree', 'Navy Retiree', 'Air Force Retiree', 'Marine Corps Retiree',
17 or 'Coast Guard Retiree' as appropriate. The license plate shall bear
18 the insignia of the appropriate service. The license plates shall be
19 numbered sequentially for each service with the numbers 1 through
20 5000 reserved for officers, to be issued based on the date of receipt
21 of applications by the Commissioner without regard to rank.
- 22 (16) National Guard Member. – Issuable to an active or a retired member of
23 the North Carolina National Guard. The plate shall bear the phrase
24 'National Guard'. A plate issued to an active member shall bear a
25 number that reflects the seniority of the member; a plate issued to a
26 commissioned officer shall begin with the number '1'; a plate issued to a
27 noncommissioned officer with a rank of E7, E8, or E9 shall begin
28 with the number '1601'; a plate issued to an enlisted member with a
29 rank of E6 or below shall begin with the number '3001'. The plate
30 issued to a retired or separated member shall indicate the member's
31 retired status.
- 32 (17) Partially Disabled Veteran. – Issuable to a veteran of the armed forces
33 of the United States who suffered a service connected disability of less
34 than 100%.
- 35 (18) Pearl Harbor Survivor. – Issuable to a veteran of the armed forces of
36 the United States who was present at and survived the attack on Pearl
37 Harbor on December 7, 1941. The plate will bear the phrase 'Pearl
38 Harbor Survivor' and the insignia of the Pearl Harbor Survivors'
39 Association.
- 40 (19) Personalized. – Issuable to the registered owner of a motor vehicle.
41 The plate will bear the letters or letters and numbers requested by the
42 owner. The Division may refuse to issue a plate with a letter
43 combination that is offensive to good taste and decency. The Division
44 may not issue a plate that duplicates another plate.

- 1 (20) Prisoner of War. – Issuable to a member or veteran member of the
2 armed forces of the United States who has been captured and held
3 prisoner by forces hostile to the United States while serving in the
4 armed forces.
- 5 (21) Purple Heart Recipient. – Issuable to a recipient of the Purple Heart
6 award. The plate shall bear the phrase 'Purple Heart Veteran, Combat
7 Wounded' and the letters 'PH'.
- 8 (22) State Government Official. – Issuable to elected and appointed
9 members of State government in accordance with G.S. 20-79.5.
- 10 (23) Street Rod Owner. – Issuable to the registered owner of a modernized
11 private passenger motor vehicle manufactured prior to the year 1949 or
12 designed to resemble a vehicle manufactured prior to the year 1949.
13 The plate shall bear the phrase 'Street Rod'.
- 14 (24) Transportation Personnel. – Issuable to various members of the
15 Divisions of the Department of Transportation. The plate shall bear
16 the letters 'DOT' followed by a number from 1 to 85, as designated by
17 the Governor.
- 18 (25) U.S. Representative. – Issuable to a United States Representative for
19 North Carolina. The plate shall bear the phrase 'U.S. House' and shall
20 be issued on the basis of Congressional district numbers.
- 21 (26) U.S. Senator. – Issuable to a United States Senator for North Carolina.
22 The plates shall bear the phrase 'U.S. Senate' and shall be issued on the
23 basis of seniority represented by the numbers 1 and 2.

24 (b) Fees. – Upon request, the Division shall provide and issue free of charge one
25 registration plate to a recipient of the Congressional Medal of Honor, a 100% disabled
26 veteran, and an ex-prisoner of war. The annual fee for a special plate issuable to an
27 active member of the national guard and a Purple Heart recipient is the amount of the
28 regular motor vehicle registration fee. The annual fee for a special plate issuable to an
29 amateur radio operator is the amount of the regular motor vehicle registration fee plus
30 an additional two dollars (\$2.00). The annual fee for a personalized plate issued under
31 this section is the amount of the regular motor vehicle registration fee plus an additional
32 twenty dollars (\$20.00). The annual fee for any other special plate listed in this section
33 is the regular motor vehicle registration fee plus an additional ten dollars (\$10.00).

34 The Division shall credit one-half of the revenue derived from the additional fee
35 collected for a personalized plate to the Recreation and Natural Heritage Trust Fund
36 established under G.S. 113-77.7. The Division shall credit the remaining revenue
37 derived from the additional fee collected for a personalized plate and all of the
38 additional fee collected for any other special plate to the Special Registration Plate
39 Fund.

40 (c) Disqualification. – A holder of a special license plate who becomes
41 ineligible for the plate, for whatever reason, shall return the special plate within 30 days.

42 "**§ 20-79.5. Special registration plates for elected and appointed State government**
43 **officials.**

(a) Plates. – The State government officials listed in this section are eligible for a special registration plate under G.S. 20-79.4. The plate shall bear the number designated in the following table for the position held by the official.

15 (b) Designation. – When the table in subsection (a) designates a range of
 16 numbers for certain officials, the number given an official in that group shall be
 17 assigned. The Governor shall assign a number for members of the Governor's staff,
 18 nonlegislative members of the Advisory Budget Commission, nonlegislative members
 19 of the Board of Economic Development, nonlegislative members of the State Ports
 20 Authority, members of State boards and commissions, and for State employees. The
 21 Attorney General shall assign a number for the Attorney General's deputies and
 22 assistants.

23 The first number assigned to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission is
 24 reserved for the Chair of that Commission. The remaining numbers shall be assigned to
 25 the Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission members on the basis of seniority. The
 26 first number assigned to the Utilities Commission is reserved for the Chair of that
 27 Commission. The remaining numbers shall be assigned to the Utilities Commission
 28 members on the basis of seniority. The first number assigned to the Parole Commission
 29 is reserved for the Chair of that Commission. The remaining numbers shall be assigned
 30 to the Parole Commission members on the basis of seniority.

31 **"§ 20-79.6. Special registration plates for members of the judiciary.**

32 (a) Appellate Division. – A special plate issued to a Justice or Judge of the North
 33 Carolina Appellate Courts shall bear the letter 'J' followed by a number from 1 through
 34 19. The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of North Carolina shall be issued the plate
 35 bearing the number 1 and the remaining plates shall be issued to the Associate Justices
 36 on the basis of seniority. The Chief Judge of the North Carolina Court of Appeals shall
 37 be issued the next judicial plate and the remaining plates shall be issued to the Associate
 38 Judges on the basis of seniority. Special plates issued to retired members of the
 39 Supreme Court and the Court of Appeals shall bear a number indicating the member's
 40 position of seniority at the time of retirement followed by the letter 'X' to indicate the
 41 member's retired status.

42 (b) Superior Court. – A special plate issued to a resident superior court judge
 43 shall bear the letter 'J' followed by a number indicative of the judicial district the judge
 44 serves. The number issued to the senior resident superior court judge shall be equal to

1 the sum of the numerical designation of the judge's judicial district, as defined in G.S.
2 7A-41.1(a)(1), plus 20. If a district has more than one regular resident superior court
3 judge, a special plate for a resident superior court judge of that district shall bear the
4 number issued to the senior resident superior court judge followed by a hyphen and a
5 letter of the alphabet beginning with the letter 'A' to indicate the judge's seniority.

6 For a set of districts as defined in G.S. 7A-41.1(a)(2), other than 7A and 7C, the
7 number issued to the senior resident superior court judge shall be equal to the sum of 20
8 plus the number the districts in the set have in common. A special plate issued to the
9 other regular resident superior court judges of the set of districts shall bear the number
10 issued to the senior resident superior court judge followed by a hyphen and a letter of
11 the alphabet beginning with the letter 'A' to indicate the judge's seniority among all of
12 the regular resident superior court judges of the set of districts. The letter assigned to a
13 resident superior court judge will not necessarily correspond with the letter designation
14 of the district the judge serves. For the set of districts 7B and 7C, the senior resident
15 superior court judge for that set shall be issued a special plate bearing the designation
16 27C following the letter 'J', and all other resident superior court judges of the set shall be
17 issued a special plate bearing that designation followed by the letter 'B'.

18 A special judge, emergency judge, or retired judge of the superior court shall be
19 issued a special plate bearing the letter 'J' followed by a number designated by the
20 Administrative Office of the Courts with the approval of the Chief Justice of the
21 Supreme Court of North Carolina. The plate for a retired judge shall have the letter 'X'
22 after the designated number to indicate the judge's retired status.

23 (c) District Court. – A special plate issued to a North Carolina district court
24 judge shall bear the letter 'J' followed by a number. For the chief judge of the district
25 court district, the number shall be equal to the sum of the numerical designation of the
26 district court district the chief judge serves, plus 100. The number for all other judges
27 of the district courts serving within the same district court district shall be the same
28 number as appears on the special plate issued to the chief district judge followed by a
29 letter of the alphabet beginning with the letter 'A' to indicate the judge's seniority. A
30 retired district court judge shall be issued a similar plate except that the numerical
31 designation shall be followed by the letter 'X' to indicate the judge's retired status.

32 (d) United States. – A special plate issued to a Justice of the United States
33 Supreme Court, a Judge of the United States Circuit Court of Appeals, or a District
34 Judge of the United States District Court residing in North Carolina shall bear the words
35 'U.S. J' followed by a number beginning with '1'. The number shall reflect the judge's
36 seniority based on continuous service as a United States Judge as designated by the
37 Secretary of State. A judge who has retired or taken senior status shall be issued a
38 similar plate except that the number shall be based on the date of the judge's retirement
39 or assumption of senior status and shall follow the numerical designation of active
40 justices and judges."

41 Sec. 3. G.S. 20-81.3 is recodified as G.S. 20-79.7 and reads as rewritten:

42 "**§ 20iRegistration Plate Fund.**

43 (a) ~~The Commissioner may promulgate rules on the issuance of special~~
44 ~~personalized registration plates to the owner of private passenger motor vehicles, private~~

1 trucks, or commercial motor vehicles weighing 5,000 pounds or more gross weight, in
2 lieu of other number plates. Such personalized registration plate shall be of such design
3 and shall bear such letter or letters and numerals as the Commissioner shall prescribe,
4 but there shall be no duplication of a registration plate. The Commissioner shall in his
5 discretion refuse the issue of such letter combinations which might carry connotations
6 offensive to good taste and decency. Fund. – The Special Registration Plate Fund is
7 established. The Fund consists of the revenue derived from one-half of the additional
8 fee collected for a personalized registration plate and all of the additional fee collected
9 for any other special registration plate issued under G.S. 20-79.4. The Commissioner
10 shall deduct the costs of the registration plates, including the costs of issuing, handling,
11 and advertising the availability of the special plates from the Fund.

12 (b) ~~An owner who desires personalized registration plates shall make application~~
13 ~~for such plates on forms which shall be provided by the Division of Motor Vehicles and~~
14 ~~pay the sum of twenty dollars (\$20.00) annually, which shall be in addition to the~~
15 ~~regular motor vehicle registration fee. Once an owner has obtained personalized plates,~~
16 ~~he, where possible, will have first priority on those plates for the following years~~
17 ~~provided he makes timely and appropriate application; provided, however, that the~~
18 ~~Commissioner shall not issue a personalized license plate pursuant to this section except~~
19 ~~upon written application therefor on a form furnished by the Commissioner in which the~~
20 ~~applicant certifies that his operator's or chauffeur's license has not been revoked or~~
21 ~~suspended under Article 2 of Chapter 20 of the General Statutes within two years prior~~
22 ~~to the date of the application; and provided, further, that any personalized license plate~~
23 ~~issued pursuant to this section shall be cancelled and recalled by the Commissioner and~~
24 ~~the application fee forfeited in the event that the Commissioner determines that a false~~
25 ~~application has been submitted.~~ Initial Distribution of Proceeds. – After deducting the
26 costs of the special registration plates from the Fund, the Secretary of Transportation
27 may allocate and reserve up to one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to the
28 Department of Transportation each fiscal year for the purpose of traffic control at major
29 events as provided for by G.S. 136-44.2. Any funds allocated for traffic control that are
30 neither used nor obligated at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the Fund and be
31 used in accordance with subsection (c) of this section.

32 (c) ~~One half of the revenue derived from the additional fee shall be deposited in~~
33 ~~the Recreation and Natural Heritage Trust Fund established under G.S. 113-77.7. The~~
34 ~~remaining one-half of the revenue derived from the additional fee for the special~~
35 ~~personalized registration plates shall be placed in a separate fund designated the~~
36 ~~"Personalized Registration Plate Fund". After deducting the cost of the plates, plus~~
37 ~~budgetary requirements for advertising, handling, and issuance to be determined by the~~
38 ~~Commissioner, the revenue in the Personalized Registration Plate~~ Use of Remaining
39 Proceeds. – The remaining revenue in the Fund shall be transferred quarterly as follows:

- 40 (1) Thirty-three percent (33%) to the account of the Department of
41 Economic and Community Development to aid in financing out-of-
42 state print and other media advertising under the program for the
43 promotion of travel and industrial development in this State.

- 1 (2) Fifty percent (50%) to the Department of Transportation to be used
2 solely for the purpose of beautification of highways other than those
3 designated as interstate. These funds shall be administered by the
4 Department of Transportation for beautification purposes not
5 inconsistent with good landscaping and engineering principles.
- 6 (3) Seventeen percent (17%) to the account of the Department of Human
7 Resources to promote travel accessibility for disabled persons in this
8 State. These funds shall be ~~used~~used to collect and update site
9 information on travel attractions designated by the Department of
10 Economic and Community Development in its ~~publications~~;
11 publications, to provide technical assistance to travel attractions
12 concerning accommodation of disabled ~~tourists~~tourists, and to

19 Any funds allocated for these purposes that are neither spent nor

23 removal of man-made barriers shall be developed in consultation with
24 the Department of Human Resources.
- 25 ~~(4) The Department of Economic and Community Development~~

- 42 (e) ~~Special personalized registration plate shall mean any registration plate~~
43 ~~bearing any combination of letters or numerals, or both, other than that which the~~

2 ~~or renewal vehicle registration.~~

3 (f) ~~In the event a personalized registration plate is lost, stolen or mutilated, the~~
4 ~~owner may not obtain another such plate bearing the same letter, letters or numerals~~
5 ~~until the next registration year. He may, upon proper application and payment of a fee~~
6 ~~of nine dollars (\$9.00), obtain a plate of the regular series. Provided, further, that a~~
7 ~~special personalized registration plate revoked for violation of the motor vehicle laws~~
8 ~~shall not be reissued, but in lieu thereof a plate of the regular series will be issued upon~~
