A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PROVIDE SUPPLEMENTAL PAY TO STATE EMPLOYEES AND
PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES WHO HAVE BEEN ORDERED TO ACTIVE
DUTY AS A RESULT OF THE PERSIAN GULF WAR.
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law,

- (1) Any State employee, whether or not subject to Chapter 126 of the General Statutes; and
- (2) Any employee of a local school administrative unit paid wholly or partly with State funds

who have been ordered to active military duty as a result of the Persian Gulf War shall receive supplemental pay up to the amount of the employee's monthly salary at the time he was ordered to active military duty. No such employee shall receive an amount of supplemental pay that, when added to to his military pay, would be greater than the amount of his monthly State salary. All State benefits shall continue throughout such employee's active military duty.

- Sec. 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 150B-13(a) and 150B-13(a1), the Office of State Personnel shall adopt temporary rules to implement the provisions of this act.
- Sec. 3. This act is effective retroactively as of July 1, 1990, and expires July 1, 1992.
