## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

#### 2 AN CERTAIN UNCOMPENSATED ACT TO CLARIFY EMERGENCY 3 TREATMENT BY A PHYSICIAN UNDER THE GOOD SAMARITAN 4 STATUTE. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 90-21.14(b) reads as rewritten: 6 Nothing in this section shall be deemed or construed to relieve any person 7 "(b) from liability for damages for injury or death caused by an act or omission on the part of 8 9 such person while rendering health care services in the normal and ordinary course of his business or profession. Services provided by a volunteer health care provider who 10 receives no compensation for his services and who renders first aid or emergency 11 12 treatment to members of athletic teams are deemed not to be in the normal and ordinary course of the volunteer health care provider's business or profession. Services provided 13 by a medical or health care provider who receives no compensation for his services and 14 15 who voluntarily renders treatment at facilities of local health departments as defined in G.S. 130A-2 or at a non-profit community health center, are deemed not to be in the 16 normal and ordinary course of the volunteer medical or health care provider's business 17 18 or profession. First aid or emergency health care treatment rendered in an inpatient facility by a physician who is licensed to practice medicine in this State, who receives 19 no compensation for such treatment, and who does not have a physician-patient 20 21 relationship with the patient receiving such treatment, is deemed not to be in the normal

22 and ordinary course of the physician's business or profession when the physician is not

23 <u>on emergency call or otherwise contractually obligated by a preexisting duty to treat the</u>

24 patient."

- 1 (c) In the event of any conflict between the provisions of this section and those of 2 G.S. 20-166(d), the provisions of G.S. 20-166(d) shall control and continue in full force 3 and effect."
- 4 Sec. 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 1991, and applies to health care 5 services provided and to actions filed on or after that date.
