2	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE FEE-BASED PRACTICING PASTORAL
3	COUNSELORS CERTIFICATION ACT.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
6	Article to read:
7	" <u>ARTICLE 25.</u>
8	''FEE-BASED PRACTICING PASTORAL COUNSELORS.
9	" <u>§ 90-350. Title.</u>
10	This Article shall be known as the 'Fee-Based Practicing Pastoral Counselor
11	Certification Act.'
12	" <u>§ 90-351. Purpose.</u>
13	It is the purpose of this Article to protect the public safety and welfare by providing
14	for the certification and regulation of persons engaged in the practice of fee-based
15	pastoral counseling and pastoral psychotherapy.
16	" <u>§ 90-352. Definitions.</u>
17	The following definitions apply in this Article:

1	<u>(1)</u>	Accredited educational institution. – A college, university, or
2		theological seminary chartered by the State and accredited by the
3		appropriate regional association of colleges and secondary schools or
4	(-)	by the appropriate association of theological schools and seminaries.
5	<u>(2)</u>	Board The North Carolina State Board of Examiners of Fee-Based
6		Practicing Pastoral Counselors.
7	<u>(3)</u>	Fee-based pastoral counseling associate An individual, certified
8		under this Article, who renders or offers professional pastoral
9		counseling services only under qualified supervision in accordance
10		with rules adopted by the Board.
11	<u>(4)</u>	Fee-based pastoral counselor A minister who receives fees from the
12		practice of pastoral counseling.
13	<u>(5)</u>	Fee-based practice of pastoral counseling To render or offer for a
14		fee or other compensation professional pastoral counseling services,
15		whether to the general public or to organizations, either public or
16		private; to individuals, singly or in groups; to couples, married or in
17		other relationships; and to families.
18	<u>(6)</u>	Fee-based professional pastoral counseling services. – The application
19		of pastoral care and pastoral counseling principles and procedures for a
20		fee or other compensation with the purpose of understanding,
21		anticipating, or influencing the behavior of individuals in order to
22		assist in their attainment of maximum personal growth; optimal work,
23		marital, family, church, school, social, and interpersonal relationships;
24		and healthy personal adaptation. The application of pastoral care and
25		pastoral psychotherapy principles and procedures includes sustaining,
26		healing, shepherding, nurturing, guiding, and reconciling;
27		interviewing, counseling, and using psychotherapy, diagnosing,
28		preventing, and ameliorating difficulties in living; and resolving
29		interpersonal and social conflict. Teaching, writing, the giving of
30		public speeches or lectures, and research concerned with pastoral care
31		and counseling principles are not included in professional pastoral
32		counseling services within the meaning of this Article.
33	<u>(7)</u>	Minister. – A person who has been called, elected, or otherwise
34	\/	authorized by a church, denomination, or faith group through
35		ordination, consecration or equivalent means, to exercise within and on
36		behalf of the denomination or faith group specific religious leadership
37		and service that furthers its purpose and mission and that differs from
38		the religious service of the laity of the denomination or faith group.
39	<u>(8)</u>	Pastoral counseling. – Used interchangeably with pastoral
40		psychotherapy to mean a process in which a pastoral counselor utilizes
41		insights and principles derived from the disciplines of theology and the
42		behavioral sciences to help persons achieve wholeness and health.
43	<u>(9)</u>	Pastoral psychotherapy. – The use of pastoral care and pastoral
44	<u>())</u>	counseling methods in a professional relationship to assist a person in

Initial appointees shall be persons who meet the education and experience requirements 1 2 for certification under this Article and shall be deemed certified upon appointment. In 3 making appointments, consideration shall be given to adequate representation from the various fields and areas of the practice of pastoral counseling. Legislative appointments 4 5 shall be made in accordance with G.S. 120-121. 6 (b)Of the members initially appointed, three members, including one certified 7 fee-based practicing pastoral counselor appointed by the Governor, one certified fee-8 based pastoral counseling associate appointed by the Governor, and one public member 9 who has no direct affiliation with the practice of pastoral counseling appointed by the 10 General Assembly upon the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, shall serve for a term of two years. Two members, including one certified fee-11 12 based practicing pastoral counselor appointed by the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives and one public member 13 14 who has no direct affiliation with the practice of pastoral counseling appointed by the 15 General Assembly upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of 16 Representatives, shall serve for a term of three years. No person may be appointed more than once to fill an 25 unexpired term nor to more than two consecutive terms. 26 27 The Governor may remove any member of the Board for neglect of duty, (d)malfeasance, conviction of a felony or conviction of a crime involving moral turpitude 28 29 while in office, but for no other reason. 30 Five Board members shall constitute a quorum. The Governor shall designate (e) one Board member who is a certified fee-based practicing pastoral counselor to serve as 31 32 chairperson during the term of his or her appointment to the Board. No person may 33 serve as chairperson for more than four years. The Board shall specify the location of 34 its principal office. 35 (f) The Board shall meet at least annually at a time set by the Board. The Board 36 may hold additional meetings and conduct any proceeding or investigation necessary to its purposes and may empower its agents or counsel to conduct any investigation 37 38 necessary to its purposes. The Board may order that any records concerning the 39 provision of pastoral counseling services relevant to a complaint received by the Board or any inquiry or investigation conducted by or on behalf of the Board be produced for 40 inspection and copying by representatives of the Board. The Board shall adopt an 41 42 official seal, which shall be affixed to all certificates issued by the Board. The Board shall adopt rules necessary to conduct its business, carry out its duties, and administer 43 44 this Article in accordance with Chapter 150B of the General Statutes.

A certificate issued under this Article shall be automatically suspended by the 1 (b)2 Board after failure to renew a certificate for a period of more than three months after the 3 annual renewal date. Except as otherwise provided in this Article, the procedure for revocation, 4 (c) 5 suspension, refusal, or other limitations of the certificate shall be in accordance with the 6 provisions of Chapter 150B of the General Statutes. In any proceeding or record of any 7 hearing before the Board, and in any complaint or notice of charges against any certified 8 fee-based pastoral counselor or certified fee-based pastoral counseling associate and in 9 any decision rendered by the Board, the Board shall endeavor to withhold from public 10 disclosure the identity of any counselees or clients who have not consented to the public disclosure of treatment by the certified fee-based pastoral counselor or certified fee-11 12 based pastoral counseling associate. The Board may close a hearing to the public and receive in executive session evidence concerning the treatment or delivery of pastoral 13 14 counseling services to a counselee or a client who has not consented to public disclosure 15 of treatment or services, as may be necessary for the protection of the counselee's or client's rights and the full presentation of relevant evidence. All records, papers, and 16 17 documents containing information collected and compiled by or on behalf of the Board 18 as a result of investigations, inquiries, or interviews conducted in connection with certification or disciplinary matters are not public records within the meaning of 19 20 Chapter 132 of the General Statutes. However, any notice or statement of charges 21 against any certified fee-based pastoral counselor or certified fee-based pastoral counseling associate, any notice to any certified fee-based pastoral counselor or certified 22 23 fee-based pastoral counseling associate of a hearing in any proceeding, or any decision 24 rendered in connection with a hearing in any proceeding is a public record within the meaning of Chapter 132 of the General Statutes, except that identifying information 25 concerning the treatment or delivery of services to a counselee or client who has not 26 27 consented to the public disclosure of such treatment or services may be deleted. Any record, paper, or other document containing information collected and compiled by or 28 29 on behalf of the Board, as provided in this section, that is received and admitted in 30 evidence in any hearing before the Board shall be a public record within the meaning of Chapter 132 of the General Statutes, subject to any deletions of identifying information 31 32 concerning the treatment or delivery of pastoral counseling services to a counselee or 33 client who has not consented to public disclosure of the treatment or services. The Board may reinstate a suspended certificate upon payment by an 34 (d) 35 applicant of a fee of twenty dollars (\$20.00), and may require that the applicant file a new application, submit to reexamination for reinstatement, and pay other authorized 36 37 fees as required by the Board. 38 Upon proof that a certified fee-based pastoral counselor or certified fee-based (e) 39 pastoral counseling associate certified under this Article has engaged in any of the prohibited actions specified in subsection (a) of this section, the Board may, in lieu of 40 41 refusal, suspension, or revocation, do any one or more of the following: 42 (1) Issue a formal reprimand; Formally censure the certified fee-based pastoral counselor or certified 43 (2) 44 fee-based pastoral counseling associate;

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(3) Place the certified fee-based pastoral counselor or certified fee-based
pastoral counseling associate on probation with any conditions the
Board may deem advisable; or
(4) <u>Limit or circumscribe the professional pastoral counseling services</u>
provided by the certified fee-based pastoral counselor or the certified
fee-based pastoral counseling associate as the Board deems advisable.
(f) The Board may impose conditions of probation or restrictions on continued
practice at the conclusion of a period of suspension or as a condition for the restoration
of a revoked or suspended certificate. In lieu of or in connection with any disciplinary
proceedings or investigation, the Board may enter into a consent order relating to the
discipline, censure, proceeding costs, probation, or limitations on the practice of a
certified fee-based pastoral counselor or a certified fee-based pastoral counseling
associate.
"§ 90-361. Prohibited acts.
No person shall represent himself to be a certified fee-based practicing pastoral
counselor or a certified fee-based pastoral counseling associate, or engage in or offer to
engage in the practice of certified fee-based pastoral counseling, without a valid
certificate issued under this Article. No person shall use these titles or descriptions, or
any of their derivatives, in a manner that implies the person is certified under this
Article. No called or elected pastor during his active full-time pastorate shall practice as
a certified fee-based pastoral counselor even if certified under this Article.
"§ 90-362. Disposition of fees.
The fees derived from the operation of this Article shall be used by the Board in
carrying out its functions. The operations of the Board are subject to the oversight of
the State Auditor pursuant to Article 5A of Chapter 147 of the General Statutes.
" <u>§ 90-363. Injunction for violations.</u>
The Board may apply to superior court for an injunction to prevent violations of this
Article or of any rules adopted by the Board, and the court has the authority to grant an
injunction.
" <u>§ 90-364. Duplicate and replacement certificates.</u>
A certified fee-based pastoral counselor may request that the Board issue a duplicate
or replacement certificate for a fee set by the Board not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00).
Upon receipt of the request, a showing of good cause for the issuance of a duplicate
replacement certificate, and payment of the fee, the Board shall issue a duplicate or
replacement certificate.
"§ 90-365. Practice of medicine and psychology not authorized.
Nothing in this Article shall authorize the practice of medicine as defined in Article
1 of this Chapter or the practice of psychology as defined in Article 18A of this Chapter.
" <u>§ 90-366. Third-party reimbursement.</u>
Nothing in this Article shall be construed to authorize or require direct third-party
reimbursement to persons certified under this Article."
Sec. 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 1991.
