A BILL TO BE ENTITLED		
AN ACT TO CREATE A STUDY ON ACCESS TO HEALTH INSURANCE.		
Whereas, providing uninsured North Carolinians with access to affordable		
health insurance is a public policy issue of high priority; and		
Whereas, at any one time nearly one in every seven North Carolinians is		
without health insurance; and		
Whereas, the lack of access to health insurance is also a national problem		
which affects between 33 million and 37 million Americans; Now, therefore,		
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
Section 1. The Commission on Access to Health Insurance is created. The		
Commission shall design a program to ensure that all citizens of the State have access to		
affordable health insurance that provides coverage for basic health care needs. In		
designing the program, the Commission shall consider:		
(1) Programs the State could implement to provide health insurance		
coverage at an affordable price to all North Carolinians, including the		
feasibility of:		
a. An employer based health insurance plan, which would include		
a State pool to cover those who are not in the labor force, and		
the need for tax incentives to enable certain employers to offer		
health insurance; and		
b. A comprehensive single payor plan, based on the Canadian		
health care model.

4	(5)	How the Access Forum, convened by the North Carolina Institute of

7	Sec. 2.	. The Commission shall consist of 26 members as follows:	
8	(1)	The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint nine	
9		members as follows: five members of the House of Representatives;	
10		one member who is the president or vice-president of a business	
11		employing less than 20 employees; one member who represents a	
12		health maintenance organization that provides health care in the State;	
13		one member who is a hospital administrator; and one member who is a	
14		public member who is uninsured;	
15	(2)	The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint nine members	
16		as follows: five members of the Senate; one member who is the	
17		president or vice-president of a business employing more than 100	
18		employees; one member who is a health care provider; one member	
19		who represents an insurance company that provides health insurance	
20		coverage in this State; and one public member who is knowledgeable	
21		about the problems of the uninsured;	
22	(3)	The President of the North Carolina Medical Society, or his	
23		representative;	
24	(4)	The President of the North Carolina Hospital Association, or his	
25		representative;	
26	(5)	The Commissioner of Insurance, or Deputy Commissioner of	
27		Insurance;	
28	(6)	President of North Carolina Citizens for Business and Industry;

39		. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall designate one Senator	
40	as cochair and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall designate one

42	Sec. 4. In addition to its regular meetings, the Commission shall hold three		
43	public hearings across the State, to solicit input about the extent of the problem of the		

1 uninsured and underinsured, and potential solutions to ensure that all citizens have 2 access to adequate and affordable health care.

3 Sec. 5. The Commission shall submit an interim report on the role of the 4 State in solving the health insurance dilemma on or before the first day of the 1991 5 General Assembly, Regular Session 1992, by filing the report with the President Pro 6 Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

7 Sec. 6. The Commission shall submit a final report of its findings and 8 recommendations to the General Assembly on or before the first day of the 1993 9 Session of the General Assembly by filing the report with the President Pro Tempore of 10 the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. Upon filing its final report, 11 the Commission shall terminate.

12 Sec. 7. Members of the Commission shall receive subsistence and travel 13 expenses at the rates set forth in G.S. 120-3.1, 138-5, and 138-6, as applicable.

14 Sec. 8. The Commission may contract for clerical or professional staff or for 15 any other services it may require in the course of its ongoing study. At the request of 16 the Commission, the Legislative Services Commission may supply members of the staff 17 of the Legislative Services Office and clerical assistance to the Commission as the 18 Legislative Services Commission deems appropriate. The Commission may, with the 19 approval of the Legislative Services Commission, meet in the State Legislative Building 20 or the Legislative Office Building.

21 Sec. 9. The Commission may accept gifts, grants, donations, or contributions 22 from any source. These funds shall be held in a separate account and used solely in 23 furtherance of the study.

24 There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General Sec. 10. 25 Assembly for fiscal year 1991-92 the sum of \$100,000 and for fiscal year 1992-93 the sum of \$100,000 for the expenses of the Commission. 26

27 Sec. 11. This act becomes effective July 1, 1991.
