A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO RETURN THE HISTORIC DESIGNATION - "THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA"- TO THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA SYSTEM'S CONSTITUENT INSTITUTION THAT IS LOCATED AT CHAPEL HILL.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 7A-343.1 reads as rewritten:

"§ 7A-343.1. Distribution of copies of the appellate division reports.

The Administrative Officer of the Courts shall, at the State's expense distribute such number of copies of the appellate division reports to federal, State departments and agencies, and to educational institutions of instruction, as follows:Governor, Office of

16 justice of the Supreme Court and judge of the Court of Appeals shall receive for his
 17 private use, one complete and up-to-date set of the appellate division reports. The copies
 18 of reports furnished each justice or judge as set out in the table above may be retained
 19 by him personally to enable him to keep up-to-date his personal set of reports."

20 Sec. 2. G.S. 20-7(i1) reads as rewritten:

21 "(i1) Any person whose driver's license or other privilege to operate a motor
 22 vehicle in this State has been suspended, canceled or revoked pursuant to the provisions
 23 of this Chapter, other than G.S. 20-17(2), shall pay a restoration fee of twenty-five
 24 dollars (\$25.00). A person whose driver's license has been revoked under G.S. 20-17(2)
 25 shall pay a restoration fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) until the end of the fiscal year in
 26 which the cumulative total amount of fees deposited under this subsection in the
 27 General Fund exceeds five million dollars (\$5,000,000), and shall pay a restoration fee
 28 of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) thereafter. The fee shall be paid to the Division prior to
 29 the issuance to such person of a new driver's license or the restoration of such driver's
 30 license or privilege; such restoration fee shall be paid to the Division in addition to any
 31 and all fees which may be provided by law. This restoration fee shall not be required
 32 from any licensee whose license was suspended, canceled, revoked or voluntarily
 33 surrendered for medical or health reasons whether or not a medical evaluation was
 34 conducted pursuant to this Chapter. The twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) fee, and the first
 35 twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) of the fifty-dollar (\$50.00) fee, shall be deposited in the
 36 Highway Fund. The remaining twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) of the fifty-dollar (\$50.00)
 37 fee shall be deposited in the General Fund of the State. The Office of State Budget and
 38 Management shall certify to the Department of Transportation and the General
 39 Assembly when the cumulative total amount of fees deposited in the General Fund
 40 under this subsection exceeds five million dollars (\$5,000,000), and shall annually
 41 report to the General Assembly the amount of fees deposited in the General Fund under
 42 this subsection.

43 It is the intent of the General Assembly to annually appropriate the funds deposited
 44 in the General Fund under this subsection to the Board of Governors of The University

1 of North Carolina System to be used for the Center for Alcohol Studies Endowment at
2 ~~The the~~ University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, Carolina, but not to exceed this
3 cumulative total of five million dollars (\$5,000,000)."

4 Sec. 3. G.S. 36B-8 reads as rewritten:

5 **"§ 36B-8. Conflict with other law.**

6 To the extent that the provisions of this Chapter are inconsistent with the provisions
7 of either Chapter 36A or Chapter 55A, the provisions of this Chapter shall control. The
8 provisions of this Chapter shall not apply to ~~the~~ The University of North Carolina-
9 Carolina System."

10 Sec. 4. G.S. 87-7 reads as rewritten:

11 **"§ 87-7. Records of Board; disposition of funds.**

12 The secretary-treasurer shall keep a record of the proceedings of the said Board and
13 shall receive and account for all moneys derived from the operation of this Article. Any
14 funds remaining in the hands of the secretary-treasurer to the credit of the Board after
15 the expenses of the Board for the current year have been paid shall be paid over to ~~the~~
16 ~~Greater~~ The University of North Carolina System for the use of the School of
17 Engineering through the North Carolina Engineering Foundation. The Board has the
18 right, however, to retain at least ten percent (10%) of the total expense it incurs for a
19 year's operation to meet any emergency that may arise. As an expense of the Board, said
20 Board is authorized to expend such funds as it deems necessary to provide retirement
21 and disability compensation for its employees."

22 Sec. 5. G.S. 87-45 reads as rewritten:

23 **"§ 87-45. Funds.**

24 The fees collected for examinations and licenses under this Article shall be used for
25 the expenses of the State Board of Examiners of Electrical Contractors in carrying out
26 the provisions of this Article. No expenses of the Board or compensation of any
27 member or employee of the Board shall be payable out of the treasury of the State of
28 North Carolina; and neither the Board nor any member or employee thereof shall have
29 any power or authority to make or incur any expense, debt or other financial obligation
30 binding upon the State of North Carolina. Any funds remaining in the hands of the
31 secretary- treasurer to the credit of the Board after all expenses of the Board for the
32 current fiscal year have been fully provided for shall be paid over to the North Carolina
33 Engineering Foundation, Inc., for the benefit of the electrical engineering department of
34 ~~the Greater~~ The University of North Carolina- Carolina System. Provided, however, the
35 Board shall have the right to maintain an amount, the cumulative total of which shall not
36 exceed twenty percent (20%) of gross receipts for the previous fiscal year of its
37 operation as a maximum contingency or emergency fund."

38 Sec. 6. G.S. 87-52 reads as rewritten:

39 **"§ 87-52. State Board of Refrigeration Examiners; appointment; term of office.**

40 For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Article, the State Board of
41 Refrigeration Examiners is created, consisting of seven members appointed by the
42 Governor to serve seven-year staggered terms. The Board shall consist of one member
43 who is a wholesaler or a manufacturer of refrigeration equipment; one member from an
44 engineering school of ~~The Greater~~ University of North Carolina- Carolina System, one

1 member from the Division of Public Health of The ~~Greater~~ University of North
2 ~~Carolina, Carolina System,~~ two licensed refrigeration contractors, and two members
3 who have no ties with the construction industry to represent the interest of the public at
4 large. The term of office of one member shall expire each year. Vacancies occurring
5 during a term shall be filled by appointment of the Governor for the unexpired term.
6 Whenever the term 'Board' is used in this Article, it means the State Board of
7 Refrigeration Examiners. No Board member shall serve more than one complete
8 consecutive term."

9 Sec. 7. G.S. 90-9 reads as rewritten:

10 **"§ 90-9. Examination for license; scope; conditions and prerequisites.**

11 It shall be the duty of the Board of Medical Examiners to examine for license to
12 practice medicine or surgery, or any of the branches thereof, every applicant who
13 complies with the following provisions: He shall, before he is admitted to examination,
14 satisfy the Board that he has an academic education equal to the entrance requirements
15 of ~~the~~ The University of North Carolina, Carolina System, or furnish a certificate from
16 the superintendent of public instruction of the county that he has passed an examination
17 upon his literary attainments to meet the requirements of entrance in the regular course
18 of the State University. He shall exhibit a diploma or furnish satisfactory proof of
19 graduation from a medical college or an osteopathic college approved by the American
20 Osteopathic Association at the time of his graduation, which time of graduation shall
21 have been on January 1, 1960, or subsequent thereto and which medical and osteopathic
22 schools shall require an attendance of not less than four years or for a lesser period of
23 time approved by the Board, and supply such facilities for clinical and scientific
24 instruction as shall meet the approval of the Board. An applicant shall have graduated
25 from a medical college approved by the Liaison Commission on Medical Education or
26 osteopathic college that has been approved by the American Osteopathic Association;
27 or, if he was graduated from any other medical or osteopathic college, the applicant
28 shall be enrolled in a graduate medical education and training program in North
29 Carolina which has been approved by the Board. An applicant who has graduated from
30 a medical college not approved by the Liaison Commission on Medical Education or
31 osteopathic college that has not been approved by the American Osteopathic
32 Association and who has not enrolled in a graduate medical education and training
33 program in North Carolina which has been approved by the Board shall satisfy the
34 Board that he has successfully completed three years of graduate medical education in a
35 training program approved by the Board. No applicant from a medical or osteopathic
36 college which has been disapproved by the Board shall be eligible to take the
37 examination.

38 The examination shall cover the branches of medical science and subjects which the
39 Board deems necessary to determine competence to practice medicine. The Board may
40 divide the examination into parts or components.

41 If the applicant successfully passes the examination, as determined by the Board,
42 and if the applicant satisfies the Board that he is of good moral character and that either,
43 (1) if the applicant is a graduate of a medical college approved by the Liaison
44 Commission on Medical Education or osteopathic college approved by the American

1 Osteopathic Association, he has successfully completed one year of training in a
2 medical education program approved by the Board after graduation from medical
3 school; or (2) if the applicant is a graduate of a medical college that has not been
4 approved by the Liaison Commission on Medical Education or osteopathic college that
5 has not been approved by the American Osteopathic Association, he has successfully
6 completed three years of training in a medical education program approved by the
7 Board after graduation from medical school, then the Board shall grant the applicant a
8 license authorizing him to practice medicine in any of its branches.

9 Applicants shall be examined by number only; names and other identifying
10 information shall not appear on examination papers."

11 Sec. 8. G.S. 90-113.3 reads as rewritten:

12 **"§ 90-113.3. Education and research.**

13 (a) The North Carolina Department of Public Instruction and the Board of
14 Governors of ~~the~~The University of North Carolina System are authorized and directed
15 to carry out educational programs designed to prevent and deter misuse and abuse of
16 controlled substances. In connection with such programs, they are authorized to:

- 17 (1) Promote better recognition of the problems of misuse and abuse of
18 controlled substances within the regulated industry and among
19 interested groups and organizations;
- 20 (2) Assist the regulated industry and interested groups and organizations
21 in contributing to the reduction of misuse and abuse of controlled
22 substances; and
- 23 (3) Disseminate the results of research on misuse and abuse of controlled
24 substances to promote a better public understanding of what problems
25 exist and what can be done to combat them.

26 (b) The North Carolina Department of Public Instruction and the Board of
27 Governors of ~~the~~The University of North Carolina System or either of them may enter
28 into contracts for educational activities related to controlled substances.

29 (c) The North Carolina Department of Human Resources is authorized and
30 directed to encourage research on misuse and abuse of controlled substances. In
31 connection with such research and in furtherance of the enforcement of this Article, it is
32 authorized to:

- 33 (1) Establish methods to assess accurately the effects of controlled
34 substances and to identify and characterize controlled substances with
35 potential for abuse;
- 36 (2) Make studies and undertake programs of research to:
 - 37 a. Develop new or improved approaches, techniques, systems,
38 equipment, and devices to strengthen the enforcement of this
39 Article;
 - 40 b. Determine patterns of misuse and abuse of controlled
41 substances and the social effect thereof; and
 - 42 c. Improve methods for preventing, predicting, understanding, and
43 dealing with the misuse and abuse of controlled substances.

1 (3) Enter into contracts with other public agencies, any district attorney,
2 institutions of higher education, and private organizations or
3 individuals for the purpose of conducting research, demonstrations, or
4 special projects which bear directly on misuse and abuse of controlled
5 substances.

6 (d) The North Carolina Department of Human Resources may enter into
7 contracts for research activities related to controlled substances, and the North Carolina
8 Department of Public Instruction and the Board of Governors of ~~the~~The University of
9 North Carolina System or either of them may enter into contracts for educational
10 activities related to controlled substances, without performance bonds.

11 (e) The North Carolina Department of Human Resources may authorize persons
12 engaged in research on the use and effects of controlled substances to withhold the
13 names and other identifying characteristics of persons who are the subjects of such
14 research. Persons who obtain this authorization may not be compelled in any State civil,
15 criminal, administrative, legislative, or other proceeding to identify the subjects of
16 research for which such authorization was obtained.

17 (f) The North Carolina Department of Human Resources may authorize persons
18 engaged in research to possess and distribute controlled substances in accordance with
19 such restrictions as the authorization may impose. Persons who obtain this authorization
20 shall be exempt from State prosecution for possession and distribution of controlled
21 substances to the extent authorized by the North Carolina Department of Human
22 Resources."

23 Sec. 9. G.S. 106-202.14 reads as rewritten:

24 "**§ 106-202.14. Creation of Board; membership; terms; chairman; quorum; board**
25 **actions; compensation.**

26 (a) The North Carolina Plant Conservation Board is created within the
27 Department of Agriculture.

28 (b) The Board shall consist of seven members who are residents of North
29 Carolina, one of whom represents each of the following:

30 (1) The North Carolina Botanical Garden of ~~The~~the University of North
31 ~~Carolina at Chapel Hill; Carolina;~~

32 (2) The botanical, scientific community in North Carolina;

33 (3) The Division of Forest Resources, Department of Environment,
34 Health, and Natural Resources;

35 (4) A North Carolina citizens conservation organization;

36 (5) The commercial plant production industry in North Carolina;

37 (6) The Department of Agriculture;

38 (7) The North Carolina public at large.

39 The Governor shall appoint the first four members enumerated above; the
40 Commissioner shall appoint the remaining three members.

41 (c) Initial appointments to the Board shall be made by October 1, 1979. Of the
42 terms of initial appointees, the representatives of the North Carolina Botanical Garden
43 of ~~The~~the University of North ~~Carolina at Chapel Hill; Carolina,~~ the commercial plant
44 production industry in North Carolina, and a North Carolina citizens conservation

1 organization shall serve two-year terms; all other members shall serve four-year terms.
2 All subsequent terms shall be for four-year terms.

3 (d) All members shall hold their offices until their successors are appointed and
4 qualified. Any vacancy occurring in the membership of the Board prior to the expiration
5 of the term shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term. The Commissioner
6 may at any time remove any member from the Board for cause. Each appointment to fill
7 a vacancy in the membership of the Board shall be of a person having the proper
8 credentials for that vacancy and appointed by the proper appointing agency.

9 (e) The Board shall select its chairman from its own membership to serve for a
10 term of two years. The chairman shall have a full vote. Any vacancy occurring in the
11 chairmanship shall be filled by the Board for the remainder of the term. The Board may
12 select other officers as it deems necessary.

13 (f) Any action of the Board shall require at least four concurring votes.

14 (g) Members of the Board who are not State employees shall receive per diem,
15 subsistence and travel allowances authorized by G.S. 138-5; members who are State
16 employees shall receive the subsistence and travel allowances authorized by G.S. 138-6;
17 and members who are also members of the General Assembly shall receive subsistence
18 and travel allowances authorized by G.S. 120-3.1."

19 Sec. 10. G.S. 106-202.17 reads as rewritten:

20 "**§ 106-202.17. Creation of committee; membership; terms; chairman; meetings;**
21 **committee action; quorum; compensation.**

22 (a) The North Carolina Plant Conservation Scientific Committee is created
23 within the Department of Agriculture.

24 (b) The Scientific Committee shall consist of the Directors of ~~The the~~ University
25 of North Carolina at ~~Chapel Hill~~ Herbarium, the North Carolina State University
26 Herbarium, the North Carolina Botanical Garden of ~~The the~~ University of North
27 ~~Carolina at Chapel Hill, Carolina,~~ the North Carolina Museum of Natural History and
28 the North Carolina Natural Heritage Program of the Department of Environment,
29 Health, and Natural Resources or their designees, a representative of the North Carolina
30 Association of Nurserymen, Inc., appointed by the Commissioner, and a representative
31 of the Garden Club of North Carolina, Incorporated, the North Carolina Chapter of the
32 Nature Conservancy or the North Carolina Wild Flower Preservation Society, Inc.,
33 appointed by the Commissioner. Members shall serve for three-year terms and may
34 succeed themselves.

35 (c) The Board shall select a chairman of the Scientific Committee from the
36 Scientific Committee's membership to serve for three years.

37 (d) The Scientific Committee may hold its meetings at the North Carolina
38 Botanical Garden of ~~The the~~ University of North ~~Carolina at Chapel Hill. Carolina.~~

39 (e) Any action of the Scientific Committee shall require at least four concurring
40 votes.

41 (f) Members of the Scientific Committee who are not State employees may
42 receive per diem, subsistence and travel allowances authorized by G.S. 138-5 if they so
43 request; members who are State employees may receive the subsistence and travel
44 allowances authorized by G.S. 138-6 if they so request; and members who are also

1 members of the General Assembly may receive subsistence and travel allowances
2 authorized by G.S. 120-3.1 if they so request."

3 Sec. 11. G.S. 106-769(a)(6) reads as rewritten:

4 "(6) The Dean of the School of Public Health of the University of North
5 Carolina at ~~Chapel Hill~~ or his designee;".

6 Sec. 12. G.S. 113-315.19 reads as rewritten:

7 **"§ 113-315.19. Personnel needs.**

8 To effectively carry out the duties and responsibilities set forth above, the Secretary
9 may employ or contract with the extension services of ~~the~~ The University of North
10 Carolina System to employ the following persons:

- 11 (1) A person to have responsibility for the successful execution of the
12 program and to coordinate as deemed desirable with other agencies of
13 the State and federal government,
- 14 (2) A business management specialist,
- 15 (3) An insurance and finance specialist,
- 16 (4) A specialist who could understand, interpret, and counsel on
17 regulations and requirements,
- 18 (5) A specialist in waterways, and water transportation, and
- 19 (6) Such clerical personnel as necessary to carry out the provisions of this
20 Article."

21 Sec. 13. G.S. 115B-2 reads as rewritten:

22 **"§ 115B-2. Tuition waiver authorized.**

23 State-supported institutions of higher education, community colleges, industrial
24 education centers and technical institutes, shall permit legal residents of North Carolina
25 who have attained the age of 65 to attend classes for credit or noncredit purposes
26 without the required payment of tuition; provided, however, that such persons meet
27 admission and other standards deemed appropriate by the educational institution, and
28 provided further that such persons shall be accepted by the constituent institutions of ~~the~~
29 The University of North Carolina System only on a spaces-available basis."

30 Sec. 14. G.S. 115B-3 reads as rewritten:

31 **"§ 115B-3. Rules and regulations.**

32 The Board of Governors of ~~the~~ The University of North Carolina System and the
33 State Board of Education shall each, with respect to the institutions governed by it,
34 promulgate rules and regulations necessary for the implementation of the provisions of
35 this Chapter."

36 Sec. 15. G.S. 115C-105(a) reads as rewritten:

37 "(a) There is hereby established the North Carolina Education Council composed
38 of the members of the education commission of the states representing this State, and
39 not exceeding five other persons appointed by the Governor for terms of three years.
40 Such other persons shall be selected so as to be broadly representative of professional
41 and lay interests within this State having the responsibilities for, knowledge with respect
42 to, and interest in educational matters. The Governor shall serve as chairman of the
43 North Carolina Education Council or any person that the Governor may designate shall
44 serve as chairman. The chairman of the State Board of Education, the Superintendent of

2 higher education, to improve the quality of education, to extend its benefits and to

5 Sec. 19. G.S. 116-2 reads as rewritten:

6 **"§ 116-2. Definitions.**

7 As used in this Article, unless the context clearly indicates a contrary intent:

8 (1) 'Board' means the Board of Governors of the University of North
9 ~~Carolina.~~Carolina System.

10 (2) 'Board of trustees' means the board of trustees of a constituent
11 institution.

12 (3) 'Chancellor' means the chancellor of a constituent institution.

13 (4) 'Constituent institution' or 'institution' means one of the 16 public
14 senior institutions, to wit, the University of North Carolina at Chapel
15 Hill, redesignated effective July 1, 1991, as 'the University of North
16 Carolina', North Carolina State University at Raleigh, the University of
17 North Carolina at Greensboro, the University of North Carolina at

28 Sec. 20. G.S. 116-3 reads as rewritten:

29 **"§ 116-3. Incorporation and corporate powers.**

30 ~~The Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina is hereby redesignated,~~
31 ~~effective July 1, 1972, as the 'Board of Governors of the University of North Carolina.'~~
32 The Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina, redesignated effective July
33 1, 1972, as the 'Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina', is, effective
34 July 1, 1991, referred to as the 'Board of Governors of The University of North
35 Carolina System'. The term 'The University of North Carolina System' refers, effective
36 July 1, 1991, to that part of the public system of higher education designated by Article
37 IX, Sec. 8, of the North Carolina Constitution as 'The University of North Carolina'.
38 ~~The Board of Governors of the~~The University of North Carolina System shall be
39 known and distinguished by the name of '~~the~~The University of North ~~Carolina,~~
40 Carolina System', and shall continue as a body politic and corporate and by that name
41 shall have perpetual succession and a common seal. It shall be able and capable in law
42 to take, demand, receive, and possess all moneys, goods, and chattels that shall be given

7 The corporation shall be able and capable in law to bargain, sell, grant, alien, or
8 dispose of and convey and assure to the purchasers any and all such real and personal
9 estate and funds as it may lawfully acquire when the condition of the grant to it or the
10 will of the devisor does not forbid it; and shall be able and capable in law to sue and be
11 sued in all courts whatsoever; and shall have power to open and receive subscriptions,
12 and in general may do all such things as are usually done by bodies corporate and
13 politic, or such as may be necessary for the promotion of learning and virtue."

14 Sec. 21. G.S. 116-4 reads as rewritten:

15 "**§ 116-4. Constituent institutions of ~~the~~The University of North ~~Carolina.~~**
16 **Carolina System.**

17 On July 1, 1972, the University of North ~~Carolina~~Carolina, referred to, effective

30 All property of whatsoever kind and all rights and privileges held by the Board of

32 Carolina University, Elizabeth City State University, Fayetteville State University,
33 North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University, North Carolina Central
34 University, North Carolina School of the Arts, Pembroke State University, Western
35 Carolina University and Winston-Salem State University, as said property, rights and
36 privileges may exist immediately prior to July 1, 1972, shall be, and hereby are,
37 effective July 1, 1972, transferred to and vested in the Board of Governors of the

42 **"§ 116-21. Contract forms; reports; audits; regulations.**

43 The Board of Governors of ~~the~~ The University of North Carolina System is
44 authorized to prescribe the form of the contracts to be executed under G.S. 116-19 and

1 116-20, to require of the institutions such reports, statements and audits as the Board
2 may deem necessary or desirable in carrying out the purposes of G.S. 116-19 through

37 (a) The board of trustees of each constituent institution shall establish and
38 maintain, pursuant to such terms and conditions, uniformly applicable to all constituent
39 institutions, as the Board of Governors of ~~the~~ The University of North Carolina System
40 may from time to time prescribe, an endowment fund for the constituent institution.

41 (b) It is not the intent of this section that the proceeds from any endowment fund

32 transaction, and in doing so they shall not be subject to the provisions of Chapters 143

6 endowment funds now held or hereafter acquired for the benefit of the University of

8 (il) The Board of Governors of ~~the~~The University of North Carolina System
9 shall establish and maintain in a manner not inconsistent with the provisions of this
10 section or with regulations established under this section an endowment fund for all
11 endowment funds now held or hereafter acquired for the benefit of the University of
12 North Carolina Center for Public Television.

13 (j) Any gift, devise, or bequest of real or personal property to a constituent
14 institution of ~~the~~The University of North Carolina System or to ~~the~~The University of
15 North Carolina System or to the University of North Carolina Press or to the University
16 of North Carolina Center for Public Television shall be presumed, nothing to the
17 contrary appearing, a gift, devise, or bequest, as the case may be, to the endowment
18 fund of the respective institution or agency.

19 (k) Whenever any property of an endowment fund authorized by this section is
20 disposed of or otherwise transferred from the endowment fund, any instrument of
21 transfer shall indicate that the donor, grantor, seller, lessor, lender, or transferor, as the
22 case may be, is the board of trustees of the endowment fund."

24 **"§ 116-37. University of North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill.**

25 (a) Composition. – The Board of Governors of ~~the~~The University of North
26 Carolina System is hereby directed to create a board of directors for the University of
27 North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill consisting of 12 members of which nine shall
28 be appointed by the Board of Governors. Three members ex officio of said board shall
29 be the University of North Carolina ~~at Chapel Hill~~ Vice-Chancellor for Health Affairs,
30 University of North Carolina ~~at Chapel Hill~~ Vice-Chancellor for Business and Finance,
31 and the Dean of the University of North Carolina ~~at Chapel Hill~~ Medical School, or
32 successors to these offices under other titles with similar responsibilities. Nine members
33 shall be appointed from the business and professional public-at-large, none of whom
34 shall be Governors of ~~the~~University, The University of North Carolina System, and,

36 chairman. Members of this board shall include, but not be limited to, persons with
37 special competence in business management, hospital administration, and medical
38 practice not affiliated with University faculty. The Governors may remove any member
39 for cause. Board members, other than ex officio members, shall each receive such per
40 diem and necessary travel and subsistence expenses while engaged in the discharge of
41 their official duties as is provided by law for members of State boards and commissions
42 generally.

43 (a1) Appointment to Board. – Each of the nine persons who, as of June 30, 1989,
44 is serving as an appointed member of the Board shall be reassigned by the Governors,

1 each to a different term, ending June 30, 1989, June 30, 1990, June 30, 1991, June 30,
2 1992, June 30, 1993, June 30, 1994, June 30, 1995, June 30, 1996, or June 30, 1997.
3 After July 1, 1989, the term of office for new appointments shall commence on July 1,
4 and all members shall serve for four-year terms; provided, however, that no person may
5 be appointed to (i) more than three full four-year terms in succession, or (ii) a four-year
6 term if preceded immediately by 12 years of service. Resignation from a term of office
7 shall not constitute a break in service for the purpose of this subsection. Board member
8 vacancies shall be filled by the Governors for the remainder of the unexpired term.

9 (b) Meetings and Powers of Board. – The board of directors shall meet at least
10 every 60 days and may hold special meetings at any time and place within the State at
11 the call of its chairman. The board of directors shall make rules, regulations, and
12 policies governing the management and operation of the University of North Carolina
13 Hospitals at Chapel Hill, consistent with basic State statutes and procedures, to meet the
14 goals of education, research, patient care, and community service. The board's action on
15 matters within its jurisdiction is final, except that appeals may be made, in writing, to
16 the Board of Governors with a copy of the appeal to the University administration. The
17 board of directors shall elect and may remove the executive director of the University of
18 North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill. The board of directors may enter into formal
19 agreements with the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, ~~Carolina~~, Division of
20 Health Affairs, with respect to the provision of clinical experience for students and may
21 also enter into formal agreements with the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill
22 for the provision of maintenance and supporting services.

23 (c) Executive Director. – The chief administrative officer of the University of
24 North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill shall be the executive director, who shall be
25 appointed by the board of directors to serve at its pleasure. The executive director shall
26 administer the affairs of the University of North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill
27 subject to the duly adopted policies, rules, and regulations of the board of directors,
28 including the appointment, promotion, demotion, and discharge of all personnel. The
29 executive director shall report to the board of directors quarterly or more often as
30 required. The executive director will serve as secretary to the board of directors.

31 (d) Personnel. – The University of North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill shall
32 maintain a personnel office for personnel administration.

33 (e) Finances. – The University of North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill shall
34 be subject to the provisions of the Executive Budget Act. There shall be maintained a
35 business and budget office to administer the budget and financial affairs of the
36 University of North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill. The executive director, subject
37 to the board of directors, shall be responsible for all aspects of budget preparation,
38 budget execution, and expenditure reporting. Subject to the approval of the Director of
39 the Budget: All operating funds of the University of North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel
40 Hill may be budgeted and disbursed through a special fund code, all receipts of the
41 University of North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill may be deposited directly to the
42 special fund code; and general fund appropriations for support of the University of
43 North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill may be budgeted in a general fund code under a
44 single purpose, 'Contribution to University of North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill

1 Operations' and be transferable to the special fund operating code as receipts. Prior to
2 taking any action under this subsection, the Director of the Budget may consult with the
3 Advisory Budget Commission.

4 (f) Purchases. – The University of North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill shall
5 be subject to all provisions of Articles 3 and 3A of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes
6 relating to the Department of Administration, Purchase and Contract Division. There
7 shall be maintained a purchasing office to handle all purchasing requirements of the
8 University of North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill. The Purchase and Contract
9 Division may enter into such arrangements with the board of directors as the Division
10 may deem necessary in consideration of the special requirements of the University of
11 North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill for procurement of certain supplies, materials,
12 equipments and services.

13 (g) Property. – The board of directors shall be responsible to the ~~University~~
14 Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina System for the maintenance,
15 operation, and control of the University of North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill and
16 grounds.

17 (h) Patient Information. – The University of North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel
18 Hill shall, at the earliest possible opportunity, specifically make a verbal and written
19 request to each patient to disclose the patient's Social Security number, if any. If the
20 patient does not disclose that number, the University of North Carolina Hospitals at
21 Chapel Hill shall deny benefits, rights and privileges of the University of North Carolina
22 Hospitals at Chapel Hill to the patient as soon as practical, to the maximum extent
23 permitted by federal law or federal regulations. The University of North Carolina
24 Hospitals at Chapel Hill shall make the disclosure to the patient required by Section 7(b)
25 of P.L. 93-579. This subsection is supplementary to G.S. 105A-3(c)."

26 Sec. 32. G.S. 116-38(a) reads as rewritten:

27 "(a) The Chapel Hill City Board of Education is authorized to enter into long-term
28 agreements and contracts with ~~the~~ The University of North Carolina System for the
29 purpose of providing for the establishment and operation of a child development
30 research and demonstration center. The Board is additionally authorized to lease or
31 transfer title to real and personal property, including buildings and equipment, with or
32 without compensation, to ~~the~~ The University for this purpose."

35 The agricultural research stations shall be connected with North Carolina State

22 any system, facility, plant, works, instrumentality or other property

- 27 b. For the collection, treatment, purification or disposal of sewage,

- 31 d. In providing communication facilities including telephone
32 facilities;
- 33 e. In providing storage, service, repair and duplicating facilities;
- 34 f. In improving, extending or adding to the University Enterprises

37 needs of the students, the staff or the physical plant of the
38 University; and including all plants, works, appurtenances,
39 machinery, equipment and properties, both personal and real,
40 used or useful in connection therewith;
- 41 and in the case of the telephone, electric and water systems comprising a part of the
42 University Enterprises such additions, extensions, improvements or betterments thereof
43 as may be necessary or desirable, in the discretion of the Board, to provide service from
44 such systems, where it may be reasonably made available, within the environs of the

1 The University, including, without limitation, areas presently served by the University
2 Enterprises in Orange, Durham and Chatham Counties.

3 (5) 'Revenue bonds' or 'bonds' means bonds of ~~the~~ The University issued
4 by the Board to pay the cost, in whole or in part, of any project
5 pursuant to this Part and the bond resolution or resolutions of the
6 Board; provided, however, that bonds, issued as a separate series
7 which are stated to mature not later than 20 years from their date may
8 be designated 'revenue notes' or 'notes';

9 (6) 'Revenues' means the income and receipts derived by or for the
10 account of ~~the~~ The University through the charging and collection of
11 service charges;

12 (7) 'Service charges' means rates, fees, rentals or other charges for, or for
13 the right to, the use, occupancy, services or commodities of or
14 furnished by any project, or by any other service or auxiliary facility of
15 the University, including the University Enterprises, any part of the
16 income of which is pledged to the payment of the bonds or the interest
17 thereon;

18 (8) 'University' means the body politic and corporate known and
19 distinguished by the corporate name of ~~the~~ 'University' 'The
20 University of North Carolina System' under G.S. 116-3;

21 (9) 'University Enterprises' means the following existing facilities,
22 systems, properties, plants, works and instrumentalities located in or
23 near the Town of Chapel Hill, North Carolina, presently in the
24 jurisdiction of and operated by the University; the telephone, electric,
25 heating and water systems, the laundry, Carolina Inn, service and
26 repair shops, the duplicating shop, bookstores and student supply
27 stores, and rental housing properties for faculty members."

28 Sec. 35. G.S. 116-41.5 reads as rewritten:

29 "**§ 116-41.5. Contents of resolution authorizing issuance; powers liberally**
30 **construed; deposit and use of revenues; rights and remedies of**
31 **bondholders; service charges; insurance of projects; depositaries.**

32 The Board in the resolution authorizing the issuance of bonds under this Part may
33 provide for a pledge to the payment of such revenue bonds and the interest thereon of
34 the revenue derived from the project and also for a pledge of the revenues derived from
35 any system, facility, plant, works, instrumentalities or properties improved, bettered, or
36 extended by the project or otherwise within the jurisdiction of or operated by the
37 University in connection with the University of North ~~Carolina at Chapel Hill, Carolina,~~
38 ~~North Carolina,~~ the revenues derived from any future improvements, betterments or
39 extensions of the project, the revenues derived from the University Enterprises, or any
40 part thereof, or the revenues from the project and any or all of the revenues mentioned
41 in this sentence, without regard to whether the operations involved are deemed
42 governmental or proprietary, it being the purpose hereof to vest in the Board broad
43 powers which shall be liberally construed. So long as any revenues of the University
44 mentioned in this paragraph are pledged for the payment of the principal of or interest

1 on any bonds issued hereunder, such revenues shall be deposited in a special fund and
2 shall be applied and used only as provided in the resolution authorizing such bonds,
3 subject, however, to any prior pledge or encumbrance thereof.

4 The resolution authorizing the issuance of the bonds may contain provisions for
5 protecting and enforcing the rights and remedies of the holders of the bonds, including
6 covenants setting forth the duties of the University in relation to the construction of any
7 project to be financed with the proceeds of said bonds, and to the maintenance, repair,
8 operation and insurance of such project or any other project, systems, facilities, plants,
9 works, instrumentalities, properties, the University Enterprises or any part thereof, if the
10 revenues thereof are in any way pledged as security for the bonds; the fixing and
11 revising of service charges and the collection thereof; and the custody, safeguarding and
12 application of all moneys of the University pertaining to the project and the bonds, and
13 all revenues pledged therefor. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law, the
14 Board may carry insurance on any such project in such amounts and covering such risks
15 as it may deem advisable. It shall be lawful for any bank or trust company incorporated
16 under the laws of the State of North Carolina which may act as depository of the
17 proceeds of bonds or of revenues to furnish such indemnifying bonds or to pledge such
18 securities as may be required by the Board. Such resolution may set forth the rights and
19 remedies of the bondholders and may restrict the individual right of action by
20 bondholders. Such resolution may contain such other provisions in addition to the
21 foregoing as the Board may deem reasonable and proper for the security of the
22 bondholders.

23 The Board may provide for the payment of the proceeds of the bonds and any
24 revenues pledged therefor to such officer, board or depository as it may designate for
25 the custody thereof, and for the method of disbursement thereof, with such safeguards
26 and restrictions as it may determine. All expenses incurred in carrying out the
27 provisions of such resolution may be treated as a part of the cost of operation."

28 Sec. 36. G.S. 116-41.18 reads as rewritten:

29 **"§ 116-41.18. Distinguished Professors Endowment Trust Fund; selection of**
30 **Distinguished Professors.**

31 Each constituent institution that receives, through private gifts and an allocation by
32 the Board of Governors, funds for the purpose shall, under procedures established by
33 rules of the Board of Governors and the board of trustees of the constituent institution,
34 select a holder of the Distinguished Professorship. Once given, that designation shall be

6 The Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina System shall
7 promulgate rules to implement this Part."

8 Sec. 38. G.S. 116-43.1 reads as rewritten:

9 **"§ 116-43.1. Institute for Transportation Research and Education.**

10 The Board of Governors of ~~the~~The University of North Carolina System is
11 authorized to establish an Institute for Transportation Research and Education to
12 facilitate the development of a broad program of transportation research and education
13 involving other organizations and institutions which have related programs. The
14 immediate purpose of the Institute shall be to create a management structure to
15 coordinate and eventually merge the Highway Safety Programs of the National Driving
16 Center and the North Carolina Highway Safety Research Center. The Board of
17 Governors of ~~the~~The University of North Carolina System is further authorized to
18 establish a Council for Transportation Research and Education to represent all interests
19 in transportation research and education, including but not limited to transportation
20 safety."

27 (2) 'Campus' means that University property, without regard to location,
28 which is used wholly or partly for the purposes of a particular

31 (3) 'University' means a constituent institution as defined in G.S. 116-2.
32 (4) 'University property' means property that is owned or leased in whole

36 Sec. 40. G.S. 116-44.4 reads as rewritten:

37 **"§ 116-44.4. Regulation of traffic and parking and registration of motor vehicles.**

38 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this Part, all of the provisions of Chapter 20
39 of the General Statutes relating to the use of highways of the State and the operation of
40 motor vehicles thereon are applicable to all streets, alleys, driveways, parking lots, and
41 parking structures on University property. Nothing in this section modifies any rights of
42 ownership or control of University property, now or hereafter vested in the Board of
43 Governors of ~~the~~The University of North Carolina System or the State of North
44 Carolina.

1 (b) Each board of trustees may by ordinance prohibit, regulate, divert, control,
2 and limit pedestrian or vehicular traffic and the parking of motor vehicles and other
3 modes of conveyance on the campus. In fixing speed limits, the board of trustees is not
4 subject to G.S. 20-141(f1) or (g2), but may fix any speed limit reasonable and safe
5 under the circumstances as conclusively determined by the board of trustees. The board
6 of trustees may not regulate traffic on streets open to the public as of right, except as
7 specifically provided in this Part.

8 (c) Each board of trustees may by ordinance provide for the registration of motor
9 vehicles maintained or operated on the campus by any student, faculty member, or
10 employee of the University, and may fix fees for such registration. The ordinance may
11 make it unlawful for any person to operate an unregistered motor vehicle on the campus
12 when the vehicle is required by the ordinance to be registered.

13 (d) Each board of trustees may by ordinance set aside parking lots and other
14 parking facilities on the campus for use by students, faculty, and employees of the
15 University and members of the general public attending schools, conferences, or
16 meetings at the University, visiting or making use of any University facilities, or
17 attending to official business with the University. The board of trustees may issue
18 permits to park in these lots and garages and may charge a fee therefor. The board of
19 trustees may also by ordinance make it unlawful for any person to park a motor vehicle
20 in any lot or other parking facility without procuring the requisite permit and displaying
21 it on the vehicle.

22 (e) Each board of trustees may by ordinance set aside spaces in designated
23 parking areas or facilities in which motor vehicles may be parked for specified periods
24 of time. To regulate parking in such spaces, the board of trustees may install a system of
25 parking meters and make it unlawful for any person to park a motor vehicle in a metered
26 space without activating the meter for the entire time that the vehicle is parked, up to the
27 maximum length of time allowed for that space. The meters may be activated by coins
28 of the United States. The board of trustees may also install automatic gates, employ
29 attendants, and use any other device or procedure to control access to and collect the
30 fees for using its parking areas and facilities.

31 (f) The board of trustees may by ordinance provide for the issuance of stickers,
32 decals, permits, or other indicia representing the registration status of vehicles or the
33 eligibility of vehicles to park on the campus and may by ordinance prohibit the forgery,
34 counterfeiting, unauthorized transfer, or unauthorized use of them.

35 (g) Violation of an ordinance adopted under any portion of this Part is an
36 infraction as defined in G.S. 14-3.1 and is punishable by a penalty of not more than fifty
37 dollars (\$50.00). An ordinance may provide that certain prohibited acts shall not be
38 infractions and in such cases the provisions of subsection (h) may be used to enforce the
39 ordinance.

40 (h) An ordinance adopted under any portion of this Part may provide that
41 violation subjects the offender to a civil penalty. Penalties may be graduated according
42 to the seriousness of the offense or the number of prior offenses by the person charged.
43 Each board of trustees may establish procedures for the collection of these penalties and
44 they may be enforced by civil action in the nature of debt. The board of trustees may

1 also provide for appropriate administrative sanctions if an offender does not pay a
2 validly due penalty or upon repeated offenses. Appropriate administrative sanctions
3 include, but are not limited to, revocation of parking permits, termination of vehicle
4 registration, and termination or suspension of enrollment in or employment by the
5 University.

6 (i) An ordinance adopted under any portion of this Part may provide that any
7 vehicle illegally parked may be removed to a storage area. Regardless of whether a
8 constituent institution does its own removal and disposal of motor vehicles or contracts
9 with another person to do so, the institution shall provide a hearing procedure for the
10 owner. For purposes of this subsection, the definitions in G.S. 20-219.9 apply.

11 (1) If the institution operates in such a way that the person who tows the
12 vehicle is responsible for collecting towing fees, all provisions of
13 Article 7A, Chapter 20, apply.

14 (2) If the institution operates in such a way that it is responsible for
15 collecting towing fees, it shall:

16 a. Provide by contract or ordinance for a schedule of reasonable
17 towing fees,

18 b. Provide a procedure for a prompt fair hearing to contest the
19 towing,

20 c. Provide for an appeal to district court from that hearing,

21 d. Authorize release of the vehicle at any time after towing by the
22 posting of a bond or paying of the fees due, and

23 e. If the institution chooses to enforce its authority by sale of the
24 vehicle, provide a sale procedure similar to that provided in
25 G.S. 44A-4, 44A-5, and 44A-6, except that no hearing in
26 addition to the probable cause hearing is required. If no one
27 purchases the vehicle at the sale and if the value of the vehicle
28 is less than the amount of the lien, the institution may destroy it.

29 (j) Evidence that a motor vehicle was found parked or unattended in violation of
30 an ordinance of the board of trustees is prima facie evidence that the vehicle was parked
31 by:

32 (1) The person holding a University parking permit for the vehicle, or

33 (2) If no University parking permit has been issued for the vehicle, the
34 person in whose name the vehicle is registered with the University
35 pursuant to subsection (c), or

36 (3) If no University parking permit has been issued for the vehicle and the
37 vehicle is not registered with the University, the person in whose name
38 it is registered with the North Carolina Division of Motor Vehicles or
39 the corresponding agency of another state or nation.

40 The rule of evidence established by this subsection applies only in civil, criminal, or
41 administrative actions or proceedings concerning violations of ordinances of the board
42 of trustees. G.S. 20-162.1 does not apply to such actions or proceedings.

43 (k) Each board of trustees shall cause to be posted appropriate notice to the
44 public of applicable traffic and parking restrictions.

1 (l) All ordinances adopted under this Part shall be recorded in the minutes of the
2 board of trustees and copies thereof shall be filed in the offices of the President of ~~the~~
3 The University of North Carolina System and the Secretary of State. Each board of
4 trustees shall provide for printing and distributing copies of its traffic and parking
5 ordinances.

6 (m) All moneys received pursuant to this Part shall be placed in a trust account in
7 each constituent institution and may be used for any of the following purposes:

- 8 (1) To defray the cost of administering and enforcing ordinances adopted
9 under this Part;
- 10 (2) To develop, maintain, and supervise parking areas and facilities;
- 11 (3) To provide bus service or other transportation systems and facilities,
12 including payments to any public or private transportation system
13 serving University students, faculty, or employees;
- 14 (4) As a pledge to secure revenue bonds for parking facilities issued under
15 Article 21 of this Chapter;
- 16 (5) Other purposes related to parking, traffic, and transportation on the
17 campus."

18 Sec. 41. The catch line of G.S. 116-44.5 reads as rewritten:

19 "**§ 116-44.5. Special provisions applicable to identified constituent institutions of**
20 **the The University of North Carolina- Carolina System.**"

21 Sec. 42. G.S. 116-44.5(1) reads as rewritten:

22 "(1) The Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina ~~at Chapel~~
23 ~~Hill~~ may by ordinance prohibit, regulate, and limit the parking of
24 motor vehicles on those portions of the following public streets in the
25 Town of Chapel Hill where parking is not prohibited by an ordinance
26 of the Town of Chapel Hill:

1 In addition, the Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina
 2 at ~~Chapel Hill~~ may regulate traffic on Cameron Avenue, between
 3 Raleigh Street and South Columbia Street, and on Raleigh Street, in
 4 any manner not inconsistent with ordinances of the Town of Chapel
 5 Hill."

6 Sec. 43. G.S. 116-49 reads as rewritten:

7 **"§ 116-49. Definitions.**

8 As used herein:

- 9 (1) The term 'community college' is defined to be an educational
 10 institution
 11 a. Dedicated primarily to the particular needs of a community or
 12 an area,
 13 b. Offering the freshman and sophomore courses of a college of
 14 arts and sciences and/or the first- and second-year courses of a
 15 two-year technical institute of college grade, and

24 **"§ 116-65. To be part of The University of North ~~Carolina~~; Carolina System;**
 25 **membership of Board of Trustees.**

26 The North Carolina School of Arts is a part of ~~the~~The University of North Carolina
 27 System and subject to the provisions of Article 1, Chapter 116, of the General Statutes;
 28 provided, however, that notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 116-31, the Board of
 29 Trustees of said school shall consist of 15 persons, 13 of whom are selected in
 30 accordance with provisions of G.S. 116-31, and the conductor of the North Carolina
 31 Symphony and the Secretary of the Department of Cultural Resources, both serving ex
 32 officio and nonvoting."

33 Sec. 45. G.S. 116-66 reads as rewritten:

34 **"§ 116-66. Powers of various boards.**

35 The Board of Governors of ~~the~~The University of North Carolina System and the
 36 Board of Trustees of the school shall be advised and assisted by the State Board of
 37 Education. Entrance requirements shall be prescribed so that the professional training
 38 offered shall be available only to those students who possess exceptional talent in the
 39 performing arts. In developing curricula the school shall utilize, pursuant to agreement

5 school shall preferably be a noted composer or dramatist."

6 Sec. 46. G.S. 116-73 reads as rewritten:

7 **"§ 116-73. Joint committee for administration of fund; rules and regulations.**

8 'The Scholarship Loan Fund for Prospective College Teachers' shall be the
9 responsibility of the Board of Governors of ~~the~~ The University of North Carolina
10 System and the State Board of Education and will be administered by them through a
11 joint committee, 'The College Scholarship Loan Committee.' This Committee will
12 operate under the following rules and regulations and under such further rules and
13 regulations as the Board of Governors of ~~the~~ The University of North Carolina System
14 and the State Board of Education shall jointly promulgate.

- 15 (1) The nomination of applicants and recommendations of renewals shall

24 interest at the rate of four percent (4%) per annum from and after
25 September 1 following the awarding of the candidate's degree.
- 26 (4) Recipients of loans may have them repaid by teaching in a college or
27 other educational institution beyond the high school level in North
28 Carolina upon completion of their masters or doctorate degree
29 program, at the rate of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per month for
30 each month of such teaching. If a student supported by a loan in this
31 program should fail to so teach in a North Carolina institution, the loan
32 would become repayable to the State, with interest, for that part of the
33 teaching commitment not met, said note to be repaid according to the
34 terms thereof.
- 35 (5) Loans for 12 weeks of summer study, carrying stipends not to exceed
36 five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for single and married students, should
37 be available to students who do not plan to attend postgraduate school
38 as full-time students during the regular academic year. Recipients
39 should be eligible for up to three renewals over a four-year period. The
40 obligation to teach in a North Carolina college or other educational
41 institution, or failing that, to repay the State, shall apply proportionally
42 as indicated above."

43 Sec. 47. G.S. 116-74.6 reads as rewritten:

1 **"§ 116-74.6. North Carolina Center for the Advancement of Teaching established;**
2 **powers and duties of trustees.**

3 The sums of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) in fiscal year 1985-86 and
4 two million dollars (\$2,000,000) in fiscal year 1986-87 that are appropriated to the
5 Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina System in Section 2 of the
6 1985-87 Current Operations Appropriations Act shall be used to establish the North
7 Carolina Center for the Advancement of Teaching at Western Carolina University in
8 Jackson County. The Center shall operate under the general auspices of The University
9 of North Carolina System Board of Governors. It shall be the function of the North
10 Carolina Center for the Advancement of Teaching (hereinafter called 'NCCAT'),
11 through itself or agencies with which it may contract, to provide career teachers with
12 opportunities to study advanced topics in the sciences, arts, and humanities and to
13 engage in informed discourse, assisted by able mentors and outstanding leaders from all
14 walks of life; and otherwise to offer opportunity for teachers to engage in scholarly
15 pursuits, through a center dedicated exclusively to the advancement of teaching as an art
16 and as a profession.

17 The Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina System shall establish
18 the North Carolina Center for the Advancement of Teaching Board of Trustees and shall
19 delegate to the Board of Trustees all the powers and duties the Board of Governors
20 considers necessary or appropriate for the effective discharge of the functions of
21 NCCAT."

22 Sec. 48. G.S. 116-74.7 reads as rewritten:

23 **"§ 116-74.7. Composition of board of trustees; terms; officers.**

24 (a) The NCCAT Board of Trustees shall be composed of the following
25 membership:

- 26 (1) Three ex officio members: the President of The University of North
27 ~~Carolina~~, Carolina System, the State Superintendent of Public
28 Instruction, and the Chancellor of Western Carolina University;
29 (2) Two members appointed by the General Assembly upon the

41 The chief administrative officer of NCCAT shall be a director, who shall be
42 appointed by the NCCAT Board of Trustees."

43 Sec. 49. G.S. 116-143 reads as rewritten:

1 **"§ 116-143. State-supported institutions of higher education required to charge**
2 **tuition and fees.**

3 The Board of Governors of ~~the~~The University of North Carolina System shall fix
4 the tuition and fees, not inconsistent with actions of the General Assembly, at the
5 institutions enumerated in G.S. 116-4 in such amount or amounts as it may deem best,
6 taking into consideration the nature of each institution and program of study and the
7 cost of equipment and maintenance; and each institution shall charge and collect from
8 each student, at the beginning of each semester or quarter, tuition, fees, and an amount
9 sufficient to pay other expenses for the term.

10 In the event that said students are unable to pay the cost of tuition and required
11 academic fees as the same may become due, in cash, the said several boards of trustees
12 are hereby authorized and empowered, in their discretion, to accept the obligation of the
13 student or students together with such collateral or security as they may deem necessary
14 and proper, it being the purpose of this Article that all students in State institutions of
15 higher learning shall be required to pay tuition, and that free tuition is hereby abolished.

12 System, and the Director of the Budget, and any enlargements or
13 improvements thereof or additions thereto, so approved for the housing
14 of students at either institution, together with the necessary land and
15 equipment. The approval of a project by the Board of Governors of ~~the~~
16 The University of North Carolina System and the Director of the
17 Budget shall specify a time within which construction contracts shall
18 be awarded."

- 26 (12) The Superintendent of Public Instruction, ex officio;
- 27 (13) The President of ~~the~~ The University of North ~~Carolina,~~ Carolina
28 System, ex officio;
- 29 (14) The President of the Department of Community Colleges, ex officio;
30 and
- 31 (15) Two members ex officio who shall rotate from among the remaining
32 heads of departments enumerated in G.S. 143A-11 or G.S. 143B-6,
33 appointed by the Governor.

34 The 10 at-large members shall serve for terms staggered as follows: four terms shall
35 expire on June 30, 1980; and three terms shall expire on June 30, 1982; and three terms
36 shall expire on June 30, 1984. Thereafter, the members at large shall be appointed for
37 full four-year terms and until their successors are appointed and qualified. In making
38 appointments of members at large, the Governor shall seek to appoint persons from the

31 and to governmental officials, agencies and departments and to other educational
32 institutions, in the discretion of the issuing official and subject to the supply available,
33 such number as may be requested: Provided that five sets of all such reports, bulletins
34 and publications heretofore issued, insofar as the same are available and without
35 necessitating reprinting, shall be furnished to the North Carolina Central University.
36 The provisions in this section shall not be interpreted to include any of the appellate
37 division reports or advance sheets distributed by the Administrative Office of the
38 Courts. Except for reports, bulletins, and other publications issued for free distribution,
39 this section shall not apply to the Museum of Natural History."

40 Sec. 72. G.S. 147-54 reads as rewritten:

41 **"§ 147-54. Printing, distribution and sale of the North Carolina Manual.**

42 The Secretary of State shall have printed biennially for distribution and sale, five
43 thousand (5,000) copies of the North Carolina Manual, and shall make distribution to
44 the State agencies, individuals, institutions and others as herein set forth."
