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1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO AMEND THE EMPLOYMENT SECURITY LAW PERTAINING TO
3	THE REMOVAL OF DISQUALIFICATION FOR UNEMPLOYMENT
4	INSURANCE BENEFITS.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. G.S. 96-14(10) reads as rewritten:
7	"(10) Any employee disqualified for the duration of his unemployment
8	due to the provisions of (1), (2), (2B), (3), (4), or (6A) above may
9	have that permanent disqualification removed if he meets the
10	following three conditions:
11	a. Returns to work for at least five weeks and is paid cumulative
12	wages of at least 10 times his weekly benefit amount;
13	b. Subsequently becomes unemployed through no fault of his
14	own; and
15	c. Meets the availability requirements of the law.
16	Any disqualification imposed by the provisions of subsection (2A)
17	may be removed as provided by this subsection.
18	Provided for good cause shown the Commission in its discretion
19	may as to any permanent disqualification provided in this Chapter
20	reduce the disqualification period to a time certain but not less than
21	five weeks. For purposes of this subdivision good cause shall include a
22	claimant's leaving work in order to accompany the claimant's spouse to
23	a new place of residence where that spouse has secured work in a
24	location which is too far removed for the claimant to continue his or

	her work. The maximum amount of benefits due any individual whose
2	permanent disqualification is changed to a time certain shall be
3	reduced by an amount determined by multiplying the number of weeks
ļ	of disqualification by the weekly benefit amount.
5	Provided further, any permanent disqualification pursuant to the
6	provisions of (1), (2), (3), (4), or (6A) shall terminate two years after
7	the effective date of the beginning of said disqualification."
3	Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification and applies to claims filed on or
)	after that date.
