13 experience the Board declares is comparable to a period of
14 training as an administrator; and

16 designed to test for competence in the subject matters referred
17 to in paragraph c of this subdivision.

- 19 (3) A temporary license may be issued under requirements and conditions
20 prescribed by the Board to any person to act or serve as administrator
21 of a nursing home without meeting the requirements for full licensure,
22 but only when there are unusual circumstances preventing compliance
23 with the procedures for licensing elsewhere provided by this Article.
24 The temporary license shall be issued by the chairman only for the
25 period prior to the next meeting of the Board, at which time the Board
26 may renew such temporary license for a further period only up to one
27 year."
