1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO REQUIRE A FISCAL NOTE FOR ANY LEGISLATION
3	INTRODUCED THAT REASONABLY APPEARS TO HAVE AN ANNUAL
4	FISCAL IMPACT OF ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS OR MORE ON THE
5	STATE'S BUDGET.
6	Whereas, the State of North Carolina is required to develop a balanced budget
7	before adjournment of the legislature; and
8	Whereas, the scrutiny, verification, and updating of the continuation budget is
9	a very important aspect of keeping a balanced budget for each year; and
10	Whereas, the "creeping" increase in the cost of living is a factor that must be
11	dealt with each year; and
12	Whereas, the additional "creeping" increase of the cost to the State is brought
13	about by each legislative bill and resolution that is introduced and passed that uses State
14	resources for the implementation, administration, judicial consideration, and
15	enforcement of new laws; Now, therefore,
16	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
17	Section 1. G.S. 120-36.7 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
18	"(e) Proposed Legislation With Annual Fiscal Impact of One Thousand Dollars or
19	More Every bill and resolution introduced in the General Assembly that reasonably
20	appears to have an annual fiscal impact of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more on the
21	State's budget shall have attached to it at the time of its consideration by the General
22	Assembly a fiscal note prepared by the Fiscal Research Division.
23	The primary sponsor of each bill or resolution to which this subsection applies shall
24	present a copy of the bill or resolution with the request for a fiscal note to the Fiscal

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1	Research Division. Upon receipt of the request and the copy of the bill or resolution,
2	the Fiscal Research Division shall prepare the fiscal note as promptly as possible. The
3	Fiscal Research Division shall prepare the fiscal note and transmit it along with the
4	assumptions and methodology, sources of data, and technical considerations used in the
5	preparation of the fiscal note to the primary sponsor within one week after the request is
6	made, unless the primary sponsor agrees to an extension of time.
7	This fiscal note shall be attached to the original of each proposed bill or resolution
8	that is reported favorably by any committee of the General Assembly, but shall be
9	separate from the bill or resolution and shall be clearly designated as a fiscal note. A
10	fiscal note attached to a bill or resolution pursuant to this subsection is not a part of the
11	bill or resolution and is not an expression of legislative intent proposed by the bill or
12	resolution.
13	If a committee of the General Assembly reports favorably a proposed bill or
14	resolution with an amendment that would reasonably appear to have an annual fiscal
15	impact of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more on the State's budget, the chair of the
16	committee shall obtain from the Fiscal Research Division and attach to the amended bill
17	or resolution a fiscal note as provided in this section."
18	Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General
19	Assembly the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for the 1993-94 fiscal year for
20	staff support needed to implement this act.
21	Sec. 3. Section 2 of this act becomes effective July 1, 1993. Section 1 of this
22	act is effective beginning with fiscal estimates addressing the 1994-95 fiscal year. The
22	noncoindon of this act is affective up on notification

23 remainder of this act is effective upon ratification.
