4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. Chapter 130A of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
6	Article to read:
7	" <u>ARTICLE 20.</u>
8	<u>''LEAD HAZARD MANAGEMENT PROGRAM.</u>
9	" <u>§ 130A-460. Definitions.</u>
10	As used in this Article, unless the context indicates otherwise:
11	(1) 'Deleading' means activities conducted by a person who offers to
12	eliminate lead-based paint or lead-based paint hazards or to plan such
13	activities.
14	(2) 'Lead abatement activities' means any set of measures designed to
15	permanently eliminate lead-based paint hazards.
16	(3) 'Lead-based paint' means paint or other surface coatings that contain
17	lead:
18	a. In excess of 1.0 milligrams per centimeter squared or five
19	tenths percent (.5%) by weight;
20	b. In the case of paint or other surface coatings on target housing
21	at a lower level as established by the United States Secretary o
22	Housing and Urban Development; or

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1		c. <u>At a level as established by the administrator of the United</u>
2	$(\mathbf{A})$	States Environmental Protection Agency.
3	<u>(4)</u>	'Lead-based paint activities' means the identification, inspection, risk-
4		assessment, abatement, and demolition of lead-based paint or materials
5		containing lead-based paint in target housing, public buildings
6		constructed before 1978, commercial buildings, bridges, or other
7		nonresidential structures or superstructures.
8	<u>(5)</u>	'Lead-based paint hazard' means any condition that causes exposure to
9		lead from lead-contaminated dust, soil, or lead-contaminated paint that
10		is deteriorated or present in accessible surfaces, friction surfaces, or
11		impact surfaces that would result in adverse effects to human health, as
12		determined by the Commission.
13	<u>(6)</u>	'Lead Exposure Reduction Act' or 'LER' means the Lead-Based Paint
14		Exposure Reduction Act, Pub. L. No. 102-550, 106 Stat. 3672, 3912-
15		<u>24 (1992).</u>
16	(7)	<u>'Person' means as defined in G.S. 130A-313(9).</u>
17	<u>(8)</u>	<u>'Target housing' means any housing constructed prior to 1978, unless</u>
18		the housing is for the elderly or persons with disabilities. However,
19		target housing does include housing constructed prior to 1978 for the
20		elderly or persons with disabilities if any child less than six years of
21		age resides or is expected to reside in this housing. Target housing
22		does not include any dwelling with no bedrooms.

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1	(a) The Department shall establish and collect annual lead certification fees and a
2	lead examination fee. These fees shall be used to support the Lead Hazard Management
3	Program. The annual certification fees shall not exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00)
4	for each certified person per category. The examination fee shall not exceed seventy-
5	five dollars (\$75.00).
6	(b) The Department shall establish and collect fees for the initial accreditation
7	and annual accreditation of lead training courses. These fees shall be used to support
8	the Lead Hazard Management Program. The fees shall not exceed one thousand five
9	hundred dollars (\$1,500) for initial accreditation and shall not exceed five hundred
10	dollars (\$500.00) for annual reaccreditation.

12	Reduction Grant from United States Housing and Urban Development, Category I.
