#### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE
UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA TO BE USED BY THE UNIVERSITY
OF NORTH CAROLINA AT CHAPEL HILL AS PLANNING FUNDS FOR
CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AT THE SCHOOL OF LAW AND THE
INSTITUTE OF GOVERNMENT.

7 Whereas, the School of Law and the Institute of Government at the 8 University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill need funding for planning capital 9 improvements; and

10 Whereas, in order to continue to compete with its peer institutions, UNC's 11 School of Law needs to upgrade its physical facilities; and

Whereas, among the needs of the School of Law are additional small and mid-size classrooms, space for private and group study and library functions, office space to accommodate additional permanent and adjunct faculty, and improved lighting and wiring for up-to-date technological needs; and

Whereas, the inadequacy of the facilities at the School of Law has resulted in a lower national ranking and criticism by the American Bar Association in its reaccreditation review; and

Whereas, the students at the School of Law have agreed to pay a substantial fee and the school's alumni have contributed to the support of the school; Now, therefore,
