A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR A LEGISLATIVE STUDY OF THE IMPACT OF INCREASING UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS AND DECREASING THE UNEMPLOYMENT TAX, AND TO INCREASE THE WEEKLY UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFIT AMOUNT AND DURATION FOR ELIGIBLE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE CLAIMANTS.
