A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE GENERAL STATUTES 3 PERTAINING TO IMMUNIZATIONS. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: G.S. 130A-153 is amended by adding the following new 5 Section 1. 6 subsections to read: "§ 130A-153. Obtaining immunization; reporting by local health departments. 7 departments; access to immunization information in patient records; 8 immunization of minors. 9 The required immunization may be obtained from a physician licensed to 10 (a) practice medicine or from a local health department. Local health departments shall 11 administer the required immunizations at no cost to the patient. The Department shall 12 provide the vaccines for use by the local health departments. A local health department 13 may redistribute these vaccines only in accordance with the rules of the Commission. 14 Local health departments shall file monthly immunization reports with the 15 (b)Department. The report shall be filed on forms prepared by the Department and shall 16 state each patient's age and the number of doses of each type of vaccine administered. 17 Immunization certificates and information concerning immunizations 18 (c) contained in medical or other records shall, upon request, be shared with the 19 Department, local health departments, and the patient's attending physician. In addition, 20 an insurance institution, agent, or insurance support organization, as those terms are 21 defined in G.S. 58-39-15, may share immunization information with the Department. 22 The Commission may, for the purpose of assisting the Department in enforcing this 23

2	in whole or in part.
3	(d) A physician or local health department may immunize a minor with the
4	consent of a parent, guardian, or person standing in loco parentis to the minor. A
5	physician or local health department may also immunize a minor who is presented for
6	immunization by an adult who states that he or she is authorized by a parent, guardian,
7	or person standing in loco parentis to the minor to obtain the immunization for the
8	<u>minor.</u> "
9	Sec. 2. G.S. 58-39-75 is amended by adding the following new subdivision
10	to read:
11	"(20) To the Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources and
12	the information disclosed is immunization information described in
13	<u>G.S. 130A-153.</u> "
14	Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.
