March 25, 1993 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO ESTABLISH STANDARDS AND APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE PROVISION OF HEALTH CARE SERVICES TO CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL HEALTH CARE NEEDS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 115C-12 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: "(21) Power to set standards for the provision of special health care services. - The Board shall adopt standards for the provision of health care services in the school setting to children with special health care needs. The standards shall: Ensure that safe care is provided to these children by assuring a. that a registered nurse is available to (i) assess, (ii) plan for the care of including identifying appropriate persons to perform the care, (iii) provide ongoing monitoring and evaluation of all

children with special health care needs, and (iv) supervise

implement the standards and to document any required training

4	Special health care services include procedures that are invasive,
5	carry reasonable risk of harm if not performed correctly, may not have
6	a predictable outcome, and may require additional action based on

8	Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
9	Public Education, Aid to Local School Administrative Units, the sum of four million
10	seven hundred seventy-nine thousand five hundred seventy-nine dollars (\$4,779,579)
11	for the 1993-94 fiscal year and the sum of four million seven hundred seventy-nine
12	thousand five hundred seventy-nine dollars (\$4,779,579) for the 1994-95 fiscal year to
13	provide the services of a registered nurse in each local school administrative unit to
14	ensure that the special health care needs of children are met. These funds shall be
15	allocated to local school administrative units on a dollar amount basis and may be used
16	to hire personnel or to contract for services.

Sec. 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1993.
