5	Section 1. Article 4 of Chapter 147 of the General Statutes is amended by		
6	adding the following new section to read:		
7	"§ 147-54.4. Certification of local government property mappers.		
8	<u>(a)</u> Defi	nitions. – The following definitions apply in this section:	
9	<u>(1)</u>	<u>Department. – The Department of the Secretary of State.</u>	
10	<u>(2)</u>	Large-scale A scale that uses an inch to represent no more than 400	
11		<u>feet.</u>	
12	<u>(3)</u>	Local government. – A county as defined in G.S. 153A-10 and a city	
13		as defined in G.S. 160A-1.	
14	<u>(4)</u>	Property mapper A person who is employed by a local government	
15		and is responsible for creating and maintaining large-scale cadastral	
16		<u>maps.</u>	
17	(b) <u>Certi</u>	fication The Department shall establish a certification program for	
18	property mapp	ers. The purpose of the program is to protect and enhance the State's	
19	investment in	local government large-scale cadastral maps. To be certified as a	
20	property mapper, an applicant must meet the following minimum requirements and the		
21	additional requ	irements set by the Department:	
22	<u>(1)</u>	Be at least 18 years old.	
23	<u>(2)</u>	Hold a high school diploma or certificate of equivalency.

8	ensure that an applicant who is certified as a property mapper has the minimum skills		
o 9	necessary to create and maintain large-scale cadastral maps. In establishing these

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19	(d) Application and Fees. – An applicant for certification as a property mapper or		
20	renewal of certification as a property mapper must file an application with the		
21	Department. The applicant must submit a fee of twenty dollars (\$20.00) with the		
22	application. Fees collected under this section shall be credited to the General Fund.		
23	(e) <u>Rules. – The Department may adopt rules to implement this section</u> . Chapter		
24	150B of the General Statutes governs the adoption of rules by the Department."		
25	Sec. 2. A person who has attained certification as a property mapper through		
26	the North Carolina Property Mappers' Association as of January 1, 1994, may apply to		
27	the Department of the Secretary of State at any time before July 1, 1994, for		
28	certification as a property mapper without meeting the requirements of G.S. 147-54.4,		
29	as enacted by this act. Upon application and payment of the fee required by G.S. 147-		
30	54.4, as enacted by this act, the person shall be certified by the Department as a property		
31	mapper.		
32	Sec. 3. This act becomes effective January 1, 1994.
