2	AN ACT TO STRENGTHEN THE REQUIREMENTS TO HAVE A CHILD IN A
3	RESTRAINT SYSTEM WHILE OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. G.S. 20-137.1 reads as rewritten:
6	"§ 20-137.1. Child restraint systems required.
7	(a) Every driver who is transporting a child of less than six- <u>12</u> years of age shall
8	have the child properly secured in a child passenger restraint system (car safety seat)
9	which met applicable meets federal standards applicable at the time of its manufacture.
10	The requirements of this section may be met when the child is three four years of age or
11	older by securing the child in a seat safety belt.
12	(b) The provisions of this section shall not apply: (i) to vehicles registered in
13	another state or jurisdiction; (ii)-(i) to ambulances or other emergency vehicles; (iii)-(ii)
14	when the child's personal needs are being attended to; (iv)-(iii) if all seating positions
15	equipped with child passenger restraint systems or seat belts are occupied; or (v) (iv) to
16	vehicles which are not required by federal law or regulation to be equipped with seat
17	belts.
18	(c) Any person convicted of violating this section may be punished by a fine not
19	to exceed twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). No driver charged under this section for failure
20	to have a child under three four years of age properly secured in a restraint system shall

- be convicted if he produces at the time of his trial proof satisfactory to the court that he
 has subsequently acquired an approved child passenger restraint system.
- 3 (d) No driver license points or insurance points shall be assessed for a violation
- 4 of this section; nor shall a violation constitute negligence per se or contributory
- 5 negligence **per se** nor shall it be evidence of negligence or contributory negligence."
- 6 Sec. 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 1994.
