A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE EXPANSION OF THE CORRECTION ENTERPRISES PROGRAM.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Correction the sum of ten million eight hundred ten thousand four hundred thirty dollars (\$10,810,430) for the 1994-95 fiscal year to expand the Correction Enterprises Program to ensure participation by all inmates who would benefit from the skills training provided by the program. These funds shall be allocated as follows:

- (1) \$2,222,500 for the Pender furniture refurbishing plant;
- (2) \$1,654,500 for the Brown Creek sewing and tailoring plant;
 - (3) \$3,183,500 for Broughton Laundry;
 - (4) \$378,350 for private sector reserve building number 1 at Marion;
- 14 (5) \$1,396,100 for the mattress, athletic equipment, and reupholstering facility at Lumberton;
 - (6) \$321,780 for expansion of the janitorial products plant at Harnett;
 - (7) \$316,560 for expansion of the cannery plant at Caledonia;
 - (8) \$318,820 for a modular workstation at Marion:
 - (9) \$264,780 for the reupholstery plant at Johnston;
- 20 (10) \$495,800 for the custom cabinet shop at Marion; and
- 21 (11) \$257,740 for the dairy and processing operation at Caledonia.

The total cost of this expansion will be thirty-nine million five hundred nineteen thousand one hundred dollars (\$39,519,100) over three fiscal years, with fifteen million nine hundred twenty-nine thousand nine hundred ten dollars

- 1 (\$15,929,910) needed in the 1995-96 fiscal year and twelve million seven hundred
- 2 seventy-eight thousand seven hundred sixty dollars (\$12,778,760) needed in the 1996-
- 3 97 fiscal year. The expansion will result in jobs for an additional 1,063 inmates.
- Sec. 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1994.
