1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO REQUIRE THAT NONCERTIFICATED PUBLIC SCHOOL
3	EMPLOYEES BE HIRED ON A CONTINUING CONTRACT.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. G.S. 115C-315 reads as rewritten:
6	"§ 115C-315. Hiring of school personnel.
7	(a) Janitors and Maids. In the city administrative units, janitors and maids shall
8	be appointed by the board of education of such local school administrative unit upon the
9	recommendation of the superintendent. Election of Noncertificated Employees
10	Noncertificated employees shall be elected by the local board of education upon the
11	recommendation of the superintendent, in accordance with G.S. 115C-276(j).
12	(b) Election by Local Boards. School personnel shall be elected by the local
13	board of education upon the recommendation of the superintendent, in accordance with
14	the provisions of G.S. 115C-276(j). Continuing Contracts; Dismissal Noncertificated
15	employees shall be employed on a continuing contract. Dismissal of a noncertificated
16	employee may occur for just cause or loss of funding so long as due process is afforded,
17	including 30 days notice.
18	It is the policy of the State of North Carolina to encourage and provide for the most
19	efficient and cost-effective method of meeting the needs of local school administrative
20	units for noncertified support personnel. To this end, the State Board of Education shall
21	recommend to the General Assembly by November 1, 1984, a system using factors and
22	formulas to determine the total number of noncertified support personnel allotted to
23	local school administrative units. The recommended system for allotting noncertified

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support personnel shall include the proposed State's funding obligation for these
positions and shall be developed in consultation with school-based support personnel or
their representatives.

4 (c) Prerequisites for Employment. – All professional personnel employed in the 5 public schools of the State or in schools receiving public funds shall be required either 6 to hold or be qualified to hold a certificate in compliance with the provision of the law 7 or in accordance with the regulations of the State Board of Education: Provided, that 8 nothing herein shall prevent the employment of temporary personnel under such rules as 9 the State Board of Education may prescribe.

10 (d) Certification for Professional Positions. - The State Board of Education shall have entire control of certifying all applicants for professional positions in all public 11 12 elementary and high schools of North Carolina; and it shall prescribe the rules and 13 regulations for the renewal and extension of all certificates and shall determine and fix 14 the salary for each grade and type of certificate which it authorizes: Provided, that the 15 State Board of Education shall require each applicant for an initial certificate or 16 graduate certificate to demonstrate his or her academic and professional preparation by 17 achieving a prescribed minimum score at least equivalent to that required by the Board on November 30, 1972, on a standard examination appropriate and adequate for that 18 19 purpose: Provided, further, that in the event the Board shall specify the National 20 Teachers Examination for this purpose, the required minimum score shall not be lower 21 than that which the Board required on November 30, 1972.

(f) Employing Persons Not Holding Nor Qualified to Hold Certificate. – It shall
be unlawful for any board of education to employ or keep in service any professional
person who neither holds nor is qualified to hold a certificate in compliance with the
provisions of the law or in accordance with the regulations of the State Board of
Education."

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Sec. 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1993.
