9	program		al government property mappers. The purpose of this program is to
10	protect a	nd enha	nce the State's investment in local government property maps.
11	<u>(b)</u>	As us	sed in this section, unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the
12	term:		
13		<u>(1)</u>	'Cadastre' or 'cadastral' means a map, regardless of the medium on
14			which it is created and maintained, that depicts or displays the
15			boundary lines of the owners of real property; for the purposes of this
16			statute, 'cadastre' or 'cadastral' shall be considered as representing real
17			property boundaries as a tool for taxation, planning, and other general
18			purposes, but shall not be construed as the determination, definition, or
19			survey of boundaries of real property.
20		<u>(2)</u>	'Department' means the Department of the Secretary of State.
21		<u>(3)</u>	'Local government' means a county as defined in G.S. 153A-10 and a
22			city as defined in G.S. 160A-1.
23		<u>(4)</u>	'Property mapper' means any person employed by a local government
24			who has responsibility for the creation and maintenance of large-scale

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1	cadastral maps for the purpose of parcel identifier indexing, ad		
2 3	valorem tax assessment, or the enforcement of zoning and subdivision		
3 4	ordinances or building codes. (c) The Department shall establish certification requirements for property		
4 5	<u>mappers consisting of mapping experience, courses of instruction, examinations, and</u>		
5 6	continuing education designed to develop and maintain the minimum level of skills		
7	necessary for the creation and maintenance of cadastral maps. In establishing the		
8	certification requirements, the Department may consult with the advisory committee		
9	appointed pursuant to G.S. 147-54.3(f), the North Carolina Property Mappers'		
10	Association, and other relevant professional groups. To be certified as a property		
11	mapper an applicant must meet the following minimum requirements:		
12	(1) Be at least 18 years of age;		
12	(2) Hold a high school diploma or certificate of equivalency;		
14	(3) Achieve a passing score in courses of instruction approved by the		
15	Department covering the following topics:		
16	a. The principles and techniques of property mapping; and		
17	b. The laws of North Carolina governing the listing, appraisal, and		
18	assessment of real property for taxation.		
19	To retain certification, a certified property mapper must attend every two years 24 hours		
20	of continuing education approved by the Department. The Department shall publish a		
21	list of courses acceptable for meeting this requirement and shall establish reporting		
22	requirements for certified property mappers. The Department shall adopt rules,		
23	pursuant to Chapter 150B of the General Statutes, for certification requirements of this		
24	section.		
25	(d) The Department shall charge a fee of twenty dollars (\$20.00) to cover the		
26	processing of applications for certification and the monitoring of continuing education		
27	credit requirements.		
28	(e) <u>Persons who have attained certification as a property mapper through the</u>		
29	North Carolina Property Mappers' Association as of the effective date of this act may		
30	apply to the Department for certification at any time prior to January 1, 1994, and, upon		
31	payment of the required fee, shall be certified by the Department without meeting		
32	additional requirements for initial certification.		
33	(f) Not later than July 1, 1995, every local government that maintains large-scale		
34	cadastral maps for the purpose of parcel identifier indexing, ad valorem tax assessment,		
35	or the enforcement of zoning and subdivision ordinances or building codes, shall		
36 37	employ at least one certified property mapper with primary responsibility for creating		
37 38	<u>and maintaining the maps.</u> (g) Effective July 1, 1995, the Department may decline to award any matching
