SENATE BILL 994

Short Title: Tryon Palace Commission.

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
2 AN ACT TO REVISE THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE TRYON PALACE  
3 COMMISSION.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 Section 1. G.S. 143B-72 reads as rewritten:

6 "**§ 143B-72. Tryon Palace Commission – members; selection; quorum;  
7 compensation.**

8 The Tryon Palace Commission of the Department of Cultural Resources shall  
9 consist of the following members: 25 voting members appointed by the Governor  
10 Governor, nonvoting members emeriti appointed by the Governor, and five voting ex  
11 officio members as provided in this section.

12 The Governor shall appoint 25 voting members. The terms of the initial members  
13 shall be staggered as follows: Nine of the members shall be appointed to serve four-  
14 year terms, eight of the members shall be appointed to serve three-year terms, and eight  
15 of the members shall be appointed to serve two-year terms. At the end of the respective  
16 terms of office of the initial appointed members of the Commission, the appointments of  
17 their successors, with the exception of ex officio members and members emeriti, shall  
18 be for terms of four years and until their successors are appointed and qualify. Any  
19 appointment to fill a vacancy on the Commission shall be for the balance of the  
20 unexpired term.

21 The Governor may also appoint any person to the Commission as a member  
22 emeritus, in recognition of that person's past contributions to and interest in Tryon  
23 Palace. A person appointed as a member emeritus shall be deemed a lifetime member  
24 of the Commission and shall serve as a nonvoting member.

1       ~~and in~~ In addition to the members who are appointed by the Governor, the Attorney  
2 General, the Secretary of Cultural Resources or ~~his~~ the Secretary's designee, the mayor  
3 of the City of New Bern, the Dean of Arts and Sciences at East Carolina University, and  
4 the chairman of the Board of Commissioners of Craven County shall serve as voting ex  
5 officio members of said Commission. The provisions of the Executive Organization Act  
6 of 1973 pertaining to the residence of members of commissions shall not apply to the  
7 Tryon Palace Commission.

8       A majority of the voting members of the Commission shall constitute a quorum for  
9 the transaction of business.

10       The members of the Commission shall serve without pay and without expense  
11 allowance."

12               Sec. 2. The terms of members serving on the Tryon Palace Commission of  
13 the Department of Cultural Resources on the date of ratification of this act shall expire  
14 May 15, 1993.

15               Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.
