#### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

# 2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO PROVIDE SUBSTANCE ABUSE 3 SERVICES FOR ADULT AND JUVENILE OFFENDERS ON PROBATION AND 4 PAROLE WHO ARE ASSESSED AS NEEDING THESE SERVICES.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. (a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department 6 7 of Human Resources, Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and Substance Abuse Services, the sum of ten million fifty thousand dollars (\$10,050,000) 8 for the 1994-95 fiscal year to fund substance abuse services for adult and juvenile 9 offenders on probation and parole and assessed as needing these services. Ten million 10 dollars (\$10,000,000) of these funds shall be awarded by the Division, in consultation 11 with the Division of Youth Services and with the Department of Correction, the 12 Administrative Office of the Courts, and the Department of Justice, on a Request for 13 Proposal basis to providers of services prescribed in this section. The Division shall 14 give priority to providers who provide half-way house beds and services for 15 probationers and parolees with substance abuse problems who are determined to be 16 indigent. The remaining fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) of these funds shall be used by 17 the Division to develop, in consultation with the Division of Youth Services and with 18 the Department of Correction, the Administrative Office of the Courts, and the 19 Department of Justice, the Request for Proposal process, to administer the award 20 process and to monitor the providers' distribution and use of the award. 21

1 The Department of Human Resources shall adopt rules, in consultation with 2 the Department of Correction, the Administrative Office of the Courts, and the 3 Department of Justice to administer this program.

4 (b) This program shall become a part of the Department of Human Resources,
5 Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and Substance Abuse Services'
6 continuation budget.

7 (c) The Division of Mental Health, Mental Retardation, and Substance Abuse
8 Services shall report to the General Assembly annually by March 1, beginning by
9 March 1, 1995, on the distribution and allocation of these funds.

10 Sec. 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1994.
