2	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER GRANT		
3	PROGRAM.		
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
5	Section 1. A new Part is added to Article 3 of Chapter 143B of the General		
6	Statutes to read:		
7	" <u>PART 4B. FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER GRANT PROGRAM.</u>		
8	" <u>§ 143B-151. Intent; purpose.</u>		
9	(a) It is the intent of the General Assembly to encourage and support broad-based		
10	collaboration among public and private agencies and among people who reflect the		
11	racial and socioeconomic diversity in communities to develop initiatives that (i) prepare		
12	children to learn effectively and to have a successful school experience, (ii) enhance the		
13	ability of families to become advocates for and supporters of education for the children		
14	in their families, and (iii) enhance the ability of families to function as nurturing and		
15	effective family units.		
16	(b) The purpose of the family resource centers is to provide services to children		
17	from birth through elementary school-age and to their families that:		
18	(1) Enhance the children's health and ability to attain academic and social		
19	success;		
20	(2) Ensure a successful transition from early childhood education		
21	programs and child care to the public schools; and		

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1	(3) Mobilize public and private community resources to help children and
2	families in need.
3	"§ 143B-151.1. Family Resources Grant Program; creation; administration.
4	(a) There is created in the Department of Human Resources a Family Resources
5	Grant Program. The program shall provide family resource center grants for counties
6	for which applications are approved by the Department of Human Resources.
7	Applications to establish a family resource center shall be submitted to the Department
8	on behalf of the children and families living in an elementary school attendance district
9	to serve the needs of those children and families.
10	(b) The program shall be administered by the Division of Family Development of
11	the Department of Human Resources.
12	"§ 143B-151.2. Selection of elementary schools.
13	(a) It is the intent of the General Assembly that the selection of elementary
14	schools serves chiefly as a means to identify the children and families to be served by a
15	family resource center.
16	(b) The county 'Smart Start Team', which is the local nonprofit organization that
17	coordinates the local Smart Start demonstration project or that meets the statutory
18	requirements for such an organization, and the local board of education shall jointly
19	identify the elementary school. If a local school administrative unit is located in more
20	than one county, the local board of education and the Smart Start Team for the county in
21	which the majority of the students in the unit live shall jointly identify the elementary
22	school.
23	If there is more than one local school administrative unit located in a county, the
24	Smart Start Team and each of the local boards of education shall jointly identify no
25	more elementary schools than one in each of the units to be served by a single family
26	resource center. In the case of the Nash-Rocky Mount School Administrative Unit, the
27	Nash County Smart Start Team and the board of education shall identify no more than
28	one elementary school in Nash County and one in Edgecombe County to be served by a
29	single family resource center.
30	(c) <u>A school selected shall be a school serving a disproportionate number of low-</u>
31	income children as determined by the percentage of students participating in the federal
32	subsidized lunch program. No school shall be selected unless at least twenty-five
33	percent (25%) of its students are eligible for subsidized lunches.
34 35	" <u>§ 143B-151.3. Development of grant applications.</u>
35 36	(a) <u>Once the elementary school or schools have been selected, a Family Resource</u> Center Team shall develop the application.
30 37	(b) If there is one local school administrative unit located in the county, the
38	Family Resource Center Team shall consist of (i) two members appointed by the local
38 39	board of education, one of whom shall be the principal or other representative of the
40	school, (ii) two members appointed by the Smart Start Team, and (iii) two members
40	appointed by the board of county commissioners. These six initial members shall
41	appoint seven additional members from parents of children who attend or, upon
43	reaching school age, would attend the school or schools that will be served by the
44	family resource center.

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1	If there are two local school administrative units located in the county, the Femily

9	If there are three local school administrative units located in the county, the Family			
10	Resource Center Team shall consist of (i)one member appointed by each of the local			
11	boards of education, including at least one principal or other representative of each			
12				
13	by the board of county commissioners. These nine initial members shall appoint 10			
14	additional members from parents of children who attend or, upon reaching school age,			
15	would attend the school or schools that will be served by the family resource center.			
16	If a local school administrative unit is located in more than one county, the board of			
17	commissioners of the county in which the majority of the students in the unit live shall			
18	appoint the team members appointed by the commissioners.			
19	(c) In preparing the application, the Family Resource Center Team shall consult			
20	with the board of county commissioners, the county Smart Start Team, any Save Our			
21	Students Program Neighborhood Councils for middle schools that have attendance			
22	districts that overlap with the attendance districts of the identified elementary schools,			
23	and the local boards of education of the units in which the identified elementary schools			
24	are located.			
25	The Family Resource Center Team shall also coordinate the family resource center's			
26	activities with those groups once a grant is received.			
27	(d) The grant application shall:			
28	(1) Provide for the establishment of a family resource center that is in or			
29	reasonably near one of the elementary schools selected for the county;			
30	(2) Designate the local school administrative unit, other unit of local			
31	government, or the nonprofit corporation that is to receive the grant			
32	and administer the family resource center; and			
33	(3) Provide that the Family Resource Center Team shall monitor the			
34	operation of the family resource center.			
35	(e) The Family Resource Center Team shall submit the application to the board			
36	of county commissioners for its endorsement. If the board endorses the application, the			
37	Family Resource Center Team shall submit it to the Secretary of Human Resources.			
38	"§ 143B-151.4. Award of grants.			
39	(a) The Secretary of Human Resources shall award grants for the 1994-95 fiscal			
40	year on the basis of one per county.			
41	(b) If funding to expand the program becomes available in subsequent years,			
42	additional family resource centers shall be funded based on:			
43	(1) The quality and performance of the existing family resource center;

25	(1)	\$100,000 shall be used by the Department of Human Resources for

30		beginning January 1, 1995. These grants shall be based on the
