2	AN ACT RECOMMENDED BY THE JUVENILE CODE COMMITTEE OF THE
3	LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COMMISSION TO EXTEND THE PILOT
4	PROGRAM FOR CATAWBA, BERTIE, AND MCDOWELL COUNTIES
5	ESTABLISHED UNDER THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COURTS
6	REGARDING JUVENILE COURT JURISDICTION OVER JUVENILES
7	BETWEEN SIXTEEN AND EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE WHO ARE BEYOND
8	THE DISCIPLINARY CONTROL OF THEIR PARENTS AND TO CLARIFY THE
9	SCOPE OF THE PROGRAM.
10	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
11	Section 1. Section 1 of Chapter 47 of the 1993 Session Laws reads as
12	rewritten:
13	"Section 1. There is established a pilot program to be administered by the
14	Administrative Office of the Courts to expand juvenile court jurisdiction in the pilot
15	counties to include as undisciplined juveniles those juveniles at least 16 years of age and
16	under 18 years of age who are beyond the disciplinary control of their parents. The pilot

17 program shall be implemented in Catawba, Bertie, and McDowell Counties. In these 18 counties, for the duration of the pilot, the definition of undisciplined juvenile shall

19 include 'a juvenile at least 16 years of age and less than 18 years of age who is beyond the

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disciplinary control of his parent, guardian, or custodian.' custodian, who is regularly 1 2 found in places where it is unlawful for a juvenile to be, or who has run away from 3 home.' The purpose of the pilot program is to determine whether juvenile court 4 jurisdiction should be broadened to include such juveniles on a statewide basis. The 5 Administrative Office of the Courts shall evaluate the pilot and file a progress report on the 6 pilot program with the General Assembly on or before the convening of the 1995 Session. 7 Session and a final report on or before the convening of the 1997 Session. The final 8 report shall include statistics regarding the number of juveniles who have participated in 9 the pilot program and the effectiveness of the program for participating juveniles. The 10 State Auditor's Office shall conduct a financial and performance audit of the pilot program and file the audit with the General Assembly on or before the convening of the 11 1997 Session. The audit shall include all information and activities of the pilot program 12 through December, 1996. The pilot program shall terminate April 1, 1995. April 1, 1997. 13 14 The pilot program shall be conducted within existing funds of the Administrative Office of the Courts." 15 16

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective March 31, 1995.
