1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO INCREASE THE MONTHLY BENEFITS FROM THE NORTH
3	CAROLINA FIREMEN'S AND RESCUE SQUAD WORKERS' PENSION FUND
4	AND THE MONTHLY MEMBER CONTRIBUTION AND TO DECLARE THE
5	INTENT OF THE LEGISLATURE TO PROVIDE COST-OF-LIVING
6	INCREASES, AS FUNDS ARE AVAILABLE.
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
8	Section 1. G.S. 58-86-35 reads as rewritten:
9	"§ 58-86-35. Firemen's application for membership in fund; monthly payments by
10	members; payments credited to separate accounts of members.
11	Those firemen who are eligible pursuant to G.S. 58-86-25 may make application for
12	membership to the board. Each fireman upon becoming a member of the fund shall pay
13	the director of the fund the sum of five-ten dollars (\$5.00)-(\$10.00) per month. The
14	monthly payments shall be credited to the separate account of the member and shall be
15	kept by the custodian so it is available for payment on withdrawal from membership or
16	retirement."
17	Sec. 2. G.S. 58-86-40 reads as rewritten:
18	"§ 58-86-40. Rescue squad worker's application for membership in funds; monthly
19	payments by members; payments credited to separate accounts of

Those rescue squad workers eligible pursuant to G.S. 58-86-30 may make application 1 to the board for membership. All persons who subsequently become rescue squad 2 3 workers may make application for membership. Each eligible rescue squad worker upon 4 becoming a member shall pay the director of the fund the sum of five-ten dollars (\$5.00) 5 (\$10.00) per month. A rescue squad worker who, on the date of the establishment of the 6 fund, has service as a rescue squad worker certified by the Department of State Treasurer, may make a lump sum payment of five dollars (\$5.00) per month for each month of 7 8 service as an eligible rescue squad worker as defined by G.S. 58-86-30, on or before 9 December 31, 1983, for as many as 240 months together with interest at an annual rate of 10 six percent (6%). The monthly payments shall be credited to the separate account of the member and 11 12 shall be kept by the custodian so it is available for payment on withdrawal from 13 membership or retirement." 14 Sec. 3. G.S. 58-86-45 is amended by adding a new subsection to read: 15 "(c) Effective July 1, 1995, any fireman or rescue squad worker who has not reached his thirty-fifth birthday who is eligible and who has not previously elected to 16 17 become a member may make application through the board of trustees for membership in 18 the fund at any time. The person shall make a lump-sum payment of ten dollars (\$10.00) per month retroactively to the time he first became eligible to become a member, plus 19 20 interest at an annual rate to be set by the board of trustees, for each year of his retroactive 21 payments. Upon making this lump-sum payment, the person shall be given credit for all prior service in the same manner as if he had made application for membership at the 22 23 time he first became eligible. Any member who has not reached his thirty-fifth birthday 24 who made application for membership subsequent to the time he was first eligible and did not receive credit for prior service may receive credit for such prior service upon lump-25 sum payment of ten dollars (\$10.00) per month retroactively to the time he first became 26 eligible, plus interest at an annual rate to be set by the board of trustees, for each year of 27 his retroactive payments. Upon making this lump-sum payment, the date of membership 28

- 29 shall be the same as if he had made application for membership at the time he was first 30 eligible."

Sec. 4. G.S. 58-86-55 reads as rewritten:

## 32 "§ 58-86-55. Monthly pensions upon retirement.

Any member who has served 20 years as an 'eligible fireman' or 'eligible rescue squad worker' in the State of North Carolina, as provided in G.S. 58-86-25 and G.S. 58-86-30, and who has attained the age of 55 years is entitled to be paid a monthly pension from this fund. The monthly pension shall be in the amount of one hundred ten-thirty-five dollars (\$110.00)-(\$135.00) per month. Any retired fireman receiving a pension of one hundred ten dollars (\$110.00) per month shall, effective July 1, 1994, 1995, receive a pension of one hundred ten-thirty-five dollars (\$110.00) (\$135.00) per month.

Members shall pay five-ten\_dollars (\$5.00)-(\$10.00) per month as required by G.S. 58-86-35 and G.S. 58-86-40 for a period of no longer than 20 years. No 'eligible rescue squad member' shall receive a pension prior to July 1, 1983. No person shall be entitled to a pension hereunder until his official duties as a fireman or rescue squad worker for

which he is paid compensation shall have been terminated and he shall have retired assuch according to standards or rules fixed by the board of trustees.

3 Any member who is totally and permanently disabled while in the discharge of his 4 official duties as a result of bodily injuries sustained or as a result of extreme exercise or 5 extreme activity experienced in the course and scope of his official duties and who leaves 6 the fire or rescue squad service because of this disability shall be entitled to be paid from 7 the fund a monthly benefit in an amount of one hundred ten-thirty-five dollars (\$110.00) 8 (\$135.00) per month beginning the first month after his fifty-fifth birthday. All 9 applications for disability are subject to the approval of the board who may appoint 10 physicians to examine and evaluate the disabled member prior to approval of his application, and annually thereafter. Any disabled member shall not be required to make 11 12 the monthly payment of five-ten dollars (\$5.00)-(\$10.00) as required by G.S. 58-86-35 and 13 G.S. 58-86-40.

14 Effective July 1, 1995, Any-any member who is totally and permanently disabled for any cause, other than line of duty, who leaves the fire or rescue squad service because of 15 this disability and who has at least 10 years of service with the pension fund, may be 16 17 permitted to continue making a monthly contribution of five-ten dollars (\$5.00) (\$10.00) 18 to the fund until he has paid into the fund the sum of one-two thousand two-four hundred dollars (\$1,200). (\$2,400). Any member who began making contributions prior to July 1, 19 20 1995, in the amount of five dollars (\$5.00) per month, and thereafter leaves the fire or 21 rescue squad service because of disability, may be permitted to continue making monthly contributions of ten dollars (\$10.00) per month after July 1, 1995, until the member has 22 made contributions for a total of 240 months. The member shall upon attaining the age of 23 24 55 years be entitled to receive a pension as provided by this section. All applications for disability are subject to the approval of the board who may appoint physicians to examine 25 and evaluate the disabled member prior to approval of his application annually thereafter. 26 27 Effective July 1, 1995, Any-any member who, because his residence is annexed by a city under Part 2 or Part 3 of Article 4 of Chapter 160A of the General Statutes, or whose 28 29 department is closed because of an annexation by a city under Part 2 or Part 3 of Article 4 of Chapter 160A of the General Statutes, and because of such annexation is unable to 30 perform as a fireman of any status, and if the member has at least 10 years of service with 31 the pension fund, may be permitted to continue making a monthly contribution of five-ten 32 33 dollars (\$5.00) (\$10.00) to the fund until he has paid into the fund the sum of one-two thousand two-four hundred dollars (\$1,200 making contributions prior to July 1, 1995, in 34 35 the amount of five dollars (\$5.00) per month, and thereafter, is unable to perform as a fireman of any status because of annexation, may be permitted to continue making a 36 monthly contribution of ten dollars (\$10.00) per month after July 1, 1995, until the 37 member has made contributions for a total of 240 months. The member upon attaining 38 the age of 55 years and completion of such contributions shall be entitled to receive a 39 pension as provided by this section. Any application to make monthly contributions 40 under this section shall be subject to a finding of eligibility by the Board of Trustees upon 41

42 application of the member.

The pensions provided shall be in addition to all other pensions or benefits under any 1 2 other statutes of the State of North Carolina or the United States, notwithstanding any 3 exclusionary provisions of other pensions or retirement systems provided by law." 4 Sec. 5. The General Assembly finds that the firemen and rescue squad workers 5 (both paid and volunteer) of North Carolina provide a valuable service to the State, which 6 results in saving hundreds of lives and millions of dollars in property value each year. 7 Sec. 6. The General Assembly further finds that North Carolina is fortunate to 8 have so many dedicated individuals who are willing to serve voluntarily, and that there is 9 no way the State could afford to pay these volunteers for their service. 10 Sec. 7. The North Carolina Firemen's and Rescue Squad Workers' Pension Fund was created as a means of saying thank you to these individuals for their many 11 12 faithful years of service to the people of the State. Sec. 8. It is the intent of the General Assembly to provide cost-of-living 13 14 increases to members and retirees of the Firemen's and Rescue Squad Workers' Pension 15 Fund at a rate equal to any cost-of-living increases provided to beneficiaries of the

16 Teachers' and State Employees' Retirement System, to the extent funds are available. 17

Sec. 9. This act becomes effective July 1, 1995.
