1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE STATE HEALTH DIRECTOR TO PREPARE A
3	MEDICAL AND HEALTH BENEFITS PLAN.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. The State Health Director shall prepare a medical and health care
6	plan that will help provide for persons in North Carolina whose employers pay all or part
7	of the cost of medical and health care benefits for their employees, incentives to forego
8	unnecessary medical treatment and to shop for the best value in cases where treatment is
9	necessary. The plan shall contain the following components:
10	(1) Employers may set aside, each year, in an account for each of their
11	employees a certain percentage of the amount that they currently or
12	would spend for medical and health care benefits for each employee.
13	This account will be an allowance for medical and health care for the
14	employee during that year.
15	(2) Employers shall retain a sufficient percentage of the amount that they
16	currently or would spend for medical and health care benefits for each
17	employee to purchase or self-fund major medical and health care
18	benefits for all employees which will pay one hundred percent (100%)
19	of the cost of any portion of an employee's medical and health care that
20	exceeds the amount in the employee's medical and health care account.

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1	(3) Any amount in an employee's medical and health care account that is
2	unspent at the end of the year will belong to the employee with no
3	restrictions on the purposes for which it may be used. Of any interest
4	derived from the deposit of the funds held in trust for the health care
5	accounts for all employees, one-half of the interest shall belong to the
6	employee and one-half of the interest may be paid to the State to fund
7	indigent health care.
8	(4) The amount in an employee's medical and health care account will not
9	be subject to State taxation while it remains in the account, any amount
10	spent from the account for medical and health care will be totally
11	exempt from State income taxation, and any amount spent from the
12	account for any purpose other than medical and health care will be fully
13	subject to State income taxation, including any appropriate interest and
14	penalties.
15	(5) Employers that provide medical and health care benefits to their
16	employees in accordance with the plan will receive State tax credits
17	against their income for the cost of these medical and health care
18	benefits for each year that these benefits are provided.
19	Sec. 2. The State Health Director shall notify the Commissioner of Insurance
20	of the minimum requirements for the plan required to be prepared by this act. The
21	Commissioner of Insurance shall prepare a proposed plan incorporating these minimum
22	requirements. The Secretary of the Department of Human Resources and the Secretary of
23	the Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources shall provide the
24	Commissioner of Insurance with any data maintained by the Departments that would
25	benefit the Commissioner of Insurance in preparing the proposed plan. The
26	Commissioner of Insurance shall submit the proposed plan to the State Health Director
27	no later than November 1, 1995, and the State Health Director shall consult with the
28	Secretary of Revenue, the North Carolina Medical Society, Blue Cross and Blue Shield
29	of North Carolina, and any other agencies or entities as necessary to develop the plan.
30	These agencies and entities consulted by the State Health Director shall provide full
31	cooperation as requested.
32	Sec. 3. The State Health Director shall revise the proposed plan, as necessary,
33	and submit a report with a final plan to the General Assembly on the first day of the 1996
34	Session of the General Assembly. The report shall include any proposed legislation
25	and the second

35 necessary to implement the plan in North Carolina.

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Sec. 4. This act is effective upon ratification.
