5	Section 1. The Blue Ribbon Study Commission on Agriculture Waste		
6	(Commission) is created in the General Assembly. The Commission shall study the

9	quality and any other environmental impacts of agriculture waste.		
10	(2) Methods of disposing of and managing agriculture waste currently in		
11	use in this State.

13	fewer adverse impacts than those methods currently in use in this State,		
14	including positive commercial and noncommercial uses of agriculture

The Commission may contract for consultant services as provided by 5 The Commission may obtain assistance from North Carolina State G.S. 120-32.02. 6 University, particularly from those university resources associated with the ongoing 7 studies conducted by the Swine Odor Task Force. Upon approval of the Legislative 8 Services Commission, the Legislative Administrative Officer shall assign professional 9 and clerical staff to assist in the work of the Commission. Clerical staff shall be 10 furnished to the Commission through the offices of House and Senate supervisors of The expenses of employment of the clerical staff shall be borne by the 11 clerks. 12 Commission. The Commission may meet in the Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building upon the approval of the Legislative Services Commission. 13 The 14 Commission, while in the discharge of official duties, may exercise all the powers 15 provided under the provisions of G.S. 120-19 through G.S. 120-19.4.

16 Sec. 6. Members of the Commission shall receive per diem, subsistence, and 17 travel allowances as follows:

18 19 (1) Commission members who are also General Assembly members, at the rate established in G.S. 120-3.1.

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(2) Commission members who are officials or employees of the State or

local government agencies, at the rate established in G.S. 138-6.

(3) All other Commission members, at the rate established in G.S. 138-5.

Sec. 7. All expenses of the Commission shall be paid out of funds available to
the General Assembly for the 1994-95 fiscal year.

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Sec. 8. This act is effective upon ratification.
