1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE ISSUANCE OF LICENSES TO QUALIFIED
3	INDIVIDUALS AUTHORIZING THE KEEPING OF RACCOONS AS PERSONAL
4	PETS AND AMEND THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAWS TO REQUIRE RACCOONS
5	KEPT AS PETS TO BE SUBJECT TO STATE LAWS REGARDING RABIES.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. G.S. 113-272.5 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
8	"(g) The Wildlife Resources Commission shall issue a captivity license authorizing
9	the possession of a raccoon as a personal pet to an individual providing satisfactory
10	documentation of the following:
11	(1) The person possessing the raccoon is 16 years of age or older;
12	(2) The person has, or is able to provide within 30 days of the issuance of
13	the license, adequate caging facilities for the raccoon. Adequate caging
14	facilities for a raccoon are as follows:
15	<u>a.</u> For each raccoon, a cage six feet by five feet, by six feet high,
16	with two climbing limbs and a resting shelf;
17	b. For each additional raccoon, increase case length by two feet;

1		The raccoon will be kept in an appropriate neighborhood such that
2		either possession of the raccoon nor the required caging facilities will
3		violate local zoning or building ordinances;

## 5 "§ 130A-190. Rabies vaccination tags.

6 A licensed veterinarian or a certified rabies vaccinator who administers rabies vaccine 7 to a dog or cat dog, cat, or raccoon shall issue a rabies vaccination tag to the owner of the 8 animal. The rabies vaccination tag shall show the year issued, a vaccination number, the 9 words 'North Carolina' or the initials 'N.C.' and the words 'rabies vaccine.' Dogs and cats 10 Dogs, cats, and raccoons shall wear rabies vaccination tags at all times. However, cats may be exempted from wearing the tags by local ordinance. Rabies vaccination tags, 11 12 links and rivets may be obtained from the Department. The Secretary is authorized to 13 establish by rule a fee for the rabies tags, links and rivets. The fee shall not exceed the 14 actual cost of the rabies tags, links and rivets, plus transportation costs."

#### Sec. 7. G.S. 130A-192 reads as rewritten:

# 16 "§ 130A-192. Dogs and cats Dogs, cats, and raccoons not wearing required rabies 17 vaccination tags.

18 The Animal Control Officer shall canvass the county to determine if there are any dogs or cats dogs, cats, or raccoons not wearing the required rabies vaccination tag. If a 19 20 dog or cat-dog, cat, or raccoon is found not wearing the required tag, the Animal Control 21 Officer shall check to see if the owner's identification can be found on the animal. If the animal is wearing an owner identification tag, or if the Animal Control Officer otherwise 22 23 knows who the owner is, the Animal Control Officer shall notify the owner in writing to 24 have the animal vaccinated against rabies and to produce the required rabies vaccination certificate to the Animal Control Officer within three days of the notification. If the 25 animal is not wearing an owner identification tag and the Animal Control Officer does 26 27 not otherwise know who the owner is, the Animal Control Officer may impound the animal. The duration of the impoundment of these animals shall be established by the 28 29 county board of commissioners, but the duration shall not be less than 72 hours. During 30 the impoundment period, the Animal Control Officer shall make a reasonable effort to locate the owner of the animal. If the animal is not reclaimed by its owner during the 31 32 impoundment period, the animal shall be disposed of in one of the following manners: 33 returned to the owner; adopted as a pet by a new owner; sold to institutions within this State registered by the United States Department of Agriculture pursuant to the Federal 34 35 Animal Welfare Act, as amended; or put to death by a procedure approved by the American Veterinary Medical Association, the Humane Society of the United States or of 36 the American Humane Association. The Animal Control Officer shall maintain a record 37 38 of all animals impounded under this section which shall include the date of 39 impoundment, the length of impoundment, the method of disposal of the animal and the 40 name of the person or institution to whom any animal has been released."

41 Sec. 8. G.S. 130A-193 reads as rewritten:

# 42 "\$ 130A-193. Vaccination and confinement of dogs and cats-dogs, cats, and raccoons 43 brought into this State.

25 26	shall have the right, after reasonable effort has been made to apprehend the animals, to			
26 27	destroy the uncontrolled dogs and cats dogs, cats, and raccoons and properly dispose of their bodies."			
27	Sec. 11. G.S. 130A-196 reads as rewritten:			
28 29	"§ 130A-196. Confinement of all biting dogs and cats; dogs, cats, and			
29 30				
31	<u>raccoons;</u> notice to local health director; reports by physicians; certain dogs exempt.			
32	When a person has been bitten by a dog or cat, dog, cat, or raccoon, the person or			
33	parent, guardian or person standing in loco parentis of the person, and the person owning			
34	the animal or in control or possession of the animal shall notify the local health director			
35	immediately and give the name and address of the person bitten and the owner of the			
36	animal. All dogs and cats dogs, cats, and raccoons that bite a person shall be immediately			
37				
38	confined for 10 days in a place designated by the local health director. However, the			
39	local health director may authorize a dog trained and used by a law enforcement agency			
39 40	to be released from confinement to perform official duties upon submission of proof that the dog has been vaccinated for rabies in compliance with this Part. After reviewing the			
40	the dog has been vaccinated for rabies in compliance with this Part. After reviewing the circumstances of the particular case, the local health director may allow the owner to			
42	confine the animal on the owner's property. An owner who fails to confine his animal in			
42	accordance with the instructions of the local health director shall be guilty of a Class 2

1 misdemeanor. If the owner or the person who controls or possesses a dog or cat dog, cat, 2 or raccoon that has bitten a person refuses to confine the animal as required by this 3 section, the local health director may order seizure of the animal and its confinement for 4 10 days at the expense of the owner. A physician who attends a person bitten by an 5 animal known to be a potential carrier of rabies shall report within 24 hours to the local 6 health director the name, age and sex of that person." 7 Sec. 12. G.S. 130A-197 reads as rewritten: 8 "§ 130A-197. Infected dogs and cats dogs, cats, and raccoons to be destroyed; 9 protection of vaccinated dogs and cats. dogs, cats, and raccoons. 10 A dog or cat dog, cat, or raccoon bitten by a proven rabid animal or animal suspected of having rabies that is not available for laboratory diagnosis shall be destroyed 11 12 immediately by its owner, the county Animal Control Officer or a peace officer unless the dog or cat-dog, cat, or raccoon has been vaccinated against rabies in accordance with 13 14 this Part and the rules of the Commission more than three weeks prior to being bitten, and 15 is given a booster dose of rabies vaccine within three days of the bite." 16 Sec. 13. G.S. 130A-198 reads as rewritten: "§ 130A-198. Confinement. 17 18 A person who owns or has possession of an animal which is suspected of having 19 rabies shall immediately notify the local health director or county Animal Control Officer 20 and shall securely confine the animal in a place designated by the local health director. 21 Dogs and cats-Dogs, cats, and raccoons shall be confined for a period of 10 days. Other animals may be destroyed at the discretion of the State Public Health Veterinarian." 22 23 Sec. 14. G.S. 130A-199 reads as rewritten: 24 "§ 130A-199. Rabid animals to be destroyed; heads to be sent to State Laboratory of 25 **Public Health.** An animal diagnosed as having rabies by a licensed veterinarian shall be destroyed 26 27 and its head sent to the State Laboratory of Public Health. The heads of all dogs and cats dogs, cats, and raccoons that die during the 10-day confinement period required by G.S. 28 29 130A-196, shall be immediately sent to the State Laboratory of Public Health for rabies 30 diagnosis." 31 Sec. 15. This act is effective upon ratification.
