1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT NO PERMIT IS REQUIRED FOR SMALL
3	LANDFILLS FOR THE DISPOSAL OF DEMOLITION DEBRIS TO BE
4	LOCATED IN A RURAL COUNTY THAT HAS NO LICENSED DEMOLITION
5	DEBRIS LANDFILL.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. G.S. 130A-294(a)(4)a. reads as rewritten:
8	"(4) a. Develop a permit system governing the establishment and operation
9	of solid waste management facilities. A landfill with a disposal area of
10	1/2 acre or less for the on-site disposal of land clearing and inert debris
11	is exempt from the permit requirement of this section and shall be
12	governed by G.S. 130A-301.1. A landfill with a disposal area of one
13	acre or less for the disposal of demolition debris to be located within a
14	county with a population of 90,000 or less that has no licensed
15	demolition debris landfill is exempt from the permit requirement of this
16	section and shall be governed by G.S. 130A-301.2. The Department
17	shall not approve an application for a new permit, the renewal of a
18	permit, or a substantial amendment to a permit for a sanitary landfill,
19	excluding demolition landfills as defined in the rules of the Commission
20	for Health Services, except as provided in subdivisions (3) and (4) of

1 2 3	subsection (b1) of this section. No permit shall be granted for a solid waste management facility having discharges which are point sources until the Department has referred the complete plans and specifications to the Environmental Management Commission and has received advise
4 5	to the Environmental Management Commission and has received advice in writing that the plans and specifications are approved in accordance
6	with the provisions of G.S. 143-215.1. If the applicant is a unit of local
7	government, and has not submitted a solid waste management plan that
8	has been approved by the Department pursuant to G.S. 130A-
9	309.09A(b), the Department may deny a permit for a sanitary landfill or
10	a facility that disposes of solid waste by incineration, unless the
11	Commission has not adopted rules pursuant to G.S. 130A-309.29 for
12	local solid waste management plans. In any case where the Department
13	denies a permit for a solid waste management facility, it shall state in
14	writing the reason for denial and shall also state its estimate of the
15	changes in the applicant's proposed activities or plans which will be
16	required for the applicant to obtain a permit."
17	Sec. 2. Part 2 of Article 9 of Chapter 130A of the General Statutes is amended
18	by adding a new section to read:
19	"§ 130A-301.2. Demolition debris landfills with a disposal area of one acre or less
20	located in rural counties.
21	(a) No landfill with a disposal area of one acre or less for the disposal of
22	demolition debris to be located within a county with a population of 90,000 or less that
23	has no licensed demolition debris landfill shall, at the time the landfill is sited, be sited 25

23 26	(b) The owner of a landfill subject to this section shall file a certified copy of a survey of the property on which the landfill is located in the register of deeds' office in
20 27	the county in which the property is located, which survey shall accurately show the
28	location of the landfill and the record owner of the land on which the landfill is situated.
20 29	(c) Prior to the lease or conveyance of any lot or tract of land that directly abuts or
30	is contiguous to the disposal area used for demolition debris pursuant to this section, the
31	owner of the lot or tract shall prepare a document disclosing that a portion of the property
32	has been used as a disposal area for demolition debris or has been used to meet applicable
33	minimum buffer requirements. The disclosure shall include a legal description of the
34	property that would be sufficient in an instrument of conveyance and shall be filed in the
35	register of deeds' office prior to any lease or conveyance.
36	(d) No public, commercial, or residential building shall be located or constructed
37	immediately above any landfill subject to this section. Construction of such buildings,
38	with the exception of site preparation and foundation work, shall not commence until
39	after closure of the demolition debris landfill."
40	Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.
