- Nonresident Lifetime Sportsman License \$1,000. this license shall be issued only to an individual nonresident of the State.
 - (5) Age 70 Resident Lifetime Sportsman License \$10.00. This license shall be issued only to an individual resident of the State who is at least 70 years of age.
 - Disabled Resident Sportsman License \$100.00. This license shall be issued only to (i) an individual resident of the State who is a fifty percent (50%) or more disabled veteran as determined by the Veterans Administration, remaining valid for the lifetime of the individual so long as the individual remains fifty percent (50%) or more disabled; or (ii) an individual resident of the State who is totally disabled, remaining valid for the lifetime of the individual so long as the individual remains totally disabled. For purposes of this section, 'totally disabled' means physically incapable of being gainfully employed."

Section 2. G.S. 113-270.1C(b)(2) and G.S. 113-270.1C(b) (3) are repealed. Section 3. G.S. 113-270.1C(b) is amended by adding a new subdivision to

read:

- "(4) Lifetime Combination Hunting and Fishing License for Disabled Residents \$10.00. This license shall be issued only to (i) an individual resident of the State who is a fifty percent (50%) or more disabled veteran as determined by the Veterans Administration, remaining valid for the lifetime of the individual so long as the individual remains fifty percent (50%) or more disabled; or (ii) an individual resident of the State who is totally disabled, remaining valid for the lifetime of the individual so long as the individual remains totally disabled. For purposes of this section, 'totally disabled' means physically incapable of being gainfully employed."
- Section 4. G.S. 143-250.1(c) is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
- "(5a) The proceeds from the sale of lifetime combination hunting and fishing licenses for disabled residents pursuant to G.S. 113-270.1C(b)(4);"

Section 5. Article 22 of Chapter 113 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 113-297. Unlawful use of facilities provided for disabled sportsman.

Any person who knowingly uses facilities or participates in activities provided by the Wildlife Resources Commission for disabled sportsmen, when that person does not meet the qualifications for use of those facilities or participation in those activities, is guilty of a Class 3 misdemeanor."

Section 6. Section 5 of this act becomes effective December 1, 1997. The remainder of this act becomes effective July 1, 1997. All lifetime combination hunting and fishing licenses issued under G.S. 113-270.1C(b)(2) and G.S. 113-270.1C(b)(3) prior to that date shall remain valid for the uses for which they were issued.
