A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COMMISSION TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF PERMITTING LOCAL BOARDS OF EDUCATION TO SELL ADVERTISING ON SCHOOL BUSES AND CERTAIN SCHOOL FACILITIES TO GENERATE REVENUES FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL FACILITY UPKEEP AND MAINTENANCE. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission is authorized to study the feasibility of permitting local boards of education to sell advertising on school buses and certain school facilities to generate revenues for public school facility upkeep and maintenance. In the course of the study the Commission shall consider: (1) The appropriateness of placing advertising on school buses, gymnasiums, and other school facilities in light of the need for
additional revenues for public school facility upkeep and maintenance; (2) The safety implications of placing advertising on buses;

- - Appropriate content of advertising and appropriate measures for (3) controlling the content of advertising on school property;
 - Appropriate procedures for contracting for the placement of advertising (4) on school buses, gymnasiums, and other school facilities; and

1	(5) Programs in school systems in other states that sell advertising on
2	school buses and school facilities, and any legislation on these programs
3	from other states.
4	The Commission shall report the results of this study to the 1999 General Assembly.
5	Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General
6	Assembly the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the 1998-99 fiscal year
7	to perform the study authorized in Section 1 of this act.
3	Section 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1998.
