1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO MAKE SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES IN THE TEACHERS' AND STATE
3	EMPLOYEES' COMPREHENSIVE MAJOR MEDICAL PLAN.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. (a) G.S. 136-40.6(8)a. reads as rewritten:
6	"a. Prescription Drugs: The Plan's allowable charges for prescription
7	legend drugs to be used outside of a hospital or skilled nursing
8	facility are ninety percent (90%) of the average wholesale price.
9	A dispensing fee for qualified providers shall be determined by
10	the Executive Administrator and Board of Trustees. The Plan
11	will pay allowable charges for each outpatient prescription drug
12	less a copayment to be paid by each covered individual equal to
13	the provider dispensing fee set by the Executive Administrator
14	and Board of Trustees. A prescription legend drug is defined as
15	an article the label of which, under the Federal Food, Drug, and
16	Cosmetic Act, is required to bear the legend: 'Caution: Federal
17	Law Prohibits Dispensing Without Prescription.' and which has
18	full unrestricted market approval by the Food and Drug
19	Administration for the condition being treated. Such articles may
20	not be sold to or purchased by the public without a prescription

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1	order. Benefits are provided for insulin even though prescription
2	is not required. Coverage is not provided for drugs used for
3	cosmetic purposes or drugs not having full and unrestricted Food
4	and Drug Administration approval for the condition being
5	treated.
6	Benefits for additional indications (off label use) are provided
7	for chemotherapeutic drugs that have received full and
8	unrestricted Food and Drug Administration approval as
9	recognized by one of the following reference compendia: (i)
10	American Medical Association Drug Evaluations; (ii) American
11	Hospital Formulary Service Drug information; or (iii) United
12	States Pharmacopeia Drug information; or peer review medical
13	literature allows an objective conclusion that clinical efficacy has
14	been established, and the drug is no longer
15	experimental/investigational."
16	(b) G.S. $136-40.7(14)$ reads as rewritten:
17	"(14) Charges for cosmetic surgery surgery, drugs or treatment for cosmetic
18	<u>purposes</u> except that charges for cosmetic surgery or treatment required
19	for correction of damage caused by accidental injury sustained by the
20	covered individual while coverage under this plan is in force on his or
21	her account or to correct congenital deformities or anomalies shall not
22	be excluded if they otherwise qualify as covered medical expenses."
23	Section 2. G.S. 135-39.5 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:
24	"(23) Implementing a case management program."
25	Section 3. (a) G.S. 135-40.6(1)k. is repealed.
26	(b) $G.S. 135-40.6(1)$ o. reads as rewritten:
27	"o. Children are entitled to benefits for treatment of illnesses or
28	congenital defect, incubation or isolette care, and treatment of
29	prematurity or postmaturity.
30	If the mother is a covered individual, benefits Benefits are
31	provided for the <u>a covered</u> newborn's circumcision and routine
32	nursery care."
33	(c) G.S. $135-40.6(7)$ c. reads as rewritten:
34	"c. Newborn Care When a child is eligible at birth, benefits are
35	provided for treatment of illness, injury, prematurity, or
36	congenital condition as a registered inpatient. When delivery is
37	by Caesarean section, a single consultation allowance will be
38	provided for standby, resuscitation, and infant care in the
39	operating room provided by a doctor other than the operating
40	surgeon.
41	When a mother receives maternity benefits under the Plan for a
42	child's delivery, benefits Benefits are provided for examination and

1	supervision of a <u>covered</u> normal newborn infant infant of an
2	enrolled employee or spouse."
3	Section 4. G.S. 135-40.6A(b)(1) reads as rewritten:
4	"(1) Skilled Nursing Facility Care (after the initial 30 days); Care;"
5	Section 5. G.S. 135-40.6(9)f. reads as rewritten:
6	"f. Eyeglasses or other corrective lenses (except for cataract lenses
7	certified as medically necessary for aphakia persons), hearing
8	aids, braces for teeth, dental plates or bridges or other dental
9	prostheses, air-conditioners, vaporizers, humidifiers, mattresses
10	(other than as supplied with a hospital bed) and specially built
11	shoes (other than attached to artificial limbs or orthopedic braces);
12	<u>bed);</u> "
13	Section 6. This act becomes effective July 1, 1997.
