H 1 **HOUSE BILL 491** Short Title: Consolidate Youth Councils/AB. (Public) Sponsors: Representatives Easterling; Goodwin and Jeffus. Referred to: State Government. March 10, 1997 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO CONSOLIDATE THE YOUTH ADVISORY AND NORTH CAROLINA INTERNSHIP COUNCILS WITHIN THE YOUTH ADVOCACY COUNCIL IN THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION AND TO MAKE CONFORMING CHANGES TO OTHER RELATED STATUTES. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. Parts 7 and 18 of Article 9 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes are repealed. Section 2. G.S. 143B-414 reads as rewritten: "§ 143B-414. Governor's Advocacy Council on Children and Youth – creation; powers and duties. There is hereby created the Governor's Advocacy Council on Children and Youth of the Department of Administration. The Council shall be organized into the following committees: an Advocacy Committee, a State Youth Programs Committee, and an Internship Program Committee. The Council shall have the following functions and duties: (b) To act as an advocate for children and youth within State and local (1)

governments, and with private agencies serving children and youth;

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- The State Youth Programs Committee shall consist of the following 1 (2) 2 nine persons from the Governor's Advocacy Council on Children and 3 Youth and designated by the chair of the Council: Four local youth council members: and 4 Six representatives of children and youth organizations. 5 b. 6 (3) The Internship Program Committee shall consist of the following 10 7
 - persons from the Governor's Advocacy Council on Children and Youth and designated by the chair of the Council:
 - The four former State government interns:
 - b. The two public college or university representatives;
 - The two private college or university representatives; and <u>c.</u>
 - Two representatives of children and youth organizations. d.
 - The initial members of the Council shall be the members of the former (b) Governor's Advocacy Council on Children and Youth of the Department of Human Resources whose terms shall expire on the date they would have, had said Council of the Department of Human Resources not been transferred. At the end of the respective terms of office of the initial members of the Council, the appointment of all members shall be as provided in this section and for terms of four years and until their successors are appointed and qualify. Any appointment to fill a vacancy on the Council created by the resignation, death, dismissal, or disability of a member shall be for the balance of the unexpired term. The members of the Council after July 1, 1997, shall be those members whose terms had not expired on or before that date and shall be those persons appointed subsequently by the respective appointing authorities pursuant to this section.
 - Vacancies in appointments made by the General Assembly shall be filled in accordance with G.S. 120-122. Other vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.
 - The Governor-Each appointing officer may remove any member of the Council (c) appointed by the Governor.

The Governor shall designate from the membership of the Council a chairman-chair and a vice-chairman-vice-chair to serve at his-the Governor's pleasure.

The Council shall meet at least quarterly and upon the call of the chairman or upon written request of at least nine members.

The members of the Council shall receive per diem and necessary travel and subsistence expenses in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 138-5.

A majority of the Council shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. A majority of a committee's membership shall constitute a quorum for transaction of committee business.

- The committees shall present reports to the Council for approval. (c1)
- All clerical and other services required by the Council shall be supplied by the Secretary Youth Advocacy and Involvement Office in the Department of Administration." Section 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 1997.
