Referred to: Judiciary II. March 19, 1997 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO PREVENT DOUBLE RECOVERIES IN PROPERTY DAMAGE. PERSONAL INJURY, AND WRONGFUL DEATH ACTIONS BY ALLOWING EVIDENCE OF OTHER SOURCES OF RECOVERY. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. Article 4 of Chapter 8C of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read: "Rule 413. Collateral source of evidence. For the purposes of this Rule, the term 'collateral source payments' means (a) payments related to the injury, disability, or death in question made to the plaintiff, or on plaintiff's behalf by or pursuant to: A federal, state, or local income disability or workers' compensation act; (1) or other public program providing medical expenses, disability payments, or similar benefits; Health, accident, sickness, or automobile accident insurance or liability (2) insurance that provides health benefits or income disability coverage: except that 'collateral source payments' shall not include life insurance

benefits available to the plaintiff, whether purchased by the plaintiff or

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1			provided by others, payments made pursuant to the Social Security Act
2			or pension payments;
