| 3 | PILOT ZERO-TOLERANCE DRUG SUPERVISION PROGRAM AS A MEANS |
| 4 | OF REDUCING PRISON TIME FOR CERTAIN NONVIOLENT OFFENDERS |
| 5 | AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS TO IMPLEMENT THE PROGRAM. |
| 6 | The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: |
| 7 | Section 1. The Department of Correction shall establish a pilot zero-tolerance |
| 8 | drug supervision program that provides for urinalysis as a condition of probation and |
| 9 | parole. The Department shall establish criteria for participation in the program by |
| 10 | nonviolent offenders eligible for probation or parole who agree, as a condition of their |
| 11 | probation or parole: |
| 12 | (1) To submit to weekly urinalysis drug tests; and |
| 13 | (2) To be held for a period of at least two days each time a urinalysis |
| 14 | produces a positive result for the presence of illegal drugs in a |
| 15 | residential program or jail, electronic house arrest, or other form of |
| 16 | detention that the Department finds appropriate. |
| 17 | The Department shall report on the establishment of the program, the criteria |
| 18 | for participation, the incidence of positive testing by participants in the program, and the |
| 19 | impact of the program on prison housing costs to the Chairs of the Joint Legislative |

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- 1 Corrections and Crime Control Oversight Committee, the Chairs of the Senate and House
- Appropriations Committees, and the Chairs of the Senate and House Subcommittees on
 Justice and Public Safety by March 1, 1999.
- 4 Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
- 5 Correction the sum of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for the __1998-99 fiscal year to
- 6 implement the zero-tolerance drug supervision program.
- 7 Section 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1998.
